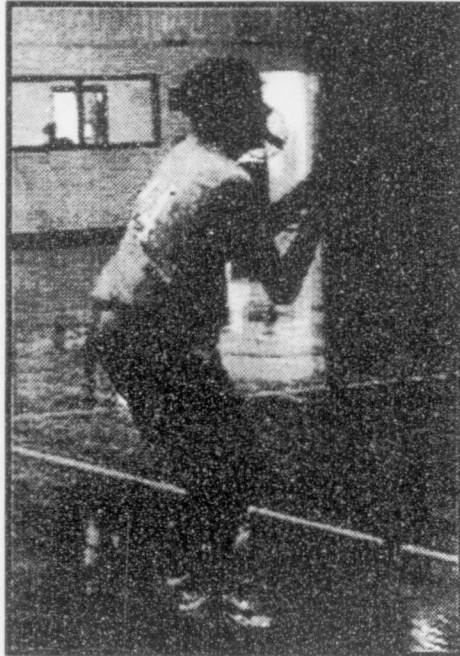

County Precinct 1 To Purchase New Tractor

The Carson County Commissioners Court met on February 27 with the following members present: Judge Lewis Powers, Commissioners Mike Britten, Kenneth Ware, Jerry Strawn, and Kevin Howell. Minutes from the February 13, 2006 meeting were read and approved. Claims were reviewed and paid.

Mike Britten, commissioner Precinct 1 asked the court to authorize him to sign the contract and a note with the State National Bank of Groom to finance a tractor. The motion was approved. He also reported that he sold a tractor for \$35,236.00 and asked the Court to put the

money back in his budget to be used for the down payment on the new tractor purchased. This motion was also approved.

The Court discussed a land purchase to aid in closing a railroad crossing. Judge Powers asked the Court to authorize him to sign a contract with the second party. The motion carried.

John Paul Dauer, Mark McKierman, John Wimberly and Bill Gray were in court representing the McClellan Creek Soil and Water Conservation District. Mr. Wimberly presented the court with the District's annual report. John Paul Dauer thanked the court for past

and present support. Their report was approved.

Justice of the Peace Precinct 1, Bill Hinson addressed the Court and asked that both of his employees be changed to full time/part time with one waiving insurance benefit and to set both hourly rates at \$9.51 per hour. The motion passed with one vote against with motion from Commissioner Howell.

Sheriff Terry asked the Court to approve his re-hiring Olivia Gonzales effective March 15, 2006 at the salary of \$22,280.76 (25D). The motion was approved. The Sheriff also asked the court to approve his appointment of Chad Johnson as a

reserve deputy. The request was approved. He also presented a report on Racial Profiling. He commented that there had been no complaints in 2005.

Celeste Bichsel, County and District Clerk presented the Court with a letter that she received from the Department of Justice in response to the County's Pre-clearance Report regarding changes in polling places and use of a new voting system.

Bichsel asked the court to allow her and Judge Powers to sign contracts between the county, school districts and cities to lease voting machines so they will be in compliance with the Help

Local election results as of press-time showed David Swinford maintaining a constant lead over challenger Annette Carlisle for state representative in the Republican Party. The winner of this race will take the seat due to no Democratic challengers. The district includes Carson, Sherman, and Amarillo part of Potter County. Swinford is known for his ag leadership in Austin.

As of Carson County Treasurer's race, Virgil Frick (305), outgained the other 3 candidates Denise Salzbrenner (274), Leasha Hobbs (186), and Veronica Willburn (120). Frick or Salzbrenner will face Democratic candidate Dea Schroeder in November's general election after their April 11 run-off.



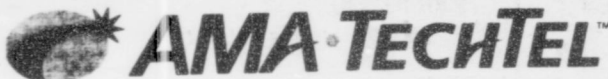

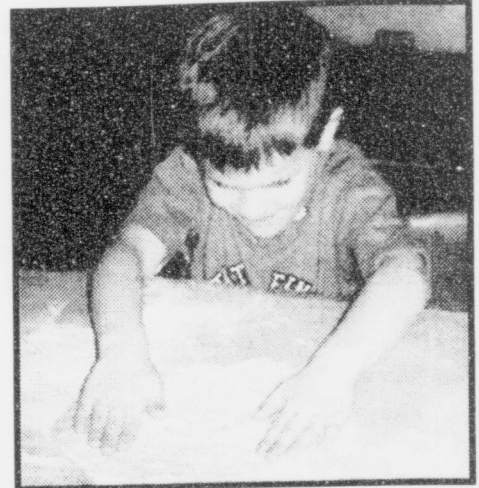
Groom Boy Scouts Enjoy Indoor Camp-Out At Community Center

