Gorilas Toman El Poder En Bolivia

BUENOS AIRES. El general Luis García Meza consolidó su posición de "Hombre fuerte" de Bolivia al ser impuesto como presidente de esa nación, tras lo que pareció ser un sangriento golpe militar contra el gobierno constitucional interino de la presidenta Lidia Gueiler.

Pero las primeras reacciones de Washington y América Latina fueron de total repudio al golpe que dejó trunco el difícil proceso de ese país hacia una democracia.

García Meza fue unigido presidente mediante un primer decreto de la junta militar - formada por los tres comandantes en jefe - que, a su vez, había jurado el cargo ante el comandante general de las fuerzas armadas, Armando Villa. El acto se cumplió en el custodiado cuartel general de Miraflores de La Paz.

Según esa transmisión propalada por Radio Rivadavia, García Meza al asumir criticó al gobierno de la Sra. Gueiler y la acusó de "haber provocado miseria económica del pueblo, un endeudamiento externo" y mantuvo la vieja aspiración boliviana" en forma "irrenunciable".

García no señaló plazo de permanencia en el poder del nuevo gobierno, pero por uno de sus objetivos que él señaló - erradicar el analfabetismo en Bolivia - se estima que tomaría varios años.

Dijo también que "tomaremos medidas de mediano y largo plazo" que incluyen una reforma universitaria y la honestidad en la administración pública, aparte de otras como la ocupación plena, mejores niveles de vida y la eficiencia de quienes administran la justicia.

En una transmisión efectuada por radio "Grigota" de Santa Cruz, Bolivia, captada por Radio Rivadavia, una proclama Castrense calificó al movimiento como "una revolución libertadora" destinada a impedir que Bolivia caiga en manos de los trabajadores" como Cuba y Afganistán".

Entretanto, era virtualmente total la incertidumbre sobre el desarrollo de la situación boliviana. En uno de los escasos contactos directos con La Paz se dijo que medios eclesiásticos informaron que la presidenta Gueiler se encontraba en la

Mexicanos, Chicanos Comparados

LOS ANGELES [UPI].- la mayoría de los inmigrantes mexicanos indocumentados se afieran a su cultura y preferían tener el derecho de cruzar legalmente la frontera que combertirse en ciudadanos norteamericanos, señalan dos sociólogos de la Universidad del estado de California.

Las conclusiones de Reynaldo Baca y Dexter Bryan se fundan en cuestionarios hechos en español y completados por mexicanos que vivían y trabajan en Los Angeles.

El estudio encuentra que los inmigrantes indocumentados, centenares de miles de los cuales están en el sur y sudoeste de California, quieren trabajar y no recibir asistencia por pobreza, y prefieren pagar la atención médica.

Pero la mayoría de ellos se resisten a convertirse en norteamericanos y rechazan la cultura adoptada por los llamados "chicanos" los nacidos en Estados Unidos de origen mexicano.

Bryan y Baca usaron una técnica por la cual sus encuestadores tomaban contacto con los encuestados a través de recomendaciones de otros mexicanos. La mayoría de los encuestados eran obreros de fábricas o querían serlo.

El doctor Lawrence Fuchs, director ejecutivo de la comisión sobre política de inmigración y asilo,

advirtió contra el exceso de confianza en la técnica empleada y dijo que podría dar resultados excesivamente uniformes.

Pero Baca y Brayan sostienen que el trabajo tiene más validez que otros anteriores, particularmente los realizados con inmigrantes ilegales bajo custodia del Servicio de Inmigración o con deportados de México.

La primera y más básica conclusión del trabajo es que "esta gente no son 'chicanos disfrazados'. No son como los mexico-americanos".

"Los chicanos pueden ser biculturales y bilingües, pero no son binacionales. Los mexicanos, por otra parte, son monoculturales y monolingües, pero son binacionales. Tienen bases en ambos países", dicen los investigadores.

"Son refugiados económicos que están trabajando en Estados Unidos con el sueño de volver a México para invertir sus ganancias".

Brayan y Baca informaron que el resto de la sociedad pasa por alto las profundas diferencias que hay entre los chicanos y mexicanos.

"Los chicanos están interesados en la hegemonía política y económica. Los mexicanos no están interesados en si Jerry Brown o Ronald Reagan ex gobernador. Únicamente no saben y no les preocupa. Son ciudadanos de México."

