In the spring of 1958, the Longhorn Cafe in Groom was owned by Ruth and Nell Knight, the cook was Mary Lack and the waitress working on the 6:00 a.m. shift was Shirley Lamberston. She and Mary were making coffee and getting the cafe ready for customers, Shirley noticed a car driving by slowly and parking across the street at the Chevron Station. Two young men wearing leather jackets came in and sat at the counter ordering coffee. One got up to go to the restroom and looked in the kitchen on his way. The other one started looking at a magazine. He also asked for a package of Camel cigarettes. He then pulled a gun, pointed it at Shirley and said, "Open the register." He cleaned out the register, dropping some of the money on the floor, but not stopping to pick it up. The other man went into the kitchen and tore the phone from the wall and threw it to the floor.

## Haynes To Serve On Appraisal Board

McLean ISD Board of Education met October 2nd with members; Jake Hess II, Thacker Haynes, Steve Brass and Joe Magee present. Administrators-Rex Peeples, John Griffin and Jerry Cook were also present along with visitor Terri Hall.

Board president Jake Hess called the meeting to order with the invocation led by Thacker Haynes.

The first item on the agenda was the approval of the minutes of the Sept. meeting.

President Hess asked if there were any comments from visitors. A discussion followed concerning the percentage of students passing all areas of the TEAMS test and the comparison recently published in the Pampa News.

Superintendent Rex Peeples brought attention to the upcoming Six-Man meeting held in Austin on October 20-21. Following a motion by Joe Magee, the board decided to send Rex Peeples and the Athletic Director.

Peeples also took the floor once again to report on Senate Bill I and the requirement that the board of trustees to adopt a policy to involve the professional staff of the district in establishing and reviewing the district's educational goals, objectives and major district-wide classroom instructional programs. Peeples reported that the elections had been held and the following personnel would serve on the District Educational Improvement Council and Campus Improvement Committees: Elementary/Jr. High-Cynthia Howard, Donna Messer, Bobbi Stall and John Griffin, High School-Jerry Miller, Debbie Finsterwald, Virginia

Holwick and Jerry Cook. Each member will serve a three year term. The board of trustees elected Steve Brass to be the Board's designee.

Community members appointed by the Board were Brenda Jasper, Charolette Hefley, Janet McCracken, Terrie Hall and Lois Murray.

Supt. Peeples reported that smaller busses might be appropriate for the future since the routes are becoming smaller and gas prices are rising.

Sam Haynes was elected by the board to serve as their candidate on the Gray County Appraisal Board of Representatives. All members were in favor except Thacker Haynes abstained from voting.

Doris Stillwell was employed by the board

following a motion by Joe Magee and seconded by Thacker Haynes as a Teachers Aid I.

Supt. Peeples requested that the board go into executive session. Pres. Hess, citing Article 6252-17, Section 2 (g), convened the board into executive session at 5:35 p.m. and re-opened the meeting at approximately 6:05.

Supt. Peeples gave the Business Manager's report. Following a motion by Thacker Haynes and seconded by Steve Brass the check report was approved and the financial statement for September and cafeteria report.

Thacker Haynes reported no further business and the meeting was adjourned. Steve Brass seconded the motion.

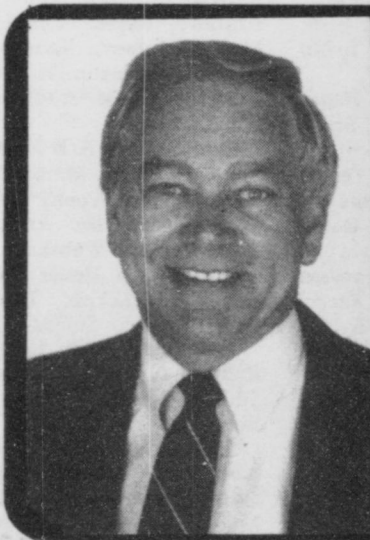



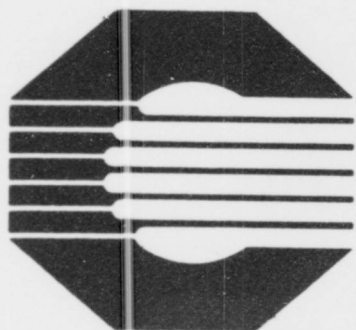

Additionally, the award of the contract, if at all, shall be made to the responsible offeror whose proposal is determined to be the lowest evaluated offer resulting from negotiation, taking into consideration the relative importance of price and other evaluation factors in accordance with Section 262.030 of said Code.

