Extension Service Survey Underway

Some Carson County farm and ranch producers are being surveyed by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service according to Extension Service Economist, Dr. Steve Amosson. The purpose of the survey is two-fold. First, to determine the type, number and characteristics of cropland leases in the county.

The second part of the survey concentrates on wheat pasture grazing. The purpose is to determine average rates of gain, origin of cattle, management practices, types of lease agreements among other characteristics. The information collected from the surveys will be analyzed and used in planning educational activities that will benefit farmers and ranchers in the area as well as the rest of Texas.

According to Dr. Amosson, Carson county is one of only 11 counties being surveyed. The number of producers being surveyed is limited so he encourages all producers receiving the questionnaire to respond. If a producer receives a survey and has questions, please contact the county Extension agent.

Commissioners Rejects Bids For Prec. 4 Grader

Carson County Commissioners considered, before rejecting all bids submitted for the purchase of a road-grader for Precinct 4 in a meeting conducted May 23.

The Court also approved a request by Agnes Bell, auditor to grant an order approving an exemption for road material being used in Precinct 4 in order to comply with the county purchasing act.

County Attorney Ed Hinshaw also addressed the issue of utility companies' rights concerning installation of communication lines in the county and what the county can do to protect the rights of the public.

Installation of a communication line in Precinct 4 was confirmed.

In a discussion relative to indigent health care guidelines, County Judge Jay R. Roselius told the court that two or three cases would probable need further consideration by the court as they did not meet the guidelines.

Budget requests for the next year were reviewed.

Groom High School Recognized For Outstanding Achievement

Groom High School was among more than 300 Texas schools recognized by the State Board of Education in May for outstanding student performance on the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills tests.

The Board recognized those schools where 90 percent or more of the students mastered all sections of the TEAMS tests taken during the 1986-87 school year and those which recorded gains of 30 percent or more in the

percentage of students mastering the exams.

The School will receive a certificate of achievement from the State Board of Education.

This recognition by the Board is meant to encourage and motivate all Texas elementary and secondary campuses to strive toward high achievement.

The TEAMS tests measure basic reading, writing and mathematics skills of students in all odd-numbered grades.


