



Nitrogen by the supervisor are allocated Soil Testing **Available**

The new Soil Testing Laboratory being operated by the Extension Service in Lubbock is now chemically processing soil nutrients supplied by roughages samples to determine the plant nutrients that the soil can supply the crops to be grown in 1961 and 1962. Each sample is analyzed for reaction (pH), organic matter, available phosphate, available potash, avail-

able calcium, and soluble salts. It should be kept in mind that nitrogen as such cannot be practically determined by a soil test. Nitrogen fertilizer recommendations are based primarily on the amount of organic matter the soil contains, the crop to be grown along with anticipated yields, and the amount and kind of nitrogen carrying fertilizers previously applied

As stated on the information Sheet that must be sent in with soil samples it is extremely important to avoid sampling in fertilized bands where phosphate and potash were pre-




