Paramount Pictures Choose Groom

Paramount Pictures' Executives were in Groom over the weekend to give their approval to Groom as a site for shooting of several scenes of the motion picture "Leap of Faith," starring that "wild and crazy guy," Steve Martin as a preacher.

Bill Bowling, location manager and Kate McCartley, assistant location manager of Paramount Pictures have been in Groom the past several weeks looking and discussing possible locations for the shooting of scenes in and around Groom.

On Friday, Bowling was joined in Groom by Patricia von Brandenstein, production designer from New York. Brandenstein won an Oscar at the Academy Awards for her part in the movie "Amadeus." Also in Groom Friday along with Bowling and Brandenstein to view scene sites were Dennis Bradford, art director of

Brooklyn, New York, and assistant art director Gary Kosko of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania. Bill Bradford of Dallas, Texas also was here touring. He is the construction manager.

Brandenstein viewed the sites of Our Place Motel, several ranch house settings (for a sheriff to live in the movie), the field where a large tent will be erected, west of town, and other possible sites.

Bowling told The Groom News Monday morning the school is still being considered for a possible shooting site but no decision has been made yet.

The final word as to whether Groom would be a definite site for shooting did not come until Monday once other executives of the movie visited Groom on Sunday. Visiting Groom with Bowling and Brandenstein was Richard Pearce, director of the movie. Pearce also directed

"Country" and "The Long Walk Home." Tony Brand, 1st assistant director from London, England was here along with Fred Murphy, director of cinematography of New York; Max Johnson, transportation coordinator of Los Angeles; production manager Roger Pulgese; and art director Dennis Bradford.

Bob Pool's barn across the street from the RGM elevator will be used as a construction shop. As of now, the designers and art staff are working on details of the modification to the motel.

"The movie is not considered a comedy," said Bowling, "but rather a drama with comic situations." Filming is scheduled in Groom for two to three weeks in July. But construction will begin immediately.

Groom Economic Development Corporation members have worked very

hard in recent weeks to accommodate Paramount Pictures and their staff to bring about such a large economic impact on the area. Tony Treadwell, GEDC President said Bowling was impressed with the town atmosphere. The

willingness of the Groom residents to work and negotiate fairly with Paramount Pictures played a large part in the decision to shoot in Groom.

The Paramount staff left Monday for Dallas and San

Antonio to search out a large indoor-air conditioned space to be used for shooting the interior tent scenes. They are scheduled to return to Groom in a few days.

Melinda Burgin Wins State

Jack and Bettye West Installed Into Old Route 66 Hall Of Fame Saturday

Two local residents were honored Saturday as they were installed to the Old Route 66 Hall of Fame.

The ceremonies, held at the Devil's Rope Museum in McLean, honored five other members for 1992.

Jack and Bettye West have lived and worked on Route 66 all their lives. Jack was born in Clarksville, Arkansas in 1926, the year Route 66 was opened. He grew up in Erick, Oklahoma and McLean. Bettye Johnston West was born

and raised in McLean. Shortly after their marriage in 1952, they moved thirty miles west on Route 66 to the farming community of Groom, Texas.

Jack worked for Wheeler-Evans Grain Company for several years before he and Bettye bought the Groom Truck Terminal, which they owned and operated from 1962 until 1982. They are still in business on Old Route 66 as owners of the Groom Car Wash.

Both are members of the

Groom United Methodist Church. They have four grown children and eight grandchildren.

They were joined by their children, Alice, Jim, Margrete and Shirley with their families as well as Bettye's Mother, Mrs. Johnson.



County Sheriff's Report

During the past week the Carson County Sheriff's Department has answered several calls involving cattle on the highways. Residents are urged to use caution when driving at night as the cattle are often difficult to see.

Carson County deputies are investigating complaints of persons selling alcohol to minors in Groom and rural locations within the county. Deputies responded to a 9-1-1 call from the west end of the county involving a person attempting to break into a mobile home and threatening to shoot the family with a shotgun through the front door. One male was taken into custody after this call.

Deputies assisted in the investigation of a one-vehicle rollover west of Panhandle and investigated several reports of suspicious persons in Groom, White Deer and I-40.

One out-of-town vehicle with four occupants was

stopped west of Panhandle after the occupants were observed by area residents driving around on various farm properties.

Deputies are continuing their investigation into an oil-field theft near Skellytown in which nearly a tanker-load of oil was allegedly taken without the owner's permission.

