

> Give Teachers' Kids A Helping Hand?

Texas legislators are thinking of ways to entice the state's teachers to stay in their profession. If bills introduced in the House and Senate pass this session, teachers with 10 or more years of experience could get a helping hand to cover their kid's college expenses. Legislative supporters say the cost of helping provide a college education to the children of Texas teachers will easily be offset by the benefits of retaining those experienced teachers in the

About 125,000 Texas teachers have 10 or more years of experience, and would qualify for the program.

Texas teachers' salaries fall below the national average and many leave for better paying jobs.

The cost of Texas' universities and junior colleges will continue to rise.

Giving teachers' kids a helping hand will cost a small fraction of the state's \$46.6 billion budget in 1998-99.


