If you're making your boy warm up for Saturday's baseball game every day after school, you may be throwing

him a bad curve. That is the opinion of Dr. H. Paul Bauer, an orthopedic surgeon in private practice and team physician for the San Diego Padres baseball club, who advised against dads and sons throwing the ball every night. "It can cause

problems," he said. "In youngsters under 16, the elbow just won't take a great deal of stress." And the reason is, he explained, that the growth center on the inside of the bone, the epiphysis, hasn't united with the rest of the bone. Extensive use of the elbow, as in a lot of pitching,

elbow parts from joining. Throwing curve balls also aggravates the condition, said Bauer, and he is for banning its use in boys' baseball.

Little League fans may not agree, but say the doctors, the youngsters' health must be considered first.

Parents may have to cool their enthusiasm for winning and concentrate on the antidote prescribed by Dr. E. Paul Woodward: Winning isn't everything. Teach kids to be good sports.

Dr. Woodward, team physician for the San Diego Chargers, and in the private practice of orthopedics, said that he feels that sports are good for kids, but with certain restrictions.

"It is important that parents do not regiment all of their children's time into playing sports. They need more time to do other things," he said.

"More emphasis should be placed on learning sportsmanship, rather than always on the winning.'

Dr. Woodward also added his suggestions on what can be done to reduce injuries among kids who play in Pop Warner football.

Many times, he said, knee injuries are caused by a cleat which catches, causing the knee to lock and twist.

"I recommend that we change the type of shoe - either use smaller cleats or eliminate them altogether. Use ripple-sole or tennis

Woodward was also against open field blocking, and for limiting blocking in Pop Warner to above the waist. "Studies have shown that this can be done effectively, and reduce injuries."

For the athlete who is past the years of Pop Warner and Little League, a little young for the rocking chair, but enjoys a game of tennis, the doctors also had some advice.

At one time or another you may dislocate your finger. (Even if you are an armchair athlete, you can do it flipping open the beer can.) And if you're a do-it-yourselfer, you may be tempted to pop the old finger back in place.

Dr. James Borden, a hand surgeon, grimaces at the thought. "Don't do it yourself," he advises. 'It's just not a good idea.

"It may be that you also have a fracture, and if you replace the finger, it may be that a doctor can't see it, even after it is X-rayed."

New table wines premier

Three outstanding table wines will be premiering any day now in the marketplace: two are red and one white.

Although both reds are Zin-

fandel, that is where the comparison stops. When I tasted Paul Mas-

son's new Zinfandel, it had had but three months' bottle aging. The aim is six months plus a previous three years of aging in small oak barrels. The first bottling is a blend of 1968 and 1969 wines. It seems to me that Joe

Stillman, Masson's winemaker, has come up with another winner. Aged just long enough to give it a deep red color with a mere tinge of brown, it still has a fresh, fruity flavor rather than the characteristics of a Bordeaux.

Korbel's Zinfandel is another story. Less than a year old, six or seven months to be exact, from the time of fermenting to bottling to shipping, it is meant to be a light, easy-tobecome-accustomed-to wine.

A clear ruby red, I discovered it to be almost zingy in its taste: fresh, a wine that is expected to be drunk young and not meant for aging. It definitely has more body and distinctiveness than a rose and is a bright addition to the red wine scene.

Oakville Vineyards' with their 1973 total wine production set at only 20,000 cases, has created another superb white. Their first master-

piece, introduced last year, was a Sauvignon Blanc. The latest is a Gewurztraminer.

This wine is soft, lucite in color and has every reason to proudly carry its main characteristic of spiciness. (The German word for spicy is "Gewurz.") I love Gewurz-

traminer and I cannot recall ever having had any better, from the United States, than Oakville's. This winery and its across-the-road neighbor, Robert Mondavi, make their white wines in the German method that allows them to hold up two to three times longer in age.

Even though by no means new in the wine market, I recently "rediscovered" the excellent Cabernet Sauvignon of Novitiate Winery.

where the aides are employed. In its fourth year, the program will conduct more training through workshops for aides already employed, said Jason O. Rodriguez, program coordinator. Some 170 aides have already been trained during the program's first

three years, he said. The program is interested in introducing more members of minority groups to the profession of speech and hearing training, said Rodriguez. The program offers a professional level of training to advanced individuals who are qualified and wish to pursue a degree in speech and hearing therapy at Texas Tech

Trainees in the progra must meet certain qualifications before they can enter training, said Rodriguez. Applicants for the program must be unemployed or under-employed at the time of application, but must be under consideration for employment by a school within a year following completion of the training. They must come from families with a

specified maximum income or an income below that Applicants must have a high

school diploma or a GED certificate and be able to take class notes and participate in discussions and practice sessions. They must enjoy working with children regardless of their ethnic background or handicap,

While in the training program, the grant monies pay for travel expenses for commuters or room and board in university facilities for those who live too far from the campus to commute. Textbooks, notebooks, pens and materials for language presentation are also furnished through grant funds. Trainees are paid a per diem stipend while in the training program, explained Rodriguez.





On the other hand, most independents sell at cut-rate prices as they don't have mechanics to bolster their services and their only source of income is from gas and oil.

Independent refineries can no longer get crude oil from the major refineries as they simply do not have the stockpiles.

And major refineries are stuck with large supplies of fuel oil — the winter was not as harsh as expected. Also the Clean Air Act has forced many states and cities to convert from coal to oil to produce electricity.

Consumption of gasoline is up 7 to 8 per cent, and the newer automobiles using a lower compression ratio have


