Britten, Kotara Take Top '95 Class Honors

Bart Britten has been named the Valedictorian of the 1994-95 Senior graduating class of Groom High School.

Bart, the son of Gary and Sharon Britten of Groom, has been active in all sports during his high school career. He stated that he

liked them all, but he was especially fond of football and golf.

According to Bart, his favorite accomplishments in high school were helping the football team win a district title for the first time in 17 years, going to College Station for the Junior

Engineer Technology Society, and being named Valedictorian of his class.

After high school, Bart plans to attend West Texas A&M University to take basic courses, and later he plans to enroll in pre-med school.

Halee Kotara, daughter

of Wayne and Adela Kotara, has been honored as Groom High School's Class of 1995 Salutatorian. She was a member of the yearbook staff for four years, and is currently serving as co-editor. An active member of UIL

Sales Tax Proposals Pass, New Faces On City Council And School Board

Groom voters gave resounding approval to the two sales tax propositions on Saturday's ballots. The ½ cent for economic development netted 123 votes in favor and 37 against.

The ½ cent sales tax to reduce property tax has a slightly narrower margin with 109 for and 46 against.

Danny Ashford, Junior was the top vote-getter in the alderman's race with 102 votes.

He will be a new face on the Council unseating long-time alderman, Jerry Thornton.

Incumbent alderman Ronny Fields beat challenger Randy Johnson

by a narrow margin, 79-71.

In the Groom School Board election the two incumbents will retain their seats. Dennis Babcock had 183 votes and Adela Kotara had 164.

Write in candidate, Pat Britten, will fill the seat left vacant when Ken Burger, long time trustee, chose not to run again.

With 135 votes, Britten won out over challenger Curtis Downs III with 93 votes.

The newly elected officials were sworn in at the regularly scheduled meetings of the City Council and School Board on Tuesday evening.

National EMS Week Honors Volunteers

Groom Ambulance Service volunteers are committed to relieve suffering and to reduce injury severity and death at the scene of an accidental injury or sudden illness and during transportation to a medical facility.

For the Groom Ambulance Service to be a valued member of the pre-hospital emergency medical care team, they must have the following: Proper training and experience, ready availability of the proper equipment and supplies; a properly designed vehicle to meet the needs of the sick and injured, treatment protocols and guidelines, radio communication with emergency department personnel, ready availability of physician-directed medical control.

Currently the Groom Ambulance Service has eight active certified Emergency Medical Technicians, three non-active Emergency Medical Technicians and one Emergency Medical

Technician, Intermediate. Six Groom residents have completed training and are awaiting test results.

To receive the state required certification a student must complete and master the 140 hour course, 24 hours of clinical time in an emergency department, eight hours on a ALS ambulance and master required skills and a Texas Department of Health written exam. To maintain certification the EMT is required to document 40 contact hours of continued education every two years, with a total of 80 contact hours within the four-year certification period. EMT-Intermediates require 120 hours every four years. As you can see these volunteers give a number of hours for education and training plus time spent on actual runs, maintenance and operating of the ambulance service.

Since January five Groom EMT's upgraded their skills to include automated external defibrilaton. The service has not been able to

purchase a defibrillator due to a shortage of funds.

Due to the donation of a computer by Hoechst Celanese and many donated hours by an ambulance volunteer, accounting, purchasing and billing services have become very efficient and effective. Memorial recognitions have become prompt and efficient.

From January 16 through May 3, Groom ambulance volunteers attended classes twice a week from 6 to 10 pm. Classes were taught by Amarillo College and made possible financially by the City of Groom.

Public education has been a priority by volunteers through the public school system and civic organizations. CPR classes were taught, safety education skills portrayed to all ages.

Not mentioned are the number of times the siren went off calling emergency personnel or the times the phone rang in the middle of the night. It can be

documented all calls were answered by skilled technicians.

