either slow down 20 miles per if you drive with any detecthour below the speed limit or able amount of alcohol in your vacate the lane closest to the system," emergency vehicle with emergency lights activated if the road has multiple lanes traveling in the same direction. Drivers should only move over if they can safely and legally do so; otherwise they should slow down.

Troopers continue to see drivers who do not slow down or move over for stopped emergency vehicles with lights activated, including police, emergency medical service and fire vehicles. A violation of the slow down/move over law is punishable by a maximum fine of \$200. If the violation results in property damage, the maximum fine increases to \$500. Troopers also remind Spring Break travelers to make sure drivers are well rested. Troopers will be looking for speeders and seat belt violators.
