## Groom Ambulance Volunteers Honored For 30 Years Service

The Groom Ambulance Service was honored for its thirty years of service at the P.E.M.S.S. Banquet held Saturday, January 7 at the Civic Center Grand Plaza. Groom EMS was established in 1964 to make it the fifth oldest in the Texas Panhandle. Al Homer and his wife, Agnes, charter members of the service, were guests of honor at the banquet. Representing Groom EMS were: Craig and Monica

Howard, David and Shelly Britten and Charlott Whatley.

Jay Lamb, president of Groom EMS brought the January meeting to order Sunday, January 8 at 6:30 p.m.

Jay recognized EMT's; Toni Pavlovsky, Craig Howard, Kevin Kerlee, Charlott Whatley and himself for successfully completing the "Automated External Defibrillation" AED Certification. He also announced that a Texas

Department of Health grant is being pursued to purchase an AED for the Groom Ambulance. Jay commented that having five certified operators on the service will increase the chances.

EMT Certification classes will begin Monday, January 16 sat 6:00 p.m. Jim McMasters of Amarillo College will instruct the class. Classes will be held each Monday and Wednesday through May.

## School Administrators Rehired For '95-'96

The Groom School Board of Trustees met in an early morning session on Tuesday, January 10. All members were present as well as Superintendent Ben Ingham, Principal Fred Lunsford and Business Manager Joyce Hutsell.

The December 20, 1994 minutes of the regular school board meeting were approved as read.

The Board went into executive session at 7:09 am to discuss performance review of the school

Superintendent Ben Ingham has a two year contract and will not need to be renewed until 1996. No action was required in his review.

The Board unanimously offered employment to Mr. Fred Lunsford, principal for the 1995-96 school year at a salary to be set later in conjunction with the long range salary schedule.

Employment was also offered to Business Manager Joyce Hutsell for the 1995-96 school year. Her salary will be set later

with the long range salary schedule. The board voted unanimously in favor except for Ken Burger who abstained due to nepotism laws.

The date and time for graduation in 1995 was discussed. No action was taken at this time.

The transfer of students to the Panhandle School District was approved.

The board voted to pay all bills and adjourned. administrative staff. The closed session was ended at 7:42 am.