Deputies assisted other law enforcement agencies in a search for a missing child from Earth, Texas. Officers searched the I-40 rest areas on Sunday evening after a trucker reported having seen a woman with a young child who matched the description of the child from Earth.

GROOM JUNIOR HIGH ATHLETIC PARTY

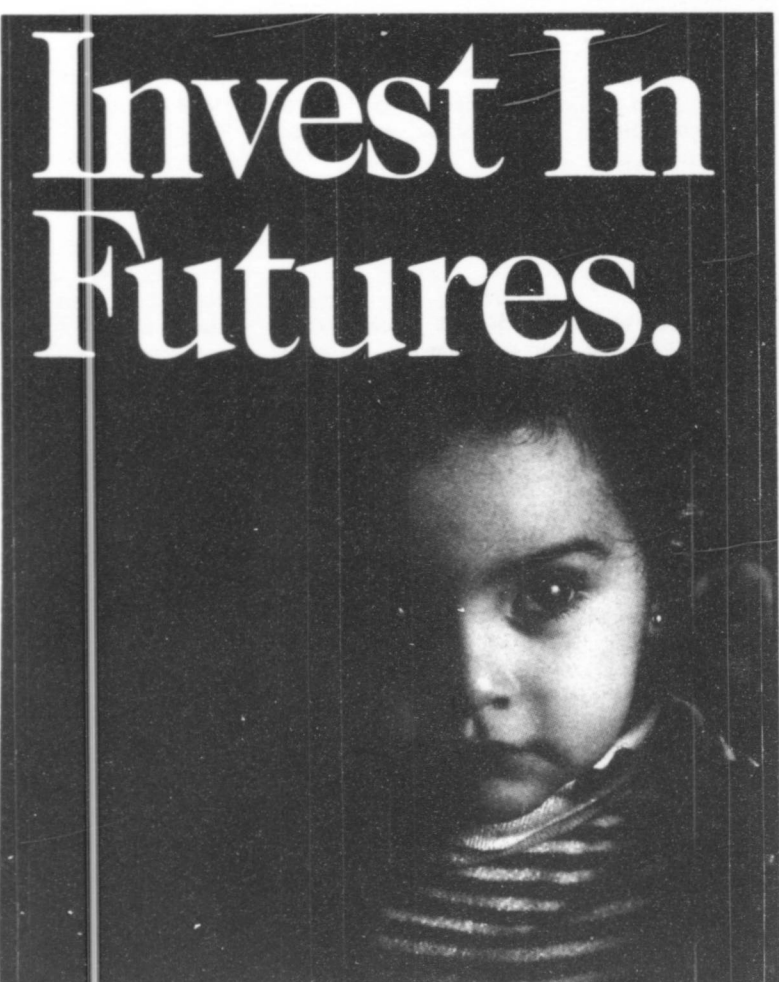

Childress's Reading Improvement Class decorated each cup and filled them with pens, pencils, and goodies.

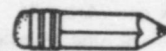
Principal Judy Babcock presented the faculty with large red apples on Tuesday.

The water works fund, dues balance, was changed \$750.00 from \$200.00, and the FICA was changed from 1,500.00 to 3,500.00. The motion was unanimous.

The council approved adopting a resolution to join the Resource Conservation and Development Services. The RC&D aim is to "place greater emphasis on creating jobs, providing community services and facilities to improve the quality of life in rural areas". The Soil Conservation Service is responsible for administering the program.

The Council instructed City Secretary Pat Ashford to write a proclamation for the newspaper for City Beautification.

A Resolution was adopted to participate in the

American Disabilities Act which will provide training for the city secretary or board members on many issues concerning the disabled.

\$1,279.37 was approved for the summer program. These funds are matched by the school and the Lions Club.

As their final action Bill Homer moved and Jerry Thornton seconded a unanimous decision to proclaim public support of the proposed Paramount Pictures movie location in Groom.

