## High School Boys 1st, Girls 2nd, Jr. High 2nd, In Groom Relays

### Groom High School Results

The Annual Groom Relays were held last week in near perfect weather with twelve schools attending.

Panhandle took home the first place honors, boys and girls, in the 11-man division. White Deer boys and Booker girls placed second and Booker boys and White Deer girls placed third.

Groom boys won the Six-man division handily with a lead of 53.75 points over second place Valley. The Tigers totaled 166.75 points.

Groom girls placed second. Miami won with 157 points while Groom netted only 108.

Groom Tiger's two first place wins came from the Ritter brothers, Seth and Justin. Seth placed first in the pole vault and Justin placed first in the 800.

Harold Cave placed second and Tom Lambert in the shot put.

Tom Lambert placed second and Chris Burger placed third in the discus.

Ty Lambert placed third in the pole vault.

Groom's 400 meter relay team of Jeremy Chavedo, Bryan Crowell, Seth Ritter and Bart Britten placed third.

## G.T.E. Ballots To Determine Fate Of Extended Telephoning Area

The Public Utility Commission of Texas has ordered GTE to begin the balloting process to determine if subscribers in Groom want extended local calling to Pampa and Panhandle. The petitions seeking expanded toll-free calling signed by telephone customers in Groom were certified by the PUC as sufficient, and the Commission said all other requirements of PUC rules were met.

GTE must distribute ballots to all telephone subscribers in the Groom Exchange by April 6, and they have 15 days to vote. Ballots must be returned to the PUC in Austin, where

they will be tabulated. If there is an affirmative vote by 70 percent of the customers, the PUC would consider the request. The Commission would then notify GTE that the ballot had passed and the company should submit within 30 days a cost study indicating the costs to provide the expansion of toll-free local calling, the proposed initial fees for the service, and the implementation schedule for the service.

Under law, GTE would impose a monthly charge of up to \$3.50 per line for residential telephone customers and \$7 per line for business customers to be

collected from all customers in the petitioning exchange. The Groom Exchange can challenge GTE's proposed rate before the PUC if city officials and their attorney believe the proposed charges cannot be justified. The monthly charges would only be in effect until the telephone company's next general rate case, when the cost of the service is expected to be included in the regular rates paid by all customers in the state.

Extended local service to provide larger local toll-free calling areas in rural and suburban areas was made possible with passage by the Texas Legislature of Senate Bill 632, which went into effect September 1, 1993.

## Fire Fighter, Randy Johnson, Injured In Bowers City Area Blaze Accident

A Groom volunteer fireman had minor injuries after a mishap during a major fire in Gray County that burned nearly 4,000 acres of land.

Randy Johnson was thrown from the front firefighting basket when a Gray County truck stopped suddenly and heavy smoke prevented the Groom driver, Jay Lamb, from seeing it stop. Johnson was reported to have sustained a minor concussion, and several pulled muscles in his back, hip and legs in the accident.

The fire began about 1.5 miles south of Bowers City and spread approximately six miles east toward Lefors in the river breaks and canyons. The cause of the blaze is believed to be downed powerlines from high winds or from a welder's torch.

Fire Chief Tony Treadwell stated that the blaze could have been very

bad.

"It's a wonder that Lefors is still standing," he said. Seven different fire departments responded but the blaze which began around 10:00 am took until 7:00 pm to put out.

"We were there around six hours," said Treadwell. "We took three units, leaving at home, as always,

the city pumper, in case there was a fire locally. We always have other towns backing us up when we leave our own territory just in case there is an emergency here."

"The Groom Fire Department has a contract with Gray County and other

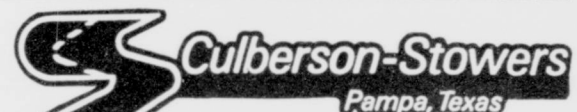

### Panhandle Ground Water Conservation District Votes On Annexation Of Roberts County

The Board of Directors of the Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District #3 met Wednesday, March 16, 1994. At this meeting the Board called for a special election on May 7, 1994. The purpose of the election is the annexation of the remainder of Roberts County into this district. Approximately one fourth of Roberts County is already in the water conservation district.

A petition signed by more than seventy landowners in Roberts County requested annexation of the remainder of the county into the district, was presented to the board at their January meeting.

The board accepted the petitions and held two hearings on the proposed annexation. The first hearing was held in the P.G.W.C.D. on February 23. This hearing was for persons already in the district to express their feelings about the proposed annexation. The second hearing held in the Miami High School Auditorium was to allow persons in Roberts County to express their opinions about joining the district.

The election is open only to persons in Roberts County not already in the Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District.

## Carson County Sheriff's Report

### College Funding Workshop

Dr. Jerry Mason, Professor of Texas Tech University held a seminar on Monday night on "How to Fund Your Child's Education." The seminar was provided by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in the Activities Center in Claude.

Dr. Mason said, "Whether one goes to Texas Tech or Harvard, the education is the same." He believes education is number one, with it, education can give you the world."

College visitations and visiting with the faculty can help one decide if that school is for them. Internships, Mason says he would like to see schools recommend more. There are currently eight persons in custody at the Carson County Jail. Their charges range from: 1) unauthorized use of a motor vehicle; 1) misdemeanor/class B theft; 1) parole violation; 1) probation violation; 1) sexual assault; 1) DWI-f/DWLS/Poss. of Meth. u/28 grams; 1) involuntary manslaughter.

The Carson County

Sheriff's office responded to the KOA camp ground in Gray County on a shooting of a person who later was reported to have attempted suicide. The Groom ambulance responded to the scene as well as Gray County officials. The Groom ambulance crew called for Medivac to fly the man out.

Our office also responded to numerous calls on the interstate for motorist assist, and was instrumental in bringing together separated

motorists.

We are continuing investigations of complaints of youths purchasing alcohol throughout the county in some convenience stores.

The Texas Highway Patrol, Troopers C. Ray and Joe Longway assisted the Carson County unit with a stolen van at Lark.

Two youths from Norman, Oklahoma were in possession of the van at the time. Both young men were transported to the

courthouse in Panhandle where one was released to his parents, while the other remains in custody.

The Sheriff's Department responded to Skellytown in regards to a report of five runaways from that town.

While in the process of obtaining information on the runaways from the parents a radio broadcast was put out on a stolen pickup from just north of Panhandle. The owners of the pickup, upon returning home from out of town, saw their pickup going north on Hwy. 207 toward Borger. A short time later Sheriff Brand stopped the pickup near the Four Sixes Ranch. The pickup was occupied by three juveniles, which were three of the five runaways reported from Skellytown. Units from Hutchinson County Sheriff's Department, and the Borger

Highway Patrol assisted as did a unit from Carson County Sheriff's Department. The three youths were transported to the courthouse in Panhandle. Two of the youths were released to their parents, while the third was released into the custody of the Pampa Juvenile authorities.

The Sheriff's Department is continuing investigation of vandalism of mailboxes, and road signs throughout the county. Patrols have been increased to provide more coverage and quicker response time.

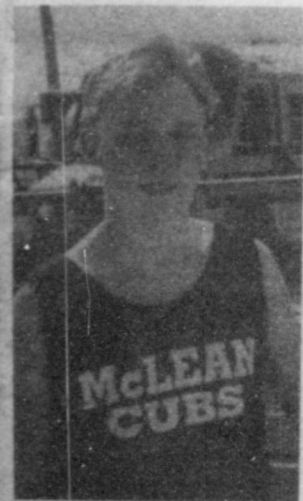

Erin McCracken, senior of McLean High School,

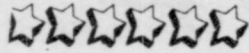