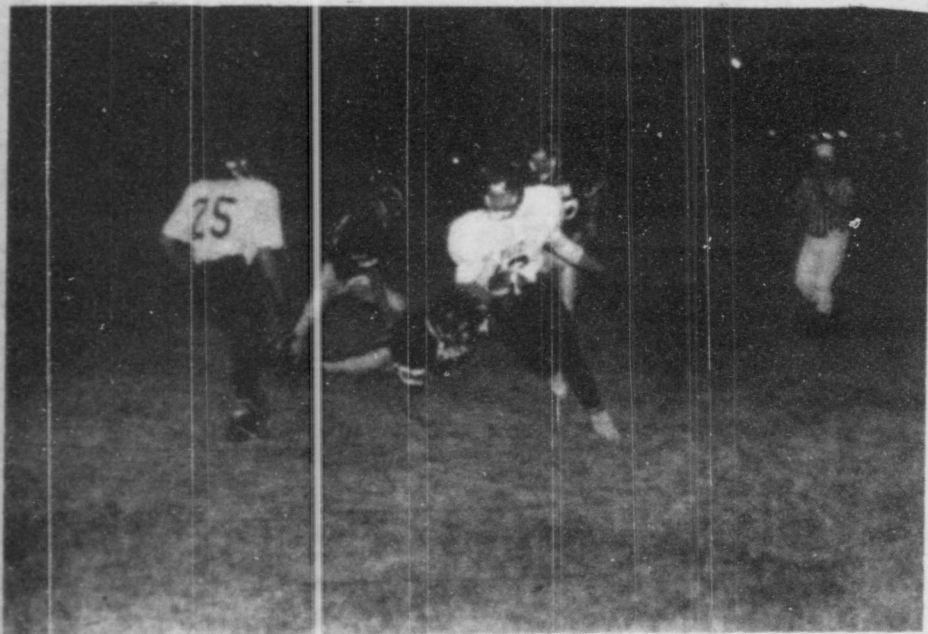

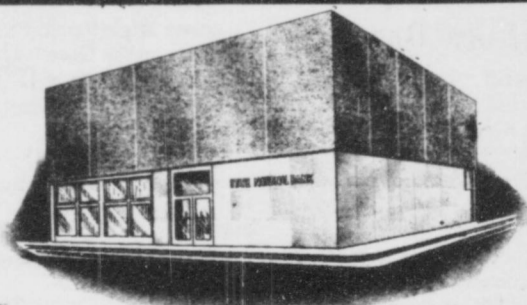

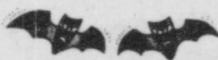

Money takers reported to have brought in over \$200.00 and nearly sold out of potatoes.

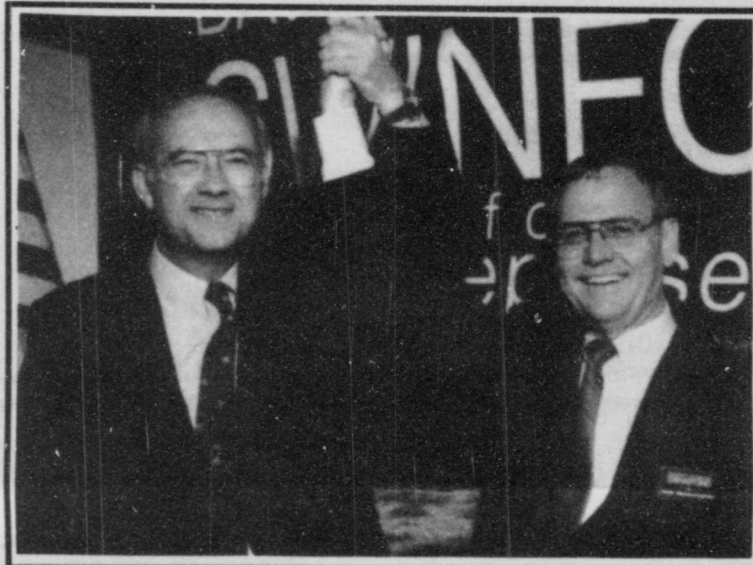

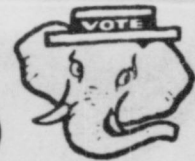

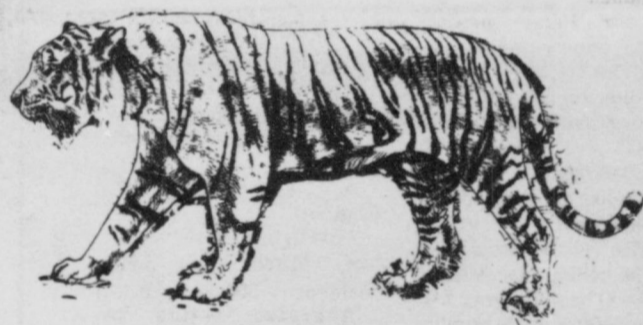
