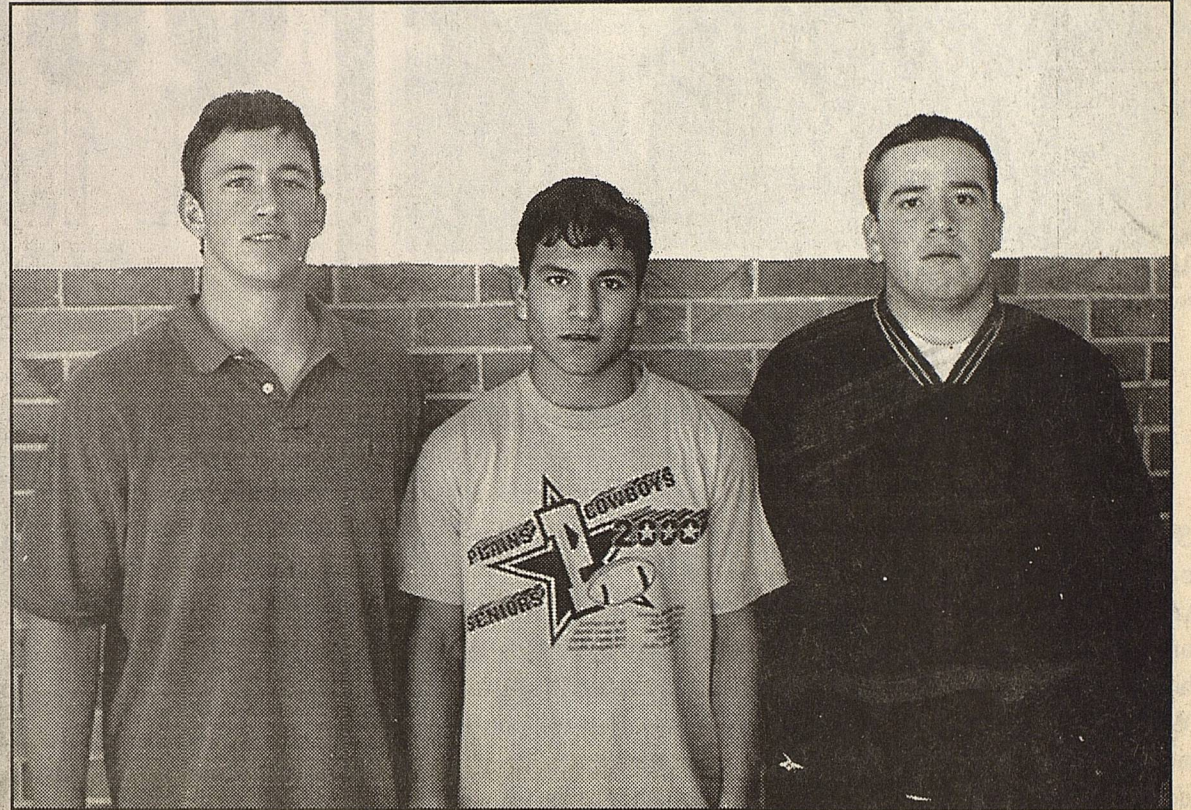
## Grand Jury Indicts Seven On Ten Charges

The Yoakum County Grand Jury on December 13 returned true bills of indictment on seven defendants. The criminal case's range of punishment varied from first, second, third degree felonies and state jail felony.

The indictments included three charges of aggravated sexual assault against Faustino Hernandez Jr. The defendant was charged with the assaults against a fourteen year old female, first degree enhanced felonies. Three bonds totalling \$12,000 were assessed for the defendant.

The December 16 issue of the *Lubbock Avalanche Journal* contained the paper's picks for All - South Plains football standouts on area Class 2-A teams. Three members of the 1999 Cowboy team were honored for their gridiron work this season.

## Walker honored by P.I.S.D. Work in Legislature benefits School Distict

State representative Gary Walker, District 80, was honored by the Plains ISD Board of Trustees at a public reception in the school's Resource Center and Library. The reception was attended by a large number of school officials, local citizens, and administrators from other school districts.

Prior to presenting Walker a framed Resolution signed by the Board of Trustees, Superintendent Haynes told the audience Walker's role in securing passage of legislative bills favoring smaller, rural school districts in the last session had been invaluable for all the school districts in West Texas.

Accepting the Resolution, Walker expressed his gratitude, and said he hoped voters would return him to office for his fourth term in Austin. He also told the well-wishers the mandated redistricting of legislative districts in the 2001 session would be a very thorny, difficult issue, and in all probability West Texas would lose some representation in the House.

## Cotton harvest, ginning winds down

Following a delay in harvesting caused by wet weather and green cotton plants, the 1999 cotton crop will soon be history.

This Monday morning the five county cotton gins reported the following ginned bale counts: Yoakum County CoOp, 24,273 bales. Expected to finish ginning after January 1. Sun Cot Gin, 29,570 bales. To finish run in 3 to 4 weeks.

New Tex Gin, 31,022 bales, should finish between Christmas and New Years Day. Tokio Co Op Gin, 22,074 bales, should finish ginning two or three days after Christmas. Circle 12 Gin, 5,118 bales. Expect to gin last bale by end of December.

All of the gins reported this years production numbers to be less than originally predicted.

