Lesa Sweatt, daughter of Kenneth and Susan Sweatt, was recently named Lion's Club Sweetheart for 1991-92.

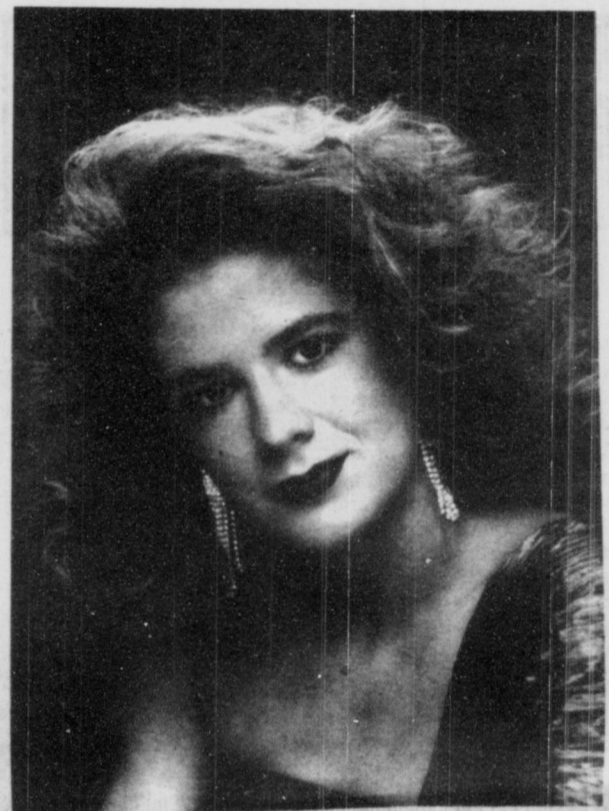

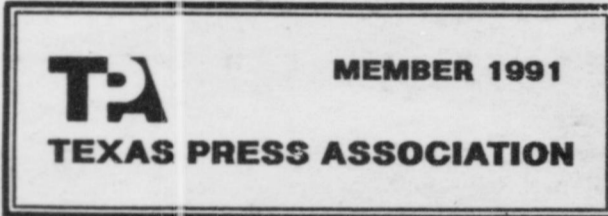

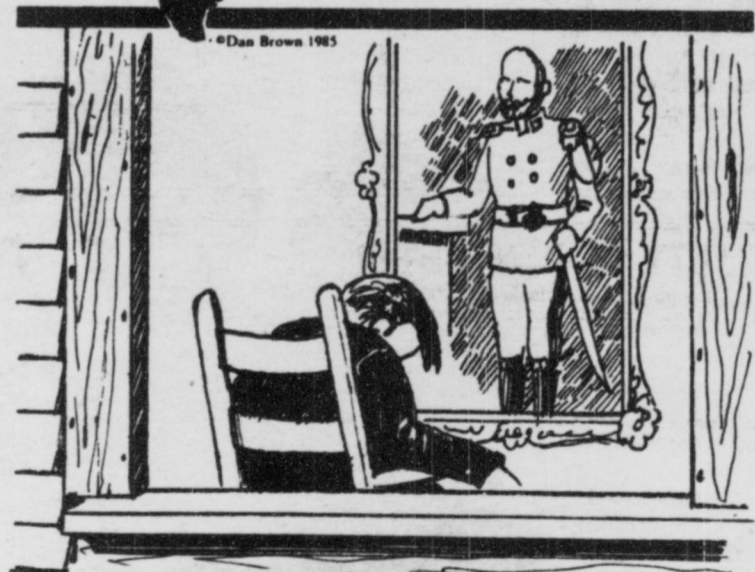

STRANGE MURDER ...

Thomas J. Chambers came to Texas in the 1820's. He settled at Anahuac and began making enemies. During the Texas Revolution he was a recruiting officer and a gun runner. After the war he was a judge and a land speculator. He was murdered in 1865 by a shot fired through a window in his home. The bullet that killed Chambers passed through his body and lodged in a full-length portrait of him.

Groom Jr. High Wins Again . . . Tigers Lose By One Point

Groom Junior High Cubs won handily over the Silverton Owls last week. With a final of 42-20.

Terry Eatmon scored a touchdown from an end around play. Harold Cave scored the other six T.D.'s bringing one in on a kick off return.

