

> It is designed to provide maximum safety and protection to its occupants and equipment against the effects of air blast thermal radiation, initial and residual radiation, including fallout, and of chemical and biological agents of warfare. The necessary space equipment and supplies will be provided to maintain efficient operation and prolonged occupancy during periods of intense fallout.

The center will be manned and operated on a 24-hour schedule daily at all times, providing monitoring service on all warning channels and will be maintained on a constant ready basis for full activation when impending or threatened disaster is evident, as is done in the present control center.

The message center facilities will be used by DPS communications personnel in maintaining and operating the department's statewide police communications network

The new structure will be large enough to accomodate approximately 120 persons, with dormitory facilities. It will be equipped with a kitchen, dining area, infirmary and offce space for members of the Governor's Defense and Disaster Council and key personnel of the Department of Public Safety.

The center will have its own independent water supply from a well capable of pumping 500 gallons per minute, an independent fuel supply and auxiliary power for utilities.







## Notes from Neighbors: Events and Opinions

Ralls Seeks Lake Road Paving

Members of the Commissioners Court of Crosby County left for Austin early this week to seek a paved road to the new White River Dam. An appointment with the State Highway Commission had been arranged for yesterday, Oct. 31.

The proposed road would leave FM 651 about 15 miles south of Crosbyton, skirt the L-7 ranch on the south and generally follow the dirt road recently opened to the dam site. It would

cross the dam and also follow the new dirt road route into Spur. Paving around the lake would be on the Water District property and any arrangements for paving would be made by the district, commissioners stated.

The group believes they will receive an answer from the Highway Commission, probably soon after the hearing. The state group, it is understood, usually cooperates in making lakes accessable by pavement.

A special allocation of state highway funds will have to be made before the road could be built. - Ralls Banner.

#### Courthouse Grant Is Asked

McCulloch County's application for a 50 percent federal grant to build a new courthouse - if the voters approve the project later - was to be put in the mail Tuesday afternoon.

A delegation was in Fort Worth Monday to get final instructions on filing of the application, and federal officials said the government "will let you know in 10 days whether the application is approved.

"We've been working from early to late on this thing," said County Judge Love Kimbrough. The application outlines the County's plans in great detail and required considerable

"After the application is approved in Washington, we'll give the people a chance to say whether they want a new courthouse."

The federal grant will pay 50 percent of the estimated \$500,- Doug Meador Says ---000 cost, but the voters of McCulloch County will have to okay Phone VA 8-4291 a bond issue to pay the other 50 percent

The courthouse blueprints also include provisions for a fallout shelter in the reinforced concrete basement. In case of emergency it would provide shelter for 1,000 prsons.

'We may never need it, but it would be there in case we do," Kimbrough said. - Brady Herald

War fears scare a lot of folks more than others. Wanting safety and protection is normal enough, but folks shuld want it every day of every year - not just when the headlines blacken. How can these people forget so quickly when the crisis is gone,

Lack of preparedness is one of America's greatest weaknesses. And without a doubt, civil defense tops the list. The cost for real protection is tremendous. The government simply can't afford "to give it" to us. If we want it we've got to provide for

Let's examine the problem in Post. The community has beer inspected by experts and has no buildings feasible for conversion into public fallout shelters. There are only three or four private shelters in the entire community. Those were built during the last crisis.

It makes good sense for folks to go ahead with plans for family fallout shelters. They take time to build. They can be financed through FHA over 60 months.

The danger will ever be with us. When, and if, the bombs come they probably will be at a time chosen by Russia. There will be no advance warning. That is not the Red way.

The nuclear age is here and will be here through all the year ahead. We must take the long range outlook regarding it. There probably will be a lot of Cubas ahead. - JC - Post Dispatch