The Groom Ambulance Service can proudly state that volunteers have truly done their part in achieving service goals and responsibilities. They have not been able to obtain equipment (AED, Pager Systems) and a vehicle needed to maintain a valued membership of the pre-hospital emergency medical care team. The currently owned ambulance has spent more time in the repair shop since January than in service.

Groom Ambulance Service was honored in January for 30 years service by the Panhandle Emergency Medical Service System.

The service has a past with a reputation of excellence and dependability. Great strides have been put forth to improve services in all areas. Despite great efforts the ambulance service will doubtfully ever

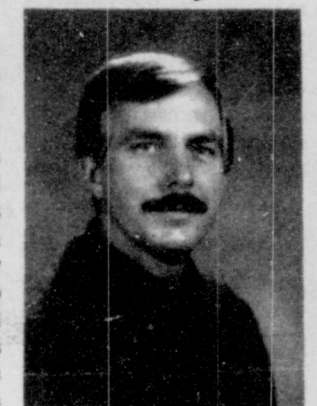



J.D. married Marjorie Goodman August 9, 1995, a few months after taking office. They have one son Jay Dee and daughter-in-law Becky, and two grandchildren, Jessi and Travis.

J.D. was a faithful member of the Church of Christ. He was also a member of the American Angus Association, the American Quarter Horse Association, the Texas Justices of Peace and Constables Association, Texas Law Enforcement Association and Sheriff's Association of Texas. He was named to Who's Who in Texas '73 & '74.

He was always a good friend to young people, and worked with them to keep them out of trouble. He and Marjorie kept run-aways in their home, until their parents came for them. Always giving help, guidance and understanding.

Some of J.D.'s experiences on Route 66 were humorous, heart warming, others heart-breaking and hair-raising.

E.J. and Grace Windom moved to McLean, Texas in 1929 from Colorado. One of Slim's first jobs was driving a dump truck hauling caliche between Alanreed and McLean for the construction of Old Route 66 before it was paved.

Slim started a garage business in 1932, he also worked for Cooks Chevrolet until 1958. He had a second job driving a school bus.

Grace and Slim bought the Floyd Hotel located a half block north of Old Route 66 on Gray Street. In 1942 they rented rooms and apartments to people working at the German Prisoner of War Camp

northeast of McLean. In 1955, they built the West Wind Motel, also on Route 66. It is now doing business as the Cactus Inn. They built the Windi-Inn Motel in Alanreed. It is now called the Crockett Motel and still going.

They had four children, E.J. Windom, Jr. of McLean and Marsalee Hastings of Idalou, Texas. Jerry passed away in 1941 at the age of 10, and Johnny died in World War II, when the U.S.S. Liscomb Bay was bombed and sunk. The V.F.W. Post 8565 in McLean carries his name. Grace passed away November 21, 1980 and E.J. (Slim) on January 5, 1992. They lived and worked on 66 for 66 years.

E.J. Windom Jr.

E.J. Windom Jr. worked for his Dad, "Slim" Windom, at his garage while he was in high school, and until he enlisted in the Air Corps in 1942. After basic training, he was stationed in Dalhart, Texas. He and Dorris Wilson were married January 3, 1943 in McLean. He served in England from August 13, 1943 until his discharge in 1945 when he returned to McLean to his wife and a son whom he had never seen.

He worked for Cook Chevrolet until 1947 when he opened his own garage and service station known as "The Murf Roe" Corner at the Pampa Highway and Route 66 in McLean. He moved back to the Chevrolet garage building at 200 West First Street on Old 66, and in 1969 he bought the Motor Inn Parts Store, and moved it to his present location, and is still doing business on Old Route 66.

E.J. is a member of the Johnny Windom V.F.W. Post, McLean Golf Association and United Methodist Church. He has served on the McLean School Board, and City Council. He has always been interested in helping in all school activities.

Dorris and E.J. celebrated their Golden Anniversary January 3, 1993. They have three sons, Clyde Allen and his wife Ann; Wade Allen and his wife Ann; Misty, they live in Dallas; Eddy Jay and wife Barbara, and children, Eric, Jared and Tyler, live in Grapevine;