Coach Lance felt that the Cubs started off flat, allowing Silverton to score in the first three plays. "Halfway through the first quarter they really decided to play" Lance stated, "They may have been a little over confident at first having beaten Silverton before."

Junior High will face Higgins there next week on October 10th.

The Groom Tigers had a bit of bad luck Friday night losing to Cotton Center 19-20.

Coach O'Dell attributed much of their failure to a slow start in the first half of the game and an unusual amount of penalties.

Paul McLaughlin opened the scoring with a T.D. in the third quarter.

Brian Baker scored off a 10 yard run, and Kirk Webb went 6 yards for the T.D.

Bruce Britten threw to Corkey Hickey for the extra point.

75 yards in penalties were called against the Tigers. One touchdown was called back.

"Their passing game was off a little" said O'Dell.

210 yards were gained in passing plays while 239 yards were gained rushing.

Brian Baker ran down 137 of those yards.

Bruce Britten handled most of the passing duties completing 14 of 27.

Coach O'Dell said that they played very well in the second half. "All this means (talking about the loss) is that we won't finish the year undefeated."

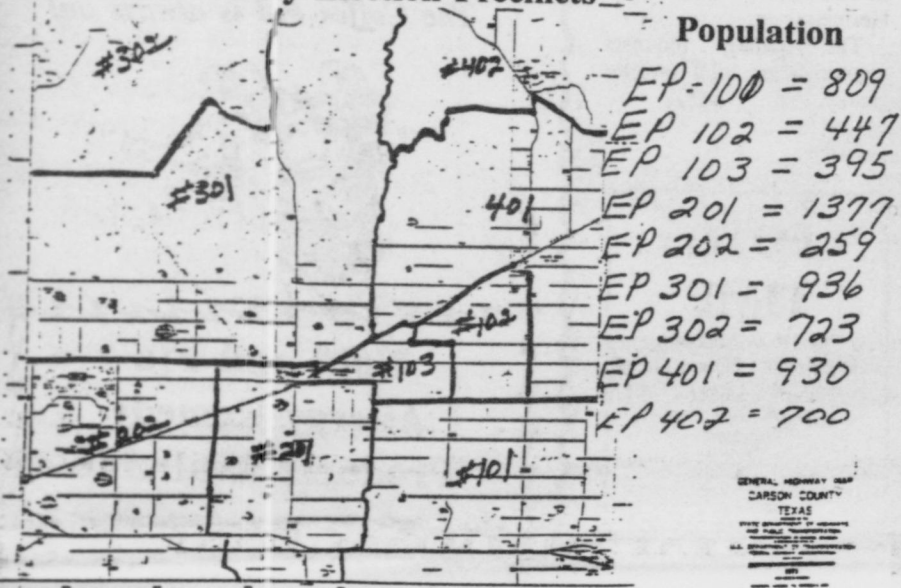

ORDER ADOPTING COUNTY ELECTION PRECINCTS

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Carson County is charged by Article 42.001 of the Texas Election code to divide the county into compact and contiguous election precincts; and

