The Commissioner's Court has been asked to donate 32,000 of county money o help keep a County Youth Center going in Levelland.

Do you think a youth center in Levelland would penefit the Ropes community in any way?

We won't argue the point that Levelland needs a youth center, but why call it a County Youth Center, and if the commissioner's Court sees fit to donate \$2,000 to a Youth Center in Levelland, why can't they donate some, say \$500 to the Ropes Youth Center. The money to be used is tax money, in which we all share, and the fact that it is to be called a County Youth Center, does not make it any

any more available to the Ropes people than if it were simply called the Levelland Youth Center.

We do have a building in Ropes, that we call the Community Center, and it is very much used, but just because we have the building doesn't alter the fact that we could use \$500 a year to help with the expenses, buy oth er things for the center that we so badly need.

If the Commissioners Court is in a position to help the Youth Center at Levelland, then we think they are also in a position to help the Ropes Community Center.


