Q. What Does The Bible Say About Baptism? (Part 3, What Does Baptism Do?)
A. 1 Peter 3:21 reads: "And corresponding to that, baptism now saves you -- hot the removal of dirt from the flesh, but an appeal to God for a good conscience through the resurrection of Jesus Christ,"
1 Corinthians 12:13: "For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.
Galatians 3:27: "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ."
Colossians 2:12: "having been buried with Him in baptism, in which you were also raised up with Him through faith in the working of God, who raised Him from the dead."
Acts 2:38: "And Peter said to them, "Repent, and let each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
Many other passages speak of baptism but let's summarize these. Baptism saves you, along with your faith, confession and repentance. In baptism, the believer receives the forgiveness of sins and is added into the body of Christ. It is important to notice that baptism is a work of God and not of man! Baptism is an activity of faithful obedience since Jesus told His disciples to baptize in His name (Matthew 28:18-20). Recall from previous articles that the Bible teaches that baptism is by immersion in water and that in baptism we contact the death of Jesus. The Bible teaches that baptism is essential to faithful obedience
and is necessary for forgiveness of sins and salvation.
