# Paramount Pictures Considering West Groom Location For Motion Picture

Paramount Pictures Motion Picture Group of Hollywood have made their second trip to Groom in recent weeks to study the area they are interested in for shooting scenes of a movie to be released Christmas.

Bill Bowling, Location Manager for the movie, was in Groom Tuesday to discuss the movie, and areas of interest and concern to both Paramount Pictures and Groom. Bowling was interested to know if the residents of Groom were willing to accept such an undertaking in their town. The small group present, primarily city council members and GEDC members asked several

questions of Bowling and then gave their overwhelming support to the motion picture production, welcoming such an endeavor to town.

Bowling was to meet with land and property owners to discuss more specifically details directly affected by the movie. The location of interest to the producers was to be of an agricultural setting with drought conditions, preferably in the midwest. Bowling said the landscape was very important, traveling from as far south as San Antonio to as far north as North Dakota in search of the right setting.

The location under consideration for some of

the shooting is Groom's west side. Bill and Sam's Motel and across the road in Robert Kuehler's field.

The movie "Leap of Faith" will star Steve Martin as a preacher. "The movie
