

CECAL COCCIDIOSIS

A MAJOR THREAT
Cecal coccidiosis—an acute infection caused by one-cell organisms called coccidia—attacks chicks
and growing birds on a nationwide scale at this time of year.
It most frequently occurs during
spring or early summer.
Coccidiosis usually strikes when
chicks are between two weeks and
three months old. Because climatic
conditions have an influence on a
coccidiosis outbreak, wet, warm,
changeable weather is particularly
favorable for a siege.

Symptoms
The acute form of coccidiosis appears in the flock suddenly. Affected birds may lose appetite, appear
listless, huddle where it is warm,
and show other general symptoms
of infection, The first positive
symptom of cecal coccidiosis is usually bloody droppings. These
come from hemorrhaging of the
ceca (blind intestinal sacs), where
the infection localizes.
Coccidiosis has its beginning
when the one-celled animals called coccidia are picked up and
swallowed by birds. These coccidia
multiply rapidly in their intestines. By passing off these additional
coccidia, infected birds soon spread
the disease to others.

Treatments

Cecal coccidiosis may spread
swiftly through the flock. In the
event of an outbreak, the flock
owner should act immediately to
check the spread. This may be accomplished by giving the flock certain arsenic compounds (such as
3-nitro 4-hydroxy phenylarsonle

coccidiosis.

Sanitary precautions also ard highly important in controlling outbreaks of cecal coccidiosis, as well as in preventing them. In either case, the poultry house or yard should be kept as clean and dry as possible.

Water founts and feed hoppers should be kept clean and sanitary. During an outbreak, disinfect them at least once daily. And stir up at least once daily. And stir up

Through careful sanitation and management the poultry raiser can contribute greatly to the control of this damaging disease.

Social Security

Old-age and survivors insurance is not optional for self-employed persons, John G. Hutton, manager of the Lubbock Social Security office, pointed out yesterday.

Mr. Hutton said there had been some misunderstanding regarding persons working for themselves in their own trade or business, or as partners in such enterprises. "If you are self-employed and derive as much as \$400 in net profit from your business or businesses in any taxalle year after Dec. 31, 1950, your Social Security coverage is compulsory by law," Mr. Hutton said.

He also pointed out that the only exceptions are income derived from practice as a physician, lawyer, dentist, osteopath, chiropractor, optometrist, naturopath, veterinarian, architect, CPA licensed, registered or full-time practicing public accountant, Christian Science practitioner, professional engineer or funeral director. Self- employed persons do not report themselves with the employees. This income must be reported annually on income-tax form 1040 Schedule C, epecially revised for this purpose. The first such report is due March 15, 1952, covering self-employment income for the taxable year 1951.

Payable along with the report is self-employment Social Security tax. This tax is two and one fourth per cent of the first \$3,600 at the distributive share of the partnership net profits, whether or not the profits are distributed.




