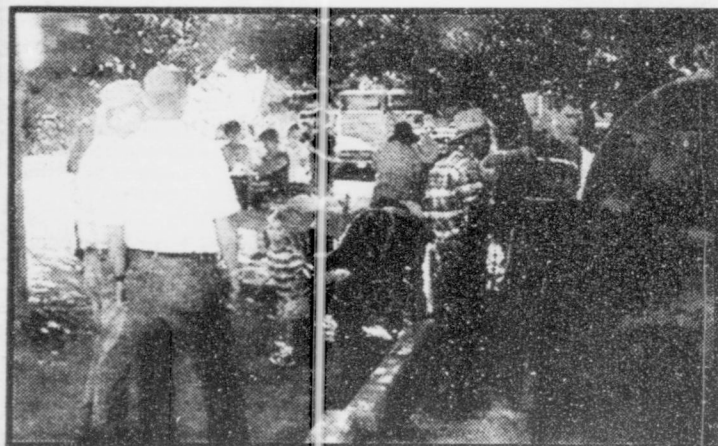

## McLean ISD Hears Report FIRST Ratings

The McLean Independent School Board of Education met for a regular meeting at 7 PM on September 18, 2006. Board members present were David Fuller, Joe Riley, Randy Eddleman, Carey Richardson and Toni Bohlar. Also present were Superintendent Jimmy Hannon, Leslie Darsy, Dick Crockett and Rhonda Patterson. Chet Bohlar and Terri Adams were absent from the meeting.

All votes are unanimous unless otherwise stated.

Joe Riley called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM, and Carey Richardson gave the opening prayer. There were no visitors present.

Motion by Toni Bohlar, seconded by David Fuller to approve the Regular meeting minutes of August 21, 2006. Motion carried.

Motion by Carey Richardson, seconded by Randy Eddleman to approve Special Meeting minutes of August 25, 2006. Motion carried.

Motion by Toni Bohlar, seconded by Randy

Eddleman to approve the monthly financial reports for August and to sign the corresponding checks. Motion carried.

Mr. Hannon discussed the items on the Superintendent Report, beginning with the Superior Achievement First (Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas). The criteria are based on the 2004-2005 school year information, and there were 21 questions or indicators used to determine the district

status. All the indicators were answered with a "YES" with the following exception: Was the Total Fund Balance more than 50 % and less than 150 % of the optimum according to calculation worksheet in the annual financial report? According to the state, the fund balance for McLean ISD should be between \$100,000 AND \$300,000. Therefore with the fund balance being \$1,352,772 and well over the optimum range, the district failed to meet the requirements of indicator

18. Because state funding and the Chapter 41 status are so uncertain, the District had excess fund balance in order to sustain the life of a small school.

Mr Hannon discussed the facilities overview as presented by Grimes & Associates. They had gone through all the school buildings in August and written their observations that could be used to

upgrade the facilities. In order to make the High School building more energy efficient, they suggested double pane windows, upgrading the HVAC equipment, and adding insulation. Other improvements would be to add accessibility, fire alarm systems and repair loose mortar and bricks. The old gym is in need of

repair and Admin/Computer/Science building could use a few upgrades, as well as, the Elementary building. The storage building and bus barn need to be replaced. These aged buildings take away from the attractiveness of the campus. The football facilities are also in need of improvements. Grimes & Associates suggested to combine HS and JR High by adding two classrooms to the High School Building. The Board is to prioritize the desired improvements, and after these needs are identified then a budget will have to be established, and the construction or improvement process will begin. The general consensus of the Board was for Mr. Hannon to contact another firm, in order to get a second opinion. They were particularly concerned about implementing a fire alarm system, and making all the facilities accessible.

In other business, Randy Eddleman inquired as to what had been done with the band instruments. Mr. Hannon had spoke with Ms. Hill to see what she would be needing for the music department. The question was also raised as to how the new Math teacher was doing. Mr.

Hannon and Mrs. Patterson have been checking with him daily, and all is going well.

Motion by Toni Bohlar, second by Randy Eddleman to adopt a tax rate of \$1.37/100 valuation for the 2006-2007 school year as recommended by Mr. Hannon. Motion carried.

Motion by David Fuller, second by Randy Eddleman to increase the Superintendent salary to \$67,500 annually, effective as of September 1, 2006. Motion carried.

Mr. Hannon recommended that the Board accept the request for a maximum class-size waiver and the necessary plan of action. The second grade was over the limit of 22/1 student-teacher ratio. As a result of this unanticipated growth, there was no other option other than to request the waiver. Mr. Crockett stated that every classroom is already being used, and there is not another certified teacher so adding another 2<sup>nd</sup> grade is not an option. On September 6<sup>th</sup> the number of students was over the maximum, and the number has been fluctuating, but the decision was made to go ahead and submit for the waiver, with a motion by Toni Bohlar, second by David Fuller. Motion

carried.

