## Latinos Insert Political Messages into Heritage Month Celebration

Hispanic Heritage Month 2003 will pro vide new national exposure for the expanding U.S. Latino population. At the same time, its activist leadership plans to use the occasion to educate Latinos and the broade community alike about gnawing political and social concerns.
Thousands of local and regional events affirming Latinos' cultural roots and contributions are on tap for the celebration, which runs from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15. Many -- from a festival in Huntsville, Ala., and library displays in Dodge City, Kan., to a Mexico-style rodeo and music festival in Birmingham, Ala. are happening in relatively new surroundings.
In Washington, D.C., and some other metropolitan enclave he fiesta atmosphere will provide a backdrop as Latino leader and advocacy groups stage events to mobilize their constituen cies to vote and confront civil rights, employment and educa-
onal obstacles.
The Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute will stage its 2003 Issues Conference from Sept. 22-23 in Washington, D.C More than 650 Hispanic elected officials, policy experts and community leaders will assemble to present and debate Latino gress and White House.
"It's an opportunity to be part of the formulation process of policy-making," CHCI President Ingrid Durán says. She expects attendance at its 13 summit sessions to increase from last year's 750 to more than 900 . The conference will add summits on Corporate America and Banking and Finance,

Cowboys' murky abind Cowboys' murky quarterback ter's strong performance in the $34-6$ victory against the Texans impacts the decision, what we have learned is that coach Bill Parcells is just as hard on his team in victory as in defeat. like a different team in dismantling the Texans than they did a week earlier in a most distressing and disappointing loss to the Arizona Cardinals in the preseason opener. In addition to Carter's 140 down performance, the running game came to life with 141 yards on 28 carries, including eight for 38 by starting Troy Hambrick.
The Cowboys got big plays ceptions of 30 and 60 yards from receivers Antonio Bryant and Randal Williams respec tively and an 83 -yard punt return touchdown from rookie Zuriel Smith to contribute to the team's highest point total preseason, in three years. The defense stopped the Te ans cold, holding them to 3 . two for 14 on third downs and
limiting them to two field goals.

Cowboys through an intense week of practices and expected a better performance, wasn't pleased overall, harping on his team's eight pe
lost fumbles.
"It's just a start, something to build on," Parcells said. "It's a little encouraging for me. But I want a smart team and a smart team doesn't get eight penalties and turn the
ball over twice do that."
According to several players,
he lambasted the team in postgame locker room following the game over the penalties and turnovers.
Curiously in the wake of Curiously, in the wake of the team's meltdown to the Cardi-
nals a week earlier, Parcells downplayed the impact of five penalties for 39 yards. Yet, eight for 51 against the Texans were cause for an eruption in an oth
Certainly, defensive tackle Daleroy Stewart was the source of much of Parcells' frustration. He was one of the players Parcells wanted to focus on during the game only to be
yanked off the field following three offside penalties.
More than likely More than likely this was Parcells pulling psychological strings to keep his team on edge and focused, considering playing well against an undercause for celebration.
