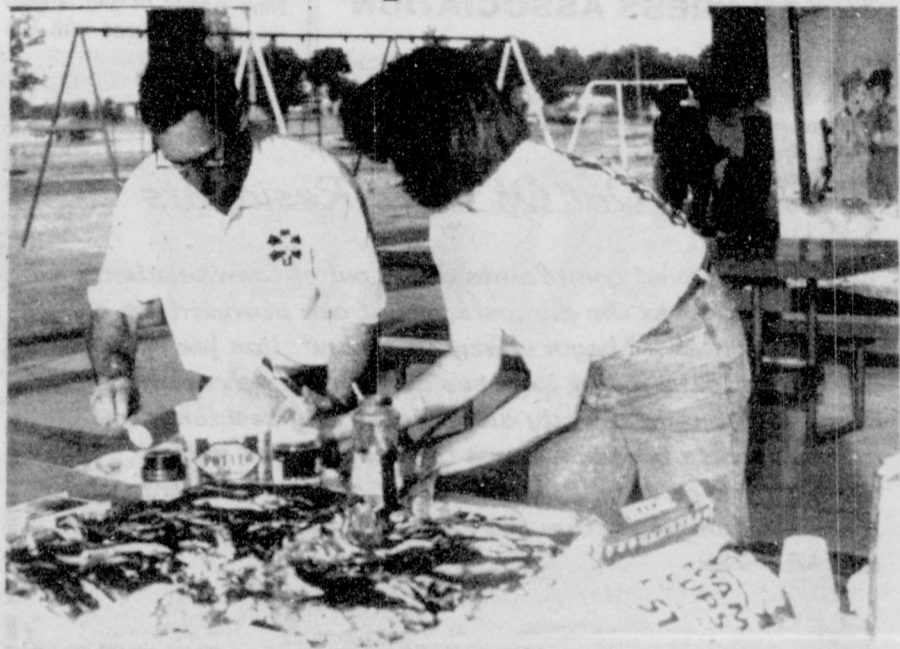

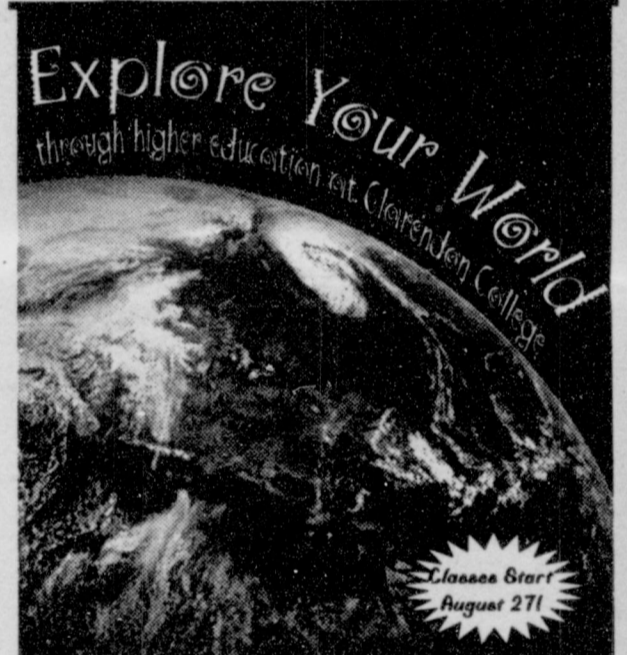



Animals on the list are as follows: Lion, Tiger, Ocelot, Cougar, Leopard, Cheetah, Jaguar, Hyena, Bear, Lesser Panda, Binturou, Wolf, Ape, Elephant, and Rhinoceros.

A discussion concerning the 97-98 budget was held. The budget hearing will be set for September.

The next meeting will be August 11, 1997.