Ballots Needing Filled By Mon., March 13 For Election

"PRODUCTIVITY APPRAISAL" MAY LOWER THE PROPERTY TAXES ON YOUR FARM OR RANCH LAND

Texas law allows farmers and ranchers to pay property taxes based upon the "production value" of their land rather than on market value. This "productivity value" means qualified land is taxed based on its ability to produce crops and livestock - not its value on the real estate market. And it can mean substantial property tax savings.

WHEN IS THE APPLICATION DEADLINE? If your land has never had a productivity appraisal or you are a new owner, you must apply to the Carson County Appraisal District by April 30 to take advantage of this benefit on your 2006 property taxes. You may get up to 60 extra days if you have a good reason and ask for it by April 30. If you miss this deadline, you may still be able to apply, but you will pay a penalty.

DO YOU NEED TO REAPPLY ANNUALLY? If your land already receives agricultural productivity appraisal, you normally don't need to reapply unless the chief appraiser requires you to do so. If a new application is required, the appraisal district will notify you by mail.

47th Annual Sausage Supper To Be Held

Saint Francis parishioners are making preparations for their 47th Annual Sausage Dinner on Sunday, March 12, according to Bernice and Danny Detten, Sausage Dinner chairmen.

The Sausage Dinner has undergone an evolution over the past 47 years, as has Saint Francis Church. Sausage dinners began in the 1930s as a way for the parish to raise funds to keep the little community church afloat during the depression and dust bowl years.

In 1959, the ladies of the parish rejuvenated the

idea of a Saint Francis Sausage Dinner. The sausage was served as patties, but was not well received and the idea of serving link sausage was born.

Throughout the 1960s, parishioners gathered at neighboring farms to process their home-raised hogs into sausage for the dinner. Three hogs were butchered that first year, but as the popularity of the dinner increased into the 1970s, the parish found itself unable to accommodate the demand.

In 1972, the parish hired a meat processor to make

the sausage using the "secret recipe". The late John and Theresa Leven of Saint Francis originated the sausage-seasoning recipe. That recipe is still used today, with only a few parishioners knowing the correct combined ingredients. Eades' Custom Meats of Amarillo is responsible for the processing and making of the 3,500 pounds of sausage which will be cooked and served during the March 12th dinner.

The menu consists of traditional or smoked German sausage, fresh

mashed potatoes and gravy, green beans, sauerkraut, homemade bread and peach cobbler. Tickets will be sold at the door. Adults tickets are \$8, children \$4 with ages 6 and under eating free. Take-out dinners are also available for \$8 each.

The Country Store, hosted by the Saint Francis Christian Mother's organization is also a big draw during the dinner. The Country Store always promises the very best in homemade goods with many parish women baking as many as 100 loaves of homemade bread

as well as cookies, cakes, pies and other palatable delights. Handcrafted items can also be found within the boundaries of the Country Store.

A silent auction will also be held during the dinner. Several items have been donated for auction and will be on display with bidding taking place throughout the day.

"We hope everyone will

come out and join us again this year. If you have never attended the dinner, come on out and enjoy the wonderful food and fellowship at Saint Francis," said Detten.

PROTECT YOUR RIGHTS!
"RENDER" YOUR TAXABLE PROPERTY BY APRIL 15TH.

State law now requires the filing of a rendition declaring types of business personal property you owned or controlled on January 1 of this year. Failure to file will result in a 10% penalty. If a fraudulent rendition is filed, a 50% penalty is mandated. The rendition form is available at the Carson County Appraisal District.

WHO MUST FILE A RENDITION? You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income — such as the inventory and equipment used by a business.

ARE THERE ANY ADVANTAGES TO YOU? Yes, the advantages of filing a rendition are:

- You give your opinion of your property's value. If the appraisal district believes the value is higher, it must notify you in writing of the higher value and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.
- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges for late payments.
- You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify the appraisal district of significant depreciation of the value of your property in 2005. The district will look at your property before assigning a value in 2006.

WHAT'S THE DEADLINE? The last day for filing 2006 renditions is April 15. Call the appraisal district for the last date the rendition may be postmarked, if mailing. You can get an extra 15 days if you ask for it in writing by the April 15 deadline.
