

Chris Martin Completed Tour Of Duty In Bosnia



Chris Martin, (UTCN), AM where personnel U.S. Navy Seabee attached to the Naval discuss Battalion -133 (NMCB-133) recently completed a tour of duty in Bosnia. Instead of working as a Seabee in construction (his normal duties), Chris and 34 other Seabees were assigned to the Detail Joint Guard providing security or both Army and N. "II Bosnia-Herzegovina.

Prior to arriving in Bosnia, Chris received Individual Replacement Training (IRT) in Rota, Spain. During IRT, extra time and attention was spent on those aspects that the security platoon would be directly involved with on a daily basis; searching personnel and vehicles, proper actions to take when finding contraband dealing aggressive local nationals. The training was expanded to include special weapons training and active participation in force protection patrols with Army personnel. Each day began with Guard Mount at 7:10

Construction . Engagement and check their weapons. Afterwards the watch section reports to their stations to begin their 24 hour watch cycle.
