## Felon Dies After Car Chase Ends In Crash On I-40

Marvin Miller, 36, of Wolcott, Indiana died Saturday after he attempted to flee from D.P.S. troopers during a routine traffic stop.

The wild chase began at the 112 mile marker on I-40 and continued eastbound, ending near the 131 mile marker. Groom DPS Trooper Jeremy Wallace attempted to stop the man after observing that he was not wearing his seatbelt in violation of Texas law. The driver ignored Trooper Wallace's emergency lights and began speeding away when the siren on the patrol car sounded. With moderate to heavy traffic the Indiana man, who was later found to be wanted on aggravated drug possession charges, continued to bob and weave through traffic and in the process nearly hit several vehicles. Drivers along I-40 were forced to take evasive action to avoid an accident.

When the driver left the highway for the service road, Trooper Oscar Esqueda of Borger,

who was riding with Trooper Jeremy Wallace, shot out the left rear tire of the 1989 Plymouth mini-van. The vehicle continued until Trooper Esqueda shot out the right rear tire. Truckers set up voluntary road blocks by driving side by side down I-40. The fleeing man passed them in the bar ditch and continued to refuse to stop.

Troopers from McLean Chad S. Estes and Grant Hickman were contacted on the radio and set up stinger spikes across the interstate. After the man ran over the spikes, he lost control and ran head on into a parked semi-truck.

Miller was killed in the crash. The truck driver was air lifted to Northwest Texas Hospital for treatment.

Trooper Wallace has had a very busy week, finding over a pound of cocaine and methamphetamines in the battery case of a Hispanic man only last week.

Alberto will compete at 11:10 on Saturday at the Old Settler's Park in Round Rock, Texas.

## GISD Receives "Recognized" After AEIS Report

Groom ISD was recently mailed its Academic Excellence Indicator System (AEIS) report from TEA. The data in the report is used to give each school in the state of Texas a "report card." The data is compiled from the results of the TAAS test as well as, attendance rates, dropout rates, and a college admission table. Based on the above data, Groom has a school district rating of "Recognized." An Exemplary rating is 90-100 and the Recognized level is 70-89.

Groom students attended school at a rate of 97.8%, and reported a "dropout" rate of 0.8% in grades 7-12 in the '94-95 school year. The TAAS results for all students in grades 3-8 & 10 were: 94.4% in reading, 92.1% in mathematics, and 94.9% in writing. However, when the scores are broken down into all the sub groups, one group

"economically disadvantaged" scored 87.1% in mathematics. That was the lowest score made by a group of Groom students. But our campus report card can be no higher than the lowest sub-group.

"I am very proud of the hard work and dedication of our students and teachers. Their efforts are a reflection of the high standards set by our community. We will continue to make every effort possible to become an exemplary district," said superintendent, Ben Ingham.

A complete copy of the report is available to the public at the school offices, the Groom Branch Library (next to city hall), and at the offices of The Groom/McLean News. The report will be approved at the December school board meeting. The meeting is open to the public, and all interested persons are invited to attend.

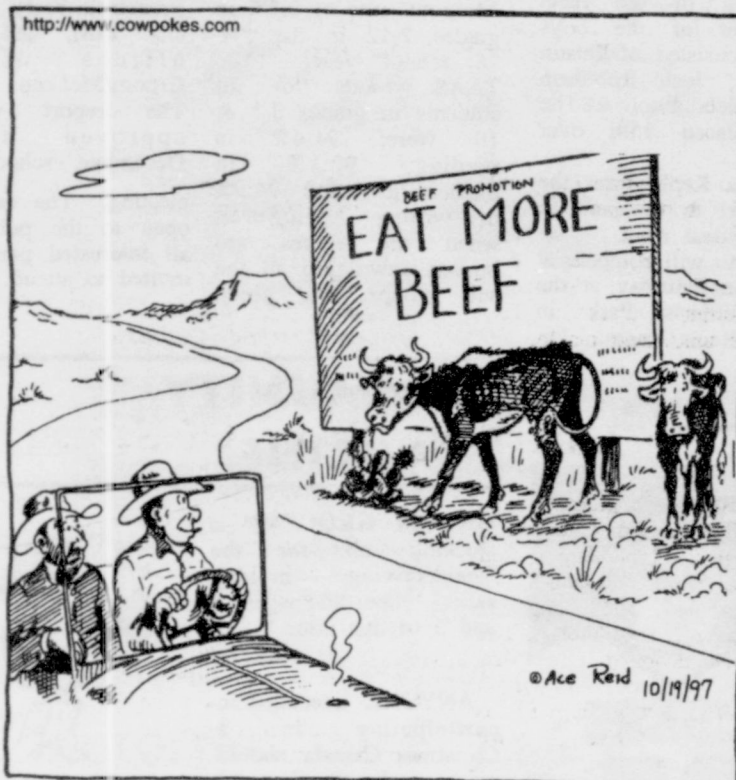

## Tigers Lose To Follett

Football 1997 came to an end for the Tigers last Friday night as they ended their season against Follett. While the game was technically a loss, Coach Larry Reid felt like this was one of the best games they had played.

