
working toward the good of our community.





Groom- Two men were arrested yesterday along I-40 in Carson County in two separate traffic stops after large amounts of Marijuana were found in their vehicles.

The first traffic stop occurred at 11:17 a.m. yesterday when troopers stopped a 2006 Chevy Trailblazer traveling eastbound on I-40, 18 miles west of Groom. Timothy David Fox, 38 of Itasca Illinois, was later arrested after 162 pounds of Marijuana was found in several duffle bags in the cargo area of the vehicle Fox was booked into the Carson County Jail in Panhandle on drug related charges.

The Marijuana has an estimated value of \$68,202.00. Investigators believe this load originated in Albuquerque New Mexico and was destined for Chicago Illinois.

The next seizure occurred at 3 p.m yesterday when a 1998 Ford Contour traveling eastbound on I-40 near Groom was stopped for a traffic violation. The driver, 35 year old Anthony Lee Rodriguez of Collinsville Illinois, was later arrested after 84 pounds of Marijuana was found inside the trunk of his vehicle The Marijuana was in 24 bundles packed inside a box. Rodriguez was booked into the Carson County Jail in Panhandle on drug related charges.

The Marijuana has an estimated value of \$42,090.00. This load was believed to have originated in Los Angeles California and headed for St. Louis Missouri
