Glynn D Harrell received the Conservation Farmer Award from Bobby Pool, director of the McClellan Creek SWCD. Glynn farms 1866 acres of dryland near Groom and Conway. He has carried out Great Plains Conservation Program contracts and has constructed over 95,000 feet

of terraces. This year, he is re-building 16,000 feet of terraces. Glynn also practices good crop residue management of his land. Glynn has been a cooperater with the District since 1954. The award was presented at the annual Soil Stewardship banquet held recently in Panhandle.

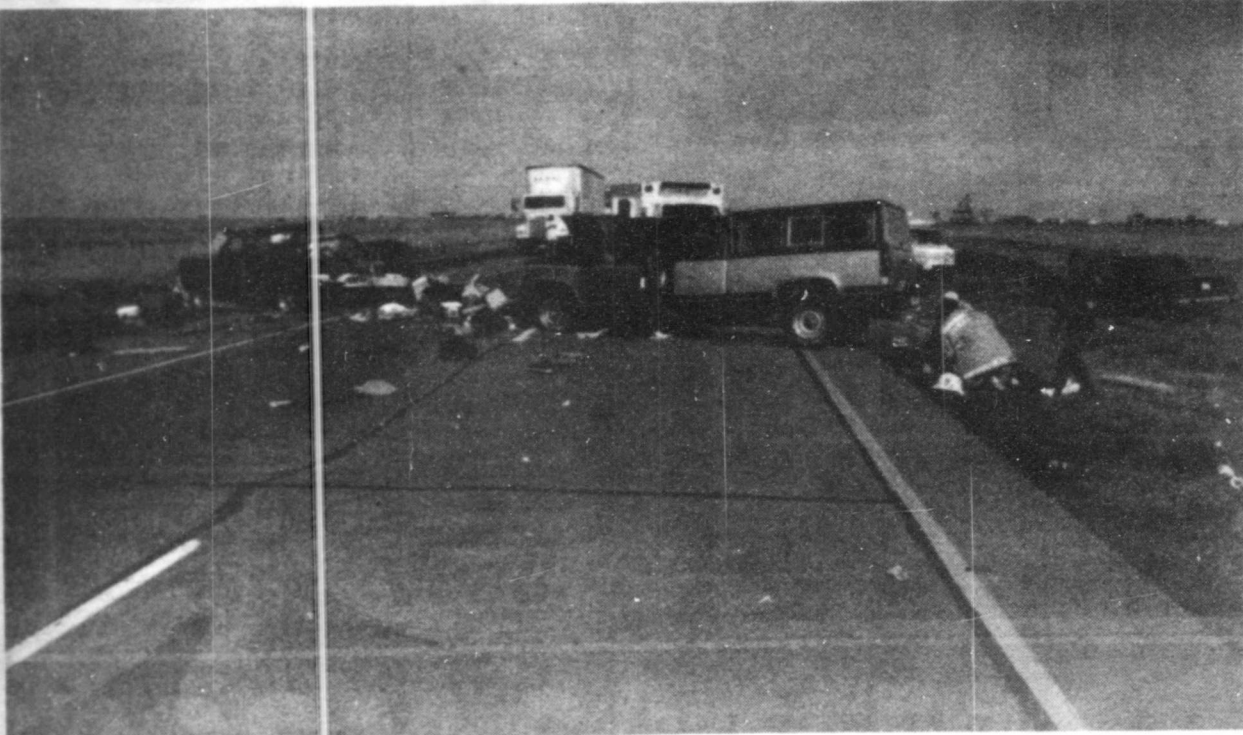

Later that evening a Oklahoma Youth was arrested on IH-40, four miles West of Groom for Minor In Consumption Of Alcoholic Beverages. The youth was released at the scene and instructed to contact Judge Hinson. On Thursday, April 22nd



a Illinois man driving a truck-tractor semi-trailer fell asleep at the wheel and traveled .3 of a mile from the North barditch to the middle median, before coming to final rest. We had persons booked into the Carson County Jail for the following charges this past week: 1-Burglary (Carson County Warrant), 1-Burglary (Gray County Warrant), 1-Criminal Trespass (Galveston Warrant), 1-DPS Warrants, 1-Simple Assault, 1-Theft Over \$750 and 1-DWI Committal.

