





### TEXAS DEPT. OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Highway Patrol Service of the Texas Department of Public Safety investigated a total of seven rural traffic accidents in Hockley County during the month of March with the following breakdown: Property damage 3 personal injury 4, and fatal accidents 0.

In making this announcement, Patrol Sergeant D. S. Lawson reported a total property dafage of \$4,400.00 with five persons injured and none killed. This is an increase of three accidents for the same period of 1958.

According to the sergeant this brings the total rural traffic accidents in Hockley County for 1959 to 19 as compared to 15 for the first three months of 1958.

The sergeant advised that traffic deaths in Texas are 12% higher this year than they were at this time last year.
