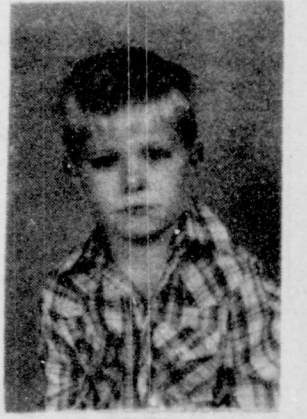
According to a news release from the college Melainie has a 4.0 grade point average, which places her on the President's List.

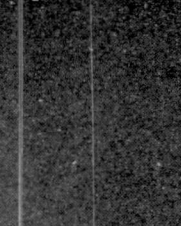

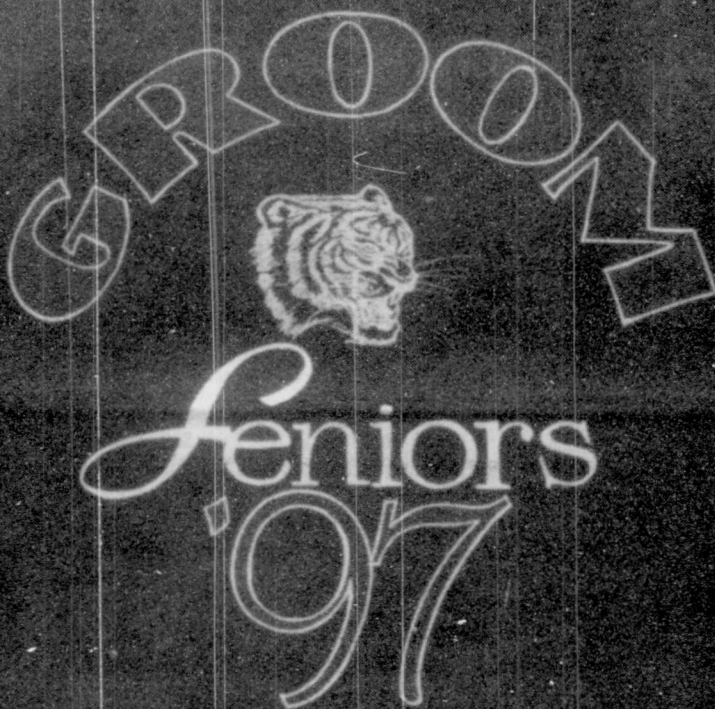

Valedictorian, Justin Randell Ritter, has had an exciting high school career that has not been without it's drawbacks.

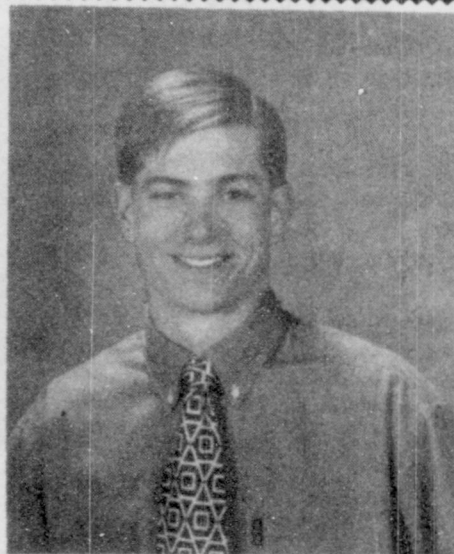
"I have learned to never give up," he stated, "I never quit trying when I was robbed of going to state 2 years in a row. But it finally paid off."