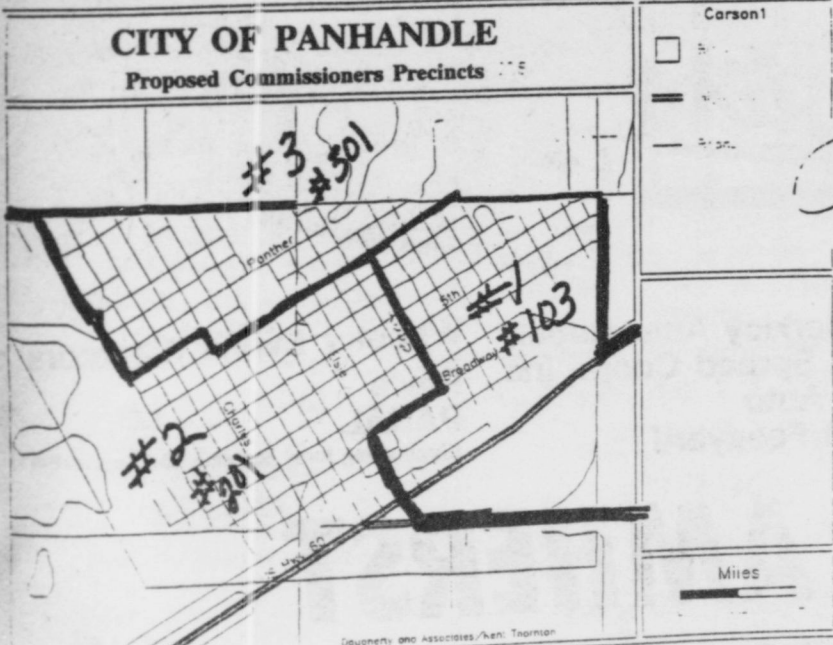
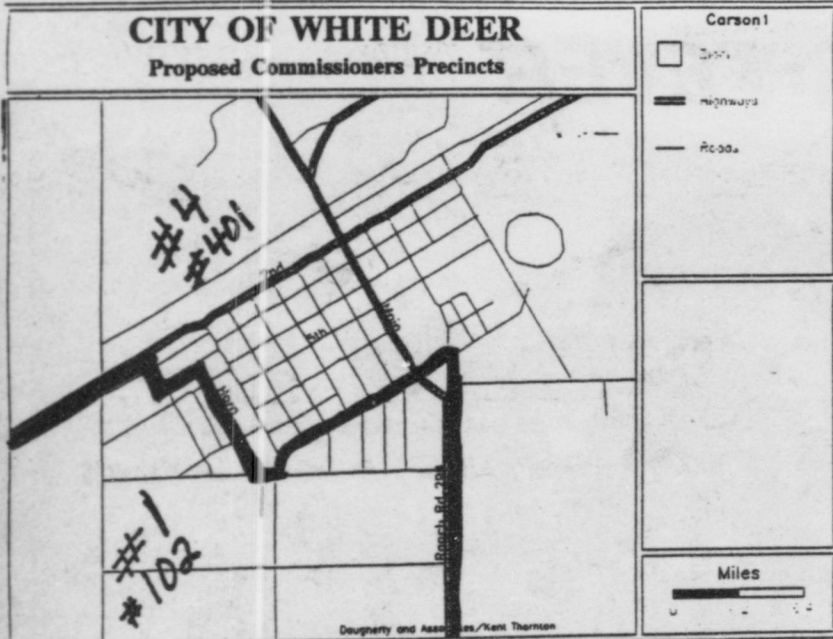
WHEREAS, it is necessary to change boundaries of County Election Precincts in Carson County to conform with new County Commissioner and Justice of the Peace Precincts; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner Court of Carson County, through a series of public hearings and meetings, has received and has considered oral and written testimony and evidence regarding the need for the alteration of certain Election Precincts.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Carson County that Carson County, Texas be divided into nine (9) County Election Precincts in accordance with Exhibit A attached to this Order, which is a description of the boundaries of each and every County Election Precinct in Carson County, Texas, and which is incorporated into and is made part of this Order.

The County Election Precincts ordered herein shall be effective January 1, 1992. BE IT SO ORDERED.

The new building at 101 S. Main Street, the corner of Railroad and Main, is designed to be cost efficient and provide energy savings.

Superintendent Adams Explains Alanreed ISD Tax Statements

Alanreed ISD mailed out the 1991 tax statements on September 25th and there may be some confusion on what and who to pay. The statements have two taxing units listed, the AISD and the CED.

Alanreed ISD is granting the discounts for payment of taxes in October, November and December. The CED is not granting any discounts.

When a taxpayer adds the two listed taxes, only the AISD tax has been discounted in Oct., Nov., and Dec.

The Alanreed ISD tax rate is .215 cents/\$100. and the CED tax rate is .755 cents/\$100. Alanreed ISD

will send in to the CED (County Education District) all of the .755 cent tax collected and the CED will return back to the AISD a portion of this tax, in fact, the total amount to be collected is about \$168,073.00 and the CED will redistribute \$82,562. to other school districts in the CED and Alanreed ISD will receive \$85,511.

To the taxpayer - the County Education District is not a county tax, it is a taxing entity created by the state for redistribution of the taxpayer dollars.

Taxpayers please do not get confused and think you are paying your county tax when you get your school

tax statements, you will get a county tax statement in addition. Alanreed ISD tax rate was not increased over 1990, only the CED creation created a great loss in exemptions from taxation, and if the taxes on the tax statement were increased over 1990, it was an increase in the value of property other than homestead portion. Property values in Alanreed ISD were increased only in very few instances. If any Alanreed ISD taxpayers

have any questions about their taxes they should feel free to contact Mr. Adams at the Alanreed School Business Office.