You and The Social Security**115 MILLION PAY SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES**

About 115 million workers, their employers, and self-employed people will pay social security taxes in 1980. The tax rate for workers and their employers, which applies to the first \$25,900 of an individual's earnings, is 6.13 percent. For the self-employed, the rate is 8.1 percent. In future years the amount of earnings subject to tax will rise depending on the increase in average earnings that occurs from one year to the next.

A self-employed individual—that is, one who engages in a business, trade, or profession—receives social security credits if he or she has net earnings of at least \$400 a year. (Under an optional method, credits may be earned even if net income is less than that amount.) Since the social security benefits eventually received depend on a person's earnings over the years, it is important that he or she be credited with all earnings up to the maximum.

Some self-employed persons also work for wages in covered employment. In such cases, the wages count first for social security. If the wages amount to less than the maximum covered by social security, they pay the self-employment tax only on the difference between the two.

Collecting social security taxes for individuals working in covered employment is a relatively simple matter—the taxes are withheld from their wages. With the self-employed, however, this is not possible. They pay their social security taxes when they file their Federal income tax returns.

All self-employed persons with net earnings of \$400 or more during the year must file a Federal income tax return with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

In addition to form 1040 (the individual income tax return), they must submit Schedule C (on which the profit or loss from a business or profession is shown) (Schedule F for farmers) and Schedule SE (on which the social security self-employment tax is computed). In some cases, a person may owe social security taxes

even if there is no income tax obligation.

In computing earnings from self-employment, a person starts with gross earnings and then deducts allowable business expenses. These include such items as depreciation on furniture or equipment used in the business or profession, as well as a host of other business-related expenses. When a person is engaged in more than one self-employment activity, the profit or loss from each is combined.

Not all income counts for social security credit, even though it may have to be reported for income tax purposes. Among the kinds of income not counted in computing net earnings are corporate stock dividends and bond interest (except when the self-employed individual is a dealer in stocks and securities); interest from loans (except when the person is engaged in the business of lending money); rentals from real estate (unless the person is a dealer in real estate or regularly provides services for the convenience of the occupant); and income received by a limited partner who performs no services for the partnership.

Anyone who has questions concerning the handling of income from self-employment for social security purposes should contact any social security office. For answers to questions about income taxes, get in touch with any office of the Internal Revenue Service.

USTED Y EL SEGURO SOCIAL

Alrededor de 115 millones de trabajadores, sus patrones, y personas con negocios propios pagarán impuestos de seguro social en 1980.

La tasa de impuesto para trabajadores y sus patrones, que se aplica a los primeros 125,900 de ganancias de un individuo, es 6.13 por ciento. Para quienes trabajan por cuenta propia, la tasa es 8.1 por ciento. En años futuros, la cantidad de ganancias sujeta a impuesto aumentará dependiendo del aumento en el promedio de ganancias que ocurre de un año a otro.

Un individuo que trabaja por

cuenta propia—es decir, que tiene un negocio, oficio, o profesión—recibe crédito de seguro social si tienen ganancias netas de por lo menos \$400 al año. (Bajo un método opcional, los créditos pueden ser ganados aunque el ingreso neto sea menor de esa cantidad). Como los beneficios de seguro social eventualmente recibidos dependen de las ganancias de una persona a través de los años, es importante que dichas ganancias sean acreditadas a las personas hasta el máximo establecido.

Algunas personas con negocios propios también trabajan en empleo cubierto. En tales casos, los salarios cuentan primero para el seguro social. Si la cantidad de ganancias es menor de la cantidad máxima cubierta por el seguro social, esas personas pagan el impuesto de negocio propio solamente por la diferencia entre los dos.

La colección de impuestos de seguro social para individuos trabajando en empleo cubierto es relativamente simple—los impuestos son retenidos de sus salarios. Con los de negocio propio, sin embargo, esto no es posible. Tienen que pagar sus impuestos de seguro social cuando hacen su declaración de impuestos Federal sobre ingreso.

Todas las personas con negocios propios que tienen ganancias netas de \$400 o más durante el año deben registrar una declaración de impuesto Federal sobre ingreso en el Servicio de Rentas Internas (IRS). Además del cuestionario 1040 (la declaración de impuesto sobre ingreso individual), deben someter el Suplemento C (en el cual se muestran las ganancias o pérdidas de un negocio o profesión). Suplemento F

para agricultores, y Suplemento SE (en el cual el impuesto de seguro social para negocio propio es calculado). En algunos casos, una persona puede deber impuestos de seguro social aunque no haya obligación de impuesto sobre ingreso.