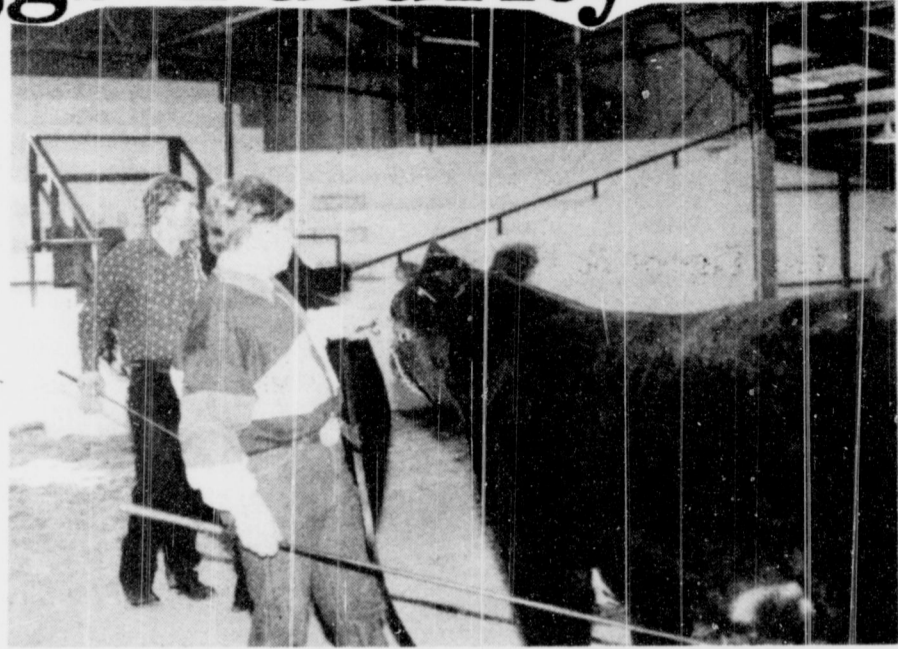

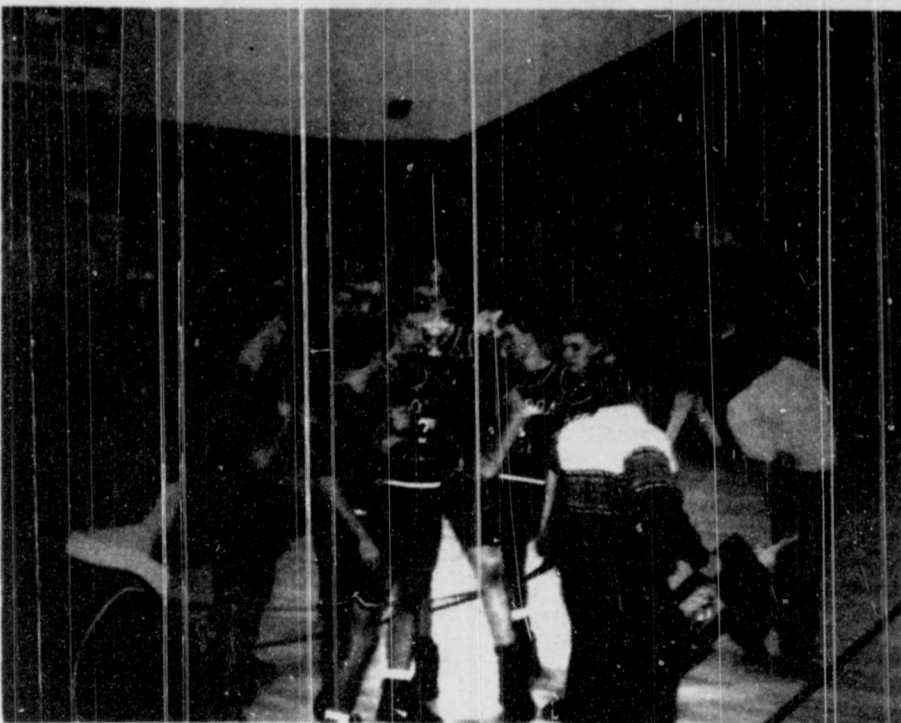

## As The Interstate Turns... By Joe Longway

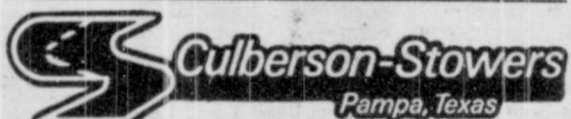

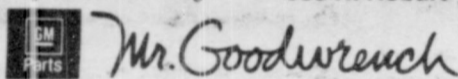

### PUBLIC INFORMATION FOR GAS EMERGENCY

The gas that is distributed in the City of McLean is odorized with BP Captan. This odorant has an acrid petroleum smell. It is put into the city's gas system for locating leaks and for the public's safety.

**How to recognize an emergency or potentially dangerous situation:** 1) Escaping gas may be detected by smell when gas is odorized. 2) Listen for hissing sound. 3) A fire in or near a gas appliance or piping. 4) Unusual noise at an appliance. 5) Unusual behavior or the flame at an appliance burner. 6) Gas outside (odor, blowing burning). 7) Odor of gas where excavation work is in progress or has recently been completed.

**What action to take in an emergency or when gas leak is detected:** 1) Contact gas utility operator immediately at the City Office (779-2481 or 2482). 2) **Do Not** attempt to locate gas leaks with matches or other open flame. 3) **Do Not** remain in a building when there is a strong odor of gas. 4) **Do Not** turn lights on or off or unplug electrical appliance when you smell gas. 5) **Do Not** use telephone lines in the area of strong gas odor.

#### Remember Remember Remember!!!!

Report any smell of gas no matter how slight and follow these guidelines in the presence of strong gas odor for your family's safety.

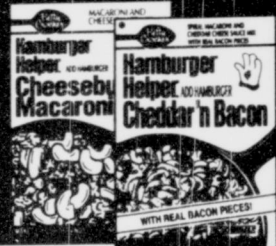