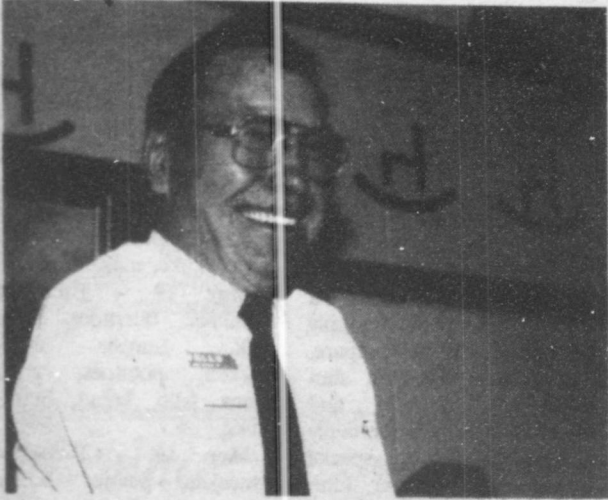

The State Old Route 66 Association inducted seven new members into the Route 66 Hall of Fame Saturday during their 2nd annual meeting.

Dick Bode, acting as "Master of Ceremonies" introduced special guests, Charlene Shirley, Jane Herndon, Ruth Magee, Roger McCracken, Sue Simmons, and Levern Beck; all state and local officers. Darlene Birkes of the Gray County Historical Society also was recognized.

Ted Simmons, Gray County Commissioner, read a proclamation from Texas Governor, Ann Richards, proclaiming 1992 a year of celebration commemorating Old Route 66's 66th birthday.

State Representative Warren Chisum recalled his hitchhiking days on the "Mother Road". Wayne Bybee and F.J. Hess were recognized for their idea to remodel the old Phillips 66 station, an act which led to the birth of McLean's interest in Old Route 66.

Ruth Magee, local president, unveiled a historical marker which will be placed on the Old Phillips 66 station which was built in 1929.

Magee also presented the mural which will be placed on a wall which is currently decorated by graffiti. Painted by Leland Myers, it was designed in part by

Penny Lee. Lee entered a contest at McLean High School.

"Our Hall of Fame Inductees", said Brode "are the pioneers and

entrepreneurs who were the heart and soul of the Mother Road."

The 1992 Hall of Famers are Bob Lee, Emmett Allen, Jack and Bettye West, Corinne Trimble, Mayme Walker Tindall, and Boyd Meador.

Bob Lee of Amarillo, Texas established the Big Texas Steak Ranch, and was nominated last year, but due to his untimely death this recognition was delayed until now.

Bob Lee moved to Amarillo in 1959 and was fascinated with the western heritage of the area. This fascination became the drive that established the Big Texas Steak Ranch on Old Route 66. As I-40 replaced old 66 in 1970, it was obvious that a move had to be made. On a very limited budget and with his family helping, he wrecked out army barracks and built the now famous Big Texas Steak Ranch on I-40 East.

His wife and son were on hand to accept this honor for him, posthumously.

Emmett Allen, a Panhandle of Texas resident all of his life, opened a garage on Old Route 66 in Alanreed, Texas in 1947.

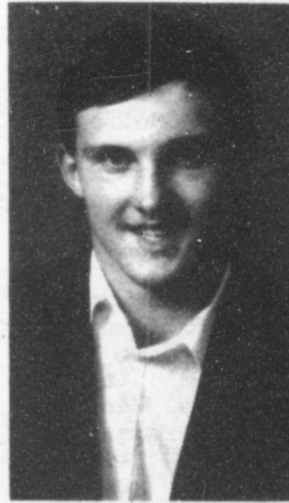

Emmett also had a western swing band, the Sunset Ramblers, that played for many years in the area, especially at Lake McClellan, a favorite Route 66 camping spot.

Jack and Bettye West have lived and worked on Route 66 all their lives. Jack was born in Clarksville, Arkansas in 1926, the year Route 66 was opened. He grew up in Erick, Oklahoma and McLean. Bettye Johnston West was born and raised in McLean. Shortly after their marriage in 1952, they moved thirty miles west on Route 66 to the farming community of Groom, Texas.

Jack worked for Wheeler-Evans Grain Company for several years before he and Bettye bought the Groom Truck Terminal, which they owned and operated from 1962 until 1982. They are still in business on Old Route 66 as owners of the Groom Car Wash.

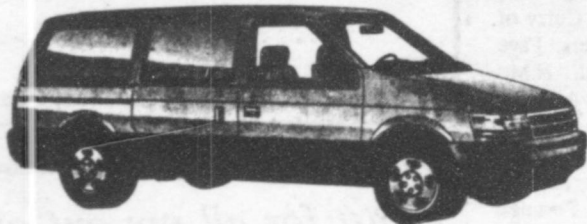