Al calcular ganancias de un negocio propio, una persona empieza con las ganancias totales y entonces descuenta los gastos de negocio admisibles. Estos incluyen tales partidas como depreciación de muebles o equipo usado en el negocio o profesión, así como gastos de otro negocio relacionado que patrocina. Cuando una persona emplea en más de un actividad con negocio propio, la ganancia y perdida es combinada una al otra.

No todo el ingreso cuenta para crédito de seguro social aunque puede haber sido reportado para los fines de impuesto sobre ingreso. Entre las clases de ingresos no contados al calcular ganancias netas están las acciones incorporadas e intereses de bonos (excepción cuando el negocio esté en el negocio de prestar dinero); rentas de bienes raíces (a menos que la persona sea negociante en bienes raíces o provea regularmente servicios para la conveniencia de los ocupantes); e ingreso recibido por un socio comanditario que no realiza servicios para la sociedad.

COLLEGE STATION—Abundantes existencias de carne de puerco, pollo para asar y freír, pavos, huevos, leche, otros productos lácteos y ligeras serán las "mejores compras" de las próximas semanas, según la Dra. Carol Akerman Sain, especialista en información para los consumidores.

La Dra. Sain, quien pertenece al personal de economía del hogar del Servicio de Extensión Agrícola de Texas, del Sistema de la Universidad de Texas A&M, dice que otros productos abundantes serán cacahuetes, papas, frijoles, pasas y ciruelas.

CARNES—El pavo puede ser el mejor producto para el presupuesto durante una semana o más debido a las altas existencias, y de

mejor precio es el de mayor tamaño.

Frutas—Las frutas abundantes de la nueva cosecha son cerezas dulces, duraznos, nectarinas y ciruelas. Busque las frutas maduras—y a precios más económicos.

De México, se esperan plátanos, piñas, melones y sandías.

Las manzanas y naranjas están abundantes, y son excelentes para bocadillos y paseos al campo, agrega la especialista.

Vegetales—Los vegetales económicos de primera calidad son espárragos, brócoli, repollo, zanahorias, coliflor, y espinaca, también las calabacitas, tomates, rutabagas, hongos y cebollitas.

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COLLEGE STATION—Your fall garden and home landscape can be as colorful as in spring and summer if you start planning now.

Dr. William C. Welch, landscape horticulturist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System, identifies four popular plants for fall color. They are the chrysanthemum, candle tree, copper plant and Joseph's coat.

The chrysanthemum, or mum as it is commonly known, is considered queen of fall flowers, according to Welch. Mums required well-drained soil and enough water and fertilizer to produce popular, colorful blooms.

He recommends a high-phosphorus fertilizer, such as 5-15-10, at the rate of two pounds per 100 square feet. Complete transplanting mums in June or early July and keep terminal buds pinched back through July to promote side branching.

Showy, yellow flowers are characteristic of the candle tree, these plants are best used as backgrounds for wide flower beds and produce foliage four to six feet high, notes the horticulturist.

Candle trees prefer rich, moist soil and should be fertilized each month with a 5-15-10 fertilizer at the rate of two pounds per 100 square feet.

For bronze foliage which combines well with fall flowers, try the copper plant, suggests Welch. It normally grows 15 to 30 inches tall in moist, fertile soil. Fertilize copper plants with 10-10-5 fertilizer at the rate of about two pounds per 100 square feet.

Joseph's coat (*Alternanthera*) is famous for its color of red, orange, green and yellow. The native of Brazil prefers moist, well-fertilized soil and is most commonly used as low, spreading border.

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

Muslim Leader To Appear On Ch. 5

Lubbock--KXT-TV's "The Press And" meets with one of the American Muslim Mission leaders Saturday, August 16, at 7 p.m.

"The Press And Imam Kamaludin" will tour on the Muslim's relations and beliefs of black and white racism, I in Hostages, the black image, and the Muslims's role in America.

