

A. First, the words "baptism, baptize," etc. are used 106 times in the New Testament.
"Baptism" is a sound-alike word for the Greek word, "baptidzo." Accurately translated, baptidzo means "to immerse, to dip, to submerge." According to the Bible, baptism is

aptizing in Aenon near Salim, because there was much water there..." and Acts 8:38:

"And he ordered the chariot to stop: and they both went down into the water, Philip as well as the eunuch; and he baptized him." These passages indicate an abundance of water is necessary to administer baptism.

Jesus' cousin, John, was sent to prepare the way for Jesus. An essential ingredient in his ministry was baptism. Mark 1:4 says, "John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." Jesus was baptized by John to give us an example of the right thing to do. Jesus did not need forgiveness of sins since He was sinless. But, Jesus said, "Permit it at this time; for in this way it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness...," Matthew 3:15. Also, notice that Jesus was immersed. "And after being baptized, Jesus went up immediately from the water...," Matthew 3:16.