"I am so proud of this

team," he said. "We had a game plan to keep the ball away from them as much as possible. With a couple of exceptions the boys followed the plan to the letter. I think that shows great maturity and concentration on the part of the Tigers. While

defensively we had some difficulty with their spread offense, our offense had their best rushing night of the year. Evan Crowell, Michael Stephens and Wyatt Weinheimer did a great job on the offensive line."

Follett is ranked as one of the top five teams in the state. The fact that the Tigers were only two touchdowns behind speaks highly of Groom's game plan and skills.

Toby Burgin had all of his leadership skills on display, rushing 213 yards on 21 carries and one touchdown. He also received two passes for 11 yards and had 7 unassisted tackles.

Dean Fields also had a great night with 18 attempts for 90 yards and one touchdown and had 3 unassisted tackles.

Wade Ritter carried the ball 14 times for 46 yards and one touchdown. He also carried two kickoff returns for 32 yards.

Josh Evenson threw the ball 8 times completing 5 for 47 yards and one touchdown. He kicked two punts averaging 26.5 yards. Evenson succeeded in kicking extra points twice. He had 3 unassisted tackles.

Evan Crowell caught two passes for 33 yards and one touchdown. He had 3 unassisted tackles.

Wyatt Weinheimer carried the ball once for 3 yards. He had one quarterback sack and 4 unassisted tackles.

Chris Ollinger returned a kick-off for 16 yards and had one fumble recovery. He also had one quarterback sack and 5 unassisted tackles.

Jimmy Chavedo had one unassisted tackle.

As a team Groom earned 14 first downs to Follett's 9. The Tigers carried the ball 53 times for 349 yards. The Panthers had only 20 opportunities with 350 yards.

Groom connected on 5 of 8 attempts for 47 yards and one touchdown. Follett completed only about half of their 9 attempts for 49 yards and one touchdown.

The final score was Tigers 28 and Panthers 48.

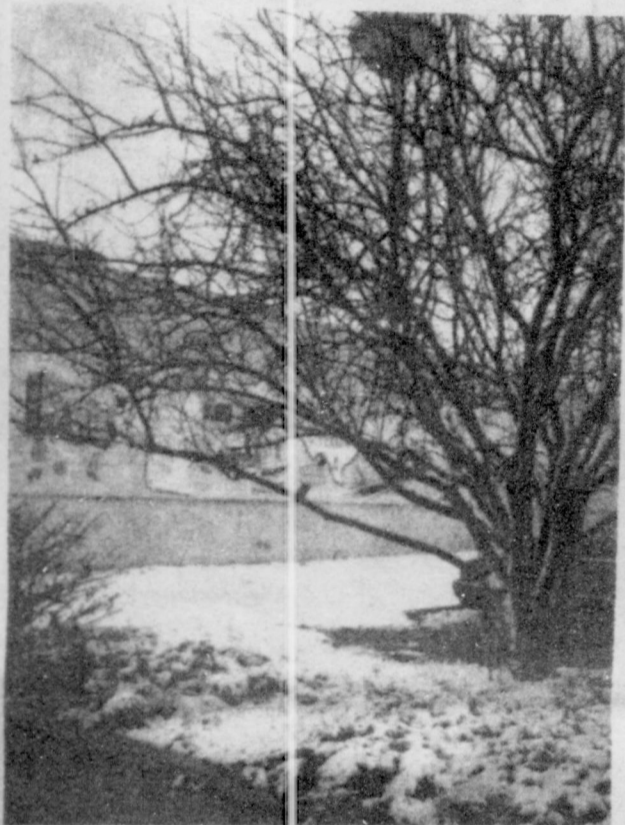



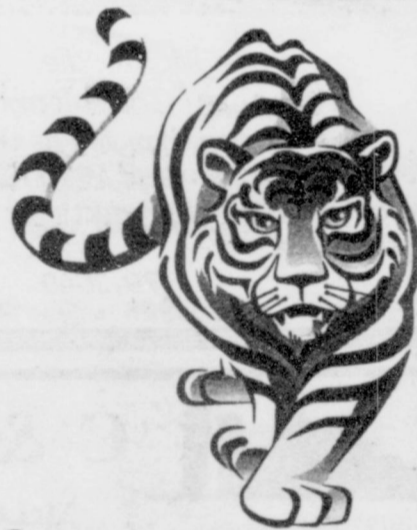