Producer and director, Claudia Wermann, oriented, "Many Muslim leaders are also religious leaders and play a big part in the Muslim community in Lubbock. I think Channel five's audience will be surprised to find the similarities in the basic Muslim beliefs and Lubbock's more predominant Christian beliefs."

Three of the country's most respected journalists discuss their careers and reflect on the current state of American journalism on "Sevareid, Salisbury, Reasoner: Three American Reporters," airing Thurs. August 14, 1980 at 9 p.m. on KXT-TV.

The hour-long discussion ranges freely over a variety of subjects, providing the three journalists a rare chance to reflect on their own careers

and even make some startling predictions about the big news stories of the next five years.

The special opens with each of the three reporters recounting his biggest story and most memorable personality. The conversation continues, covering such topics as the Washington press corps; the cynicism of the press; the fall of Nixon; the impact of television on news; the monopolization of newspaper ownership; the phenomenon of Walter Cronkite; the crisis in Iran; journalism in the Soviet Union; the U.S. press coverage of Watergate and Vietnam.

In responding to the popular criticism that the press concentrates on the negative or bad news, Harrison Salisbury says, "We are critical and I think we should be critical. That's one of our basic functions." Eric Savareid disagrees, saying he thinks today's reporters may have become too critical of politicians and public policies: "The press today would not give anybody in public life the benefit of the doubt. It chews everything to bits before it has any chance to mature." Harry Reasoner attributes this cynicism to the fact that "generations went by with known instances of incompetence and idiocy in the Congress, the


White House and government departments, none of which was reported."

The different outlooks and backgrounds of the three journalists allow for a lively discussion with much give and take. Sevareid, Reasoner and Salisbury all grew up and began their careers in Minneapolis/St. Paul and they comment on how their midwestern roots have affected them.

The program, taped earlier this year in Washington, D.C., is moderated by Charles Bailey, editor of the Minneapolis Tribune. "Three American Reporters" is a production of KTCA-TV, St. Paul/Minneapolis. Jim Russell is Executive Producer and Don Dixon is Producer. Stalls Trade To Bucs

Thousand Oaks, Calif. (AP)—The Dallas Cowboys traded four-year veteran defensive tackle Dave Stalls to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers Wednesday for two undisclosed future draft choices.

The 6-foot-4, 255-pound Stalls, a seventh-round draft choice out of Northern Colorado, was made expendable when Ed "Too Tall" Jones came out of retirement and returned at end and coach Tom Landry moved giant John Dutton to tackle.

Stalls, whose biggest asset is quickness, was a pass rushing specialist for the Cowboys. He had five quarterback traps in 1979, the fourth best on the team.

Stalls started the first 12 games for the Cowboys at left tackle last year until Larry Cole took over.

One of Stalls' biggest days was two traps of the New York Giants' quarterback Phil Simms in a 28-7 victory, including a six-yard trap on fourth down at the Dallas goal.

Stalls said before the season of his demotion as a starter: "I didn't like it from a personal standpoint because I'm a competitor. But if it helps us get to the Super Bowl I'll do it."

He has a master's degree in marine biology from California State-Long Beach and spent one summer in a cage studying sharks' behavioral patterns.

Stalls also provided one of the lighter moments with a one-liner before the Dallas-Pittsburgh Super Bowl XIII in Miami. A pelican he was feeding attacked him and tore a chunk out of his hand.

"Obviously, a Pittsburgh pelican," he quipped.

The Cowboys will carry seven defensive linemen this year. Besides Jones, Dutton and Cole as of the second week of training camp they include Randy White, Harvey Martin, Larry Bethea and Bruce Thornton.

Steelers and Rams Bowl Favorites

Las Vegas, Nev. (AP)—Oddsmaker Bob Martin says Super Bowl XV should be a repeat of Super Bowl XIV, with Pittsburgh meeting Los Angeles

and the Steelers coming out on top.

Martin made the Steelers slight favorites to win the game, set for New Orleans on Jan. 25, in odds posted at the Union Plaza Hotel's race and sports book.

The Steelers, who beat the Rams 31-19 at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena last January, have been made 12-5 favorites to repeat their victory. Martin set the line at 13-5 for the Rams.

The Green Bay Packers, at 1,000-1, were last on the list.

Martin listed the San Diego Chargers and Houston Oilers at 7-1.

They were followed by the New England Patriots, Dallas Cowboys Washington Redskins and the Philadelphia Eagles, all at 8-1.