Motion by David Fuller, second by Randy Eddleman to approve the following student transfers for 2006-2007: Tanner Cadre, Nathan Macina, Ashley Byron, Ashley Medlock, Lucas Webb, Josh Watson, Haley Macina, Samantha Long, Autumn Byron, Ryan Medlock, Kayla Lewis, Laura Brooks, Charlie Webb, Shiner Webb, and Jacob Watson.

Motion by Toni Bohlar, second by Carey Richardson to accept a bid from Mark Cadra for the weed sprayer in the amount of \$225.00. Motion carried.

Motion by David Fuller, second by Toni Bohlar to adjourn the meeting at 8:00 PM. Motion carried.

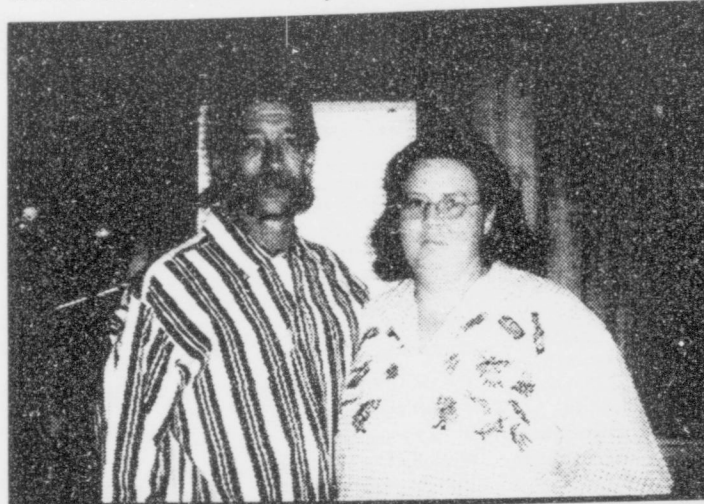

Twenty nine members and guests attended the meeting. The next luncheon will be on Oct 3.

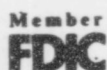

# McLean Tigers and Cubs Sink Pirates

The McLean Tigers erupted for 37 points in the second half to put away the Lefors Pirates, 70-32.

The Tigers were up 33-24 at the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> half, but Lefors had momentum scoring the last touchdown.

A 16 yard touchdown pass from Brent Robertson to Dustin Forsyth in the opening drive of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter put Lefors within a

point of McLean, 33-32. But that would be the last points scored for Lefors as McLean's defense stiffened.

The Tigers scored the next 37 points, improving their record to 3-1 for the season.

Zach Richardson added three touchdowns with runs of 11 yards, 1 yard, and scored with a 31 yard pass to Jayme Welch.

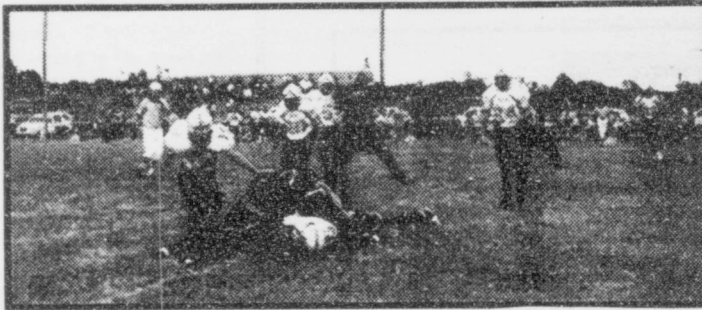

## Tigers Hold Off Miami In 4<sup>th</sup> Qtr.

The Groom Tigers had a lapse of memory in Friday night's 4<sup>th</sup> quarter against Miami Warriors as the Tigers took a 30 point lead into the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter and crawled out with a 43-37 victory. Miami had a four touchdown rally in the fourth quarter, missing all of their PAT's.

Again, the passing and running of Thane Barkley

proved too much for the Warriors as Barkley started the scoring for Groom when he ran 35 yards for the touchdown. Chas Leven's PAT kick was good. Barkley hit Blaine Britten on a 29 yard pass before Miami could score their first TD to put Groom ahead by two touchdowns.

Chad Barkley helped in the scoring to scamper 5

yards TD run, PAT kick failed.

T.J. Moraniec scored the next two touchdowns by catching a 9 yard pass and a 21 yard pass, both from Quarterback Thane Barkley. The first of the two PATs failed but Groom decided to run for the second PAT and Chas Leven caught a pass from Moraniec to make the PAT

good.

Groom Tigers were able to pressure Miami on the goal line to get a safety before Kade Brown caught a 9 yard TD pass from Thane Barkley to finish out the third quarter.

