from Supt. Dr. Lee Vardy. The all-time high for the beginning of the term represents an increase of 32 students over the same week last year. Dr. Vardy anticipates the enrollment to rise about 32 in the next few weeks.

A breakdown of the school totals last Friday showed 452 students in Slaton High, 274 in Evans, 240 at Stephen F. Austin, 613 at West Ward and 439 in junior high.