The Cincinnati Bengals were rated at 60-1, followed by the Kansas City Chiefs and the Buffalo Bills at 100-1.

The odds for the New York Giants were set at 500-1, while the San Francisco 49ers were at 750-1 favorites. Green Bay brought up the rear at 1,000-1.

The hotel's sports book currently is accepting wagers on the Super Bowl winner. Betting closes Sept. 7.

 Los mexico-americanos en el Sur-este de los Estados Unidos tienen mucho en común con los franco-canadenses en la provincia de Quebec al otro lado de nuestro continente. As dos culturas son tradicionalmente católicas, conservadoras, y luchan por conservar su idioma frente al prestigio internacional del inglés. Oficialmente, todo el Canadá es bilingüe en inglés y francés, pero en la provincia de Quebec, el francés es el idioma de preferencia. Sin embargo, en los negocios y en la cultura popular, el uso del idioma anglosajón crece diariamente, y amenaza el futuro de la cultura francesa en América. Se queja un autor franco-canadiense:

The merchant across the street who uses an English name although he is French-speaking, that is assimilation. That other, like thousands in Quebec, who reads only English magazines and newspapers, who looks at or listens almost exclusively to English radio or television, only the hit parade, that is assimilation. All these tourist establishments that disfigure the French visage of our province, thinking they will draw American visitors, that is assimilation. The French university that believes itself forced to teach with the help of American manuals, that is assimilation.

Or at least, that is a degree of assimilation, while waiting for the next degree. And so on through the years, until on day, one has no longer any desire to be what one has been.

Unhappily, it is not arms that assimilate peoples. That would be too easy to resist. It is interests, currents of thought, modes, psychological climates, in brief, it is the situation in which we find ourselves.

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Conference Resolutions

The following are resolutions passed by the White House Conference families held last month

A. 3. Tax Policies

7. The policy of all branches of federal and state government shall be to use income tax credits, including negative income tax to strengthen all families, and especially to help provide for:

A. Child Care-explore and revise tax incentives and deductions to help families secure affordable child care services and encourage employers to share in the provisions of child care services.

B. Full-time homemakers.

C. Care of other persons for whom the family has a responsibility.

8. In order to preserve the financial stability of the family:

A. Inheritance taxes among family members should be revised at state and federal levels to increase the level of exemptions presently allowable so that surviving family members may own, operate and maintain small businesses and family farms.

B. The marriage penalty tax should be eliminated by allowing married couples to elect to file income taxes either jointly or separately.

9. Revise tax code to encourage procedures strengthening the American families:

A. Allowing married couples to choose to file jointly or separately without penalty.

B. Provide tax credit for home care of elderly or infirm.

C. Eliminate inheritance tax on assets passing to family members.

D. Indexing personal income tax.

A. 4. Income Security for Families

10. To insure that all families receive maximum Social Security benefits. Social Security laws should provide benefits for widows at the age of 55; should provide equitable treatment for homemakers; should not penalize husbands and wives; employed husbands and wives should collect benefits as individuals; should relax the strenuous eligibility for disability requirements; provide for equitable allowances for discrepancies in life expectancy.

Social security benefits should not prevent dependent children of

deceased Veterans from also receiving VA benefits.

11. Recommend that: all income maintenance and social service programs and programs of insurance and pension be analyzed in terms of their impact on families, and that specified actions be taken to: 1) Inure that no programs include eligibility requirements that work to the detriment of the family, as it exists.

2) Promote equality inaccess to services and benefits regardless of race, sex, language, culture, marital status, educational level or region; 3) Recognize in the delivery and staffing of services the different linguistic and cultural perspectives of minorities.

A. 5 Status of Homemakers

13. We recommend tax code reform to eliminate discrimination against the family (homemaker) including: (1) The elimination of state and federal inheritance, estate, and gift taxes for spouses and survivors to facilitate continuing operation of the family businesses and farms; (2) The removal of tax penalties on two earner couples (3) The reconstruction of tax laws to support needs of families (homemakers) eg. (the adoption and education of children, the care of the elderly and the handicapped).

14. One reason women often feel inadequate and unfulfilled in their chosen career of homemaking, is the lack of positive recognition by society. This negative attitude has been fostered in our educational system. Therefore we recommend that the status of homemakers should be viewed more positively as career choices in our school system.

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