Our deputies have remained quite busy with disturbance calls and reports of gunshots and suspicious persons. We responded to a report of a subject who had been taking PCP and other drugs and who had been making threats towards his family. The call came in from the west county line and the subject was located just inside Potter County. The subject was arrested for being in possession of drugs and for assaulting officers who were attempting to make the arrest.

Deputies assisted area fire fighters with several grass fires and a structure fire. We all need to remember that it doesn't take much to start a fire in this dry weather, but it takes a great deal of manpower and time to put it out when it goes out of control.

Our department also assisted the Department of Public Safety/Highway Patrol at the scenes of various traffic accidents in Carson County. In one accident, on April 22, two persons were transported to Amarillo Emergency Receiving Center for injuries and one person from Missouri was pronounced dead at the scene. Our department and

the Texas Highway Patrol recovered in excess of \$2,000 in cash and numerous weapons and other valuable items from the wreckage for return to the accident victims.

Our department is continuing to investigate reports of obscene telephone calls in the Fritch area and we have received new reports regarding Aggravated Sexual Assault of a Child and another case of Indecency with a Child.


The Carson County Sheriff's Department is investigating a business burglary which occurred in Skellytown and an attempted burglary which was reported at the White Deer School. The Sheriff's Department is also investigating two separate incidents of threats of violence (one by an adult and one by a juvenile).

Deputies are currently investigating two separate incidents of weapons being fired at buildings. One incident involved a fuel tank which was shot at outside of Panhandle and the other was a rural residential structure north of Panhandle.

We have logged over 334 incident/offense reports from the first of the year to date. This is nearly an 80% increase in reporting activity from the previous year.

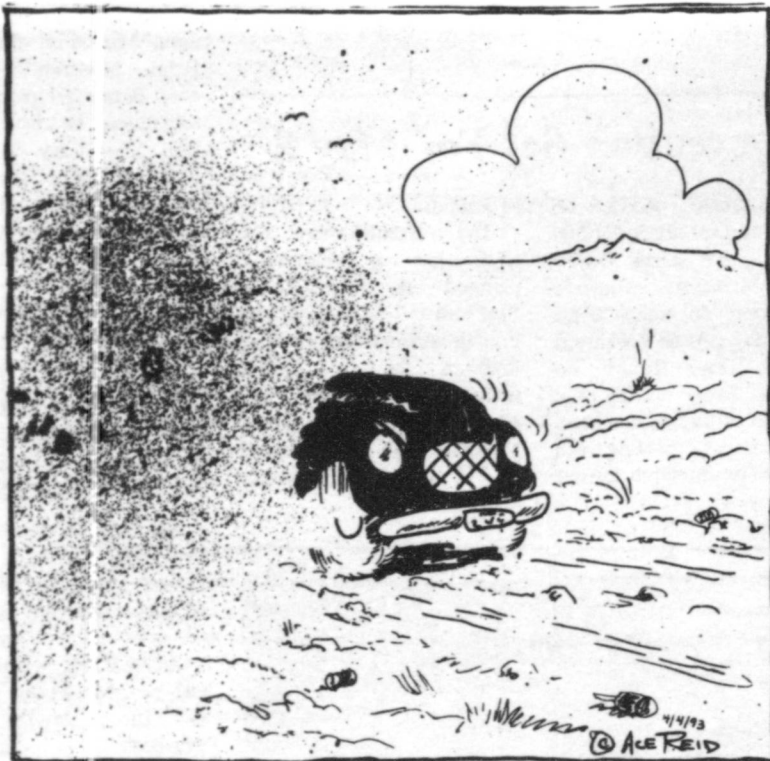

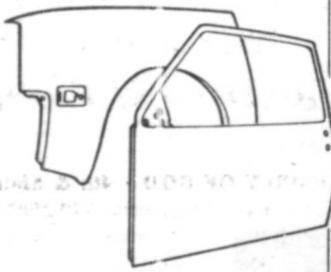

## Task Force Works To Link Immunization Data

The Carson, Armstrong, Gray, Donley County "All Kids Count" immunization initiative task force, or Task Force 6, held its first meeting April 15 in Groom.