Then the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter began with the Warriors scoring four times in the fourth quarter getting

## County Accepts Legal Resolution

All Carson County Commissioners were present along with presiding County Judge Lewis Powers for their regular meeting date of September 25, 2006; Mike Britten, Precinct 1, Kenneth Ware, Precinct 2, Jerry Strawn, Precinct 3 and Kevin Howell, Precinct 4 were present.

Treasurer Jeannie Cunningham asked the court to consider the approval of two additional claims totaling \$1005.00. The court approved the payments. The claims were for the Treasurer's

conference in Beaumont for a week.

Local Government Code 81.005. Terms of Court Minutes were approved for the commissioner's court to meet during the next fiscal year of the second and fourth Mondays of each month at 10:00 a.m. in the Courthouse's Courtroom. This is no change from previous years. This item is routine, annual decision to be made by the court for setting dates of regular commissioner's court hearing dates.

The Indigent Defense Grant Resolution was

approved by the Commissioners. The resolution is required passage to be eligible to receive grant funding for mandatory court appointed lawyers for indigent county people. Carson County receives \$8,000.00. They must qualify for indigent status to be able to have a court appointed lawyer to represent their case. It is mandated by the state of Texas to supply the monies to the individuals.

There were no line item transfers for the court to consider at this meeting.

The property located in

Panhandle designated as Lots 7-12 Block 19 all Block 20, Youngs was considered and motion made and approved not to sell this property. Precinct 3 county barn property lays next to it causing the commissioner's court's decision not to sell the property.

The right of way and utility cost estimate for the overpass construction at FM 2373 and HWY 60 was discussed but no action was taken at this time. The overpass would cost the county 10% of the cost to

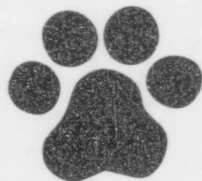

# Groom Cubs Battle Miami To 25-0



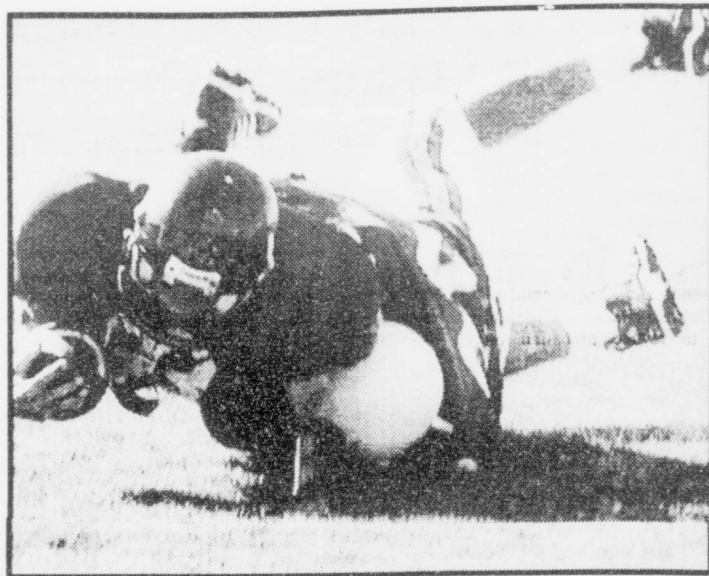

pay for the easement of right of ways and the moving of utilities. A year ago, the cost was \$260,000.00 but today the cost is \$1.46 million. Now, for the county's responsibility of paying their 10% or \$26,000.00 more, it will cost the county \$120,000.00 more on the amount of \$146,000.00. Judge Powers said, "The commissioner's court and himself have worked very hard and officials from PANTEX have agreed to pay for the county's 10% or \$146,000.00."

John Kiehl of the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission spoke to the court in support of a resolution for Carson County Hazard Mitigation Action Plan. In case of a disaster to Carson County, tornadoes, floods

etc. that would require FEMA assistance this would make the county qualify for assistance once the commissioner's court approves the plan thus making the county in compliance.

The Animal Disaster Plan was presented to the court by Brenda Vermillion. The plan approved was a designated number of county people willing and able to take care of animals large and small during a disaster. Shelters are scattered throughout the county.

There was no action taken on an outside audit report because it was not ready to present to the court first.

The court approved Sheriff Terry's jail standard inspection report. Judge said, "The report explained the jail was in good condition, was good and clean." He further stated that meals had to be approved by a licensed dietician and safety plans must be better documented concerning jail records that are kept.

Also, Sheriff Terry spoke to the court on the Sheriff's Department fees. Motion was made to keep the fees the same as Sheriff Terry recommended the same as last years.

The next meeting date will be at 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, October 10, 2006 because county officials will observe Monday as Columbus and be closed.

The public should attend the meeting if at all possible to see how your local county government operates and where and how your tax money is being spent.