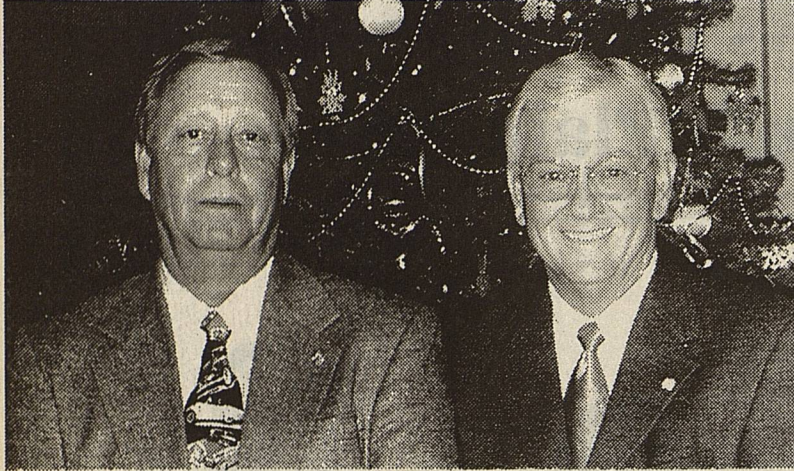

## Shortcomings In WTO Agricultural Agenda Make Lack Of Agreement A Relief

Since a commitment to protecting the interests of America's family farmers and ranchers failed to make it into the World Trade Organization (WTO) declaration negotiators tried to launch in Seattle, the fact that no agreement was reached is a relief according to the Texas Farmers Union (TFU).

TFU said future trade negotiations must recognize a government's right to provide an adequate farm safety net, address the trade distorting effect on producers of currency variances and fluctuations, address the price depressing effect of large world stocks and recognize the non food benefits of agriculture.

"The agricultural trade agenda negotiators put forth in Seattle was far from perfect and more closely represented the interests of multinational corporations

than those of family farmers and ranchers," said TFU President, Wes Sims. "The WTO process must be much more open and accountable to all stakeholders or it will continue to lose support."

With American farmers and ranchers finding themselves at a competitive disadvantage in regard to environmental and labor regulations and standards, their inclusion in future trade negotiations is considered important, said TFU.

The National Farmers Union (NFU) delegation in Seattle included more than 25 of the organizations' elected officials. The farm leaders held consultations with farm and cooperative leaders from throughout the world and met with U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary, Dan Glickman and members of Congress.

and delivery of 2000 pounds or less, but more than 50 pounds of marijuana. The drug was moved from Denver City to Gaines County. Alma Blanca Ruiz was involved in the delivery, and eventually arrested in Seagraves with the drug. The marijuana was destined for final delivery to Lubbock. Rodriguez bond was \$30,000. Rodolfo Perez Rodriguez was also indicted for the same offense in the same drug deal. He was involved in transporting the marijuana to the exchange point in Gaines County. His bond was set at \$10,000.

John Wayne Bagley was indicted on two criminally negligent homicide charges. On April May 30, 1999, Bagley

was traveling north on FM 1780, driving a Mack truck. He disregarded a no passing sign and stop sign at the intersection with US Highway 82, and struck a 1996 Buick LeSabre driven by Ralph Valentine, and occupied by his wife Edith Valentine. Mr. Valentine was declared dead at the scene by Judge Melba Crutcher. Mrs Valentine was transported to the Brownfield Hospital where she later died. Bond in each state jail felony cause was set at \$2500.

Vidal Zarate Garcia was indicted for failure to appear while under bond for a previous burglary of a habitation charge. He is presently in jail, and bond was set at \$13,000. David Laureles was indicted for burglary of a habitation with

intent to commit theft on July 7, 1999. The second degree felony was enhanced to first degree because of a 1992 aggravated assault on a Peace Officer. No bond was set. The defendant is presently in jail.

Mike L. Sanders was indicted for burglary of a habitation, a second degree felony enhanced to first degree. He had previous convictions dating back to 1987, and had been declared a habitual offender. He is presently in a New Mexico correctional facility. District Judge Kelly G. Moore. Criminal District Attorney Richard Clark represented the state.

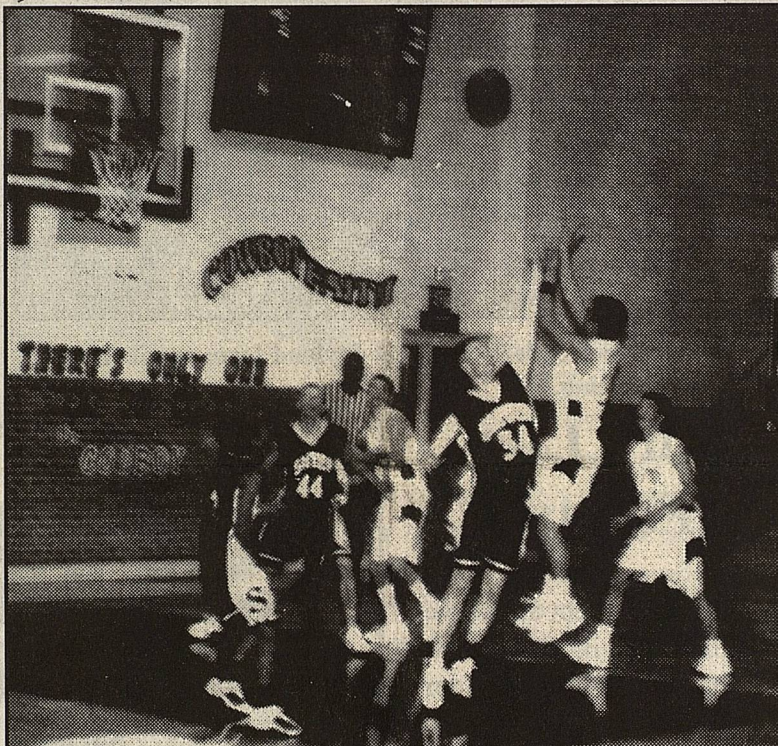

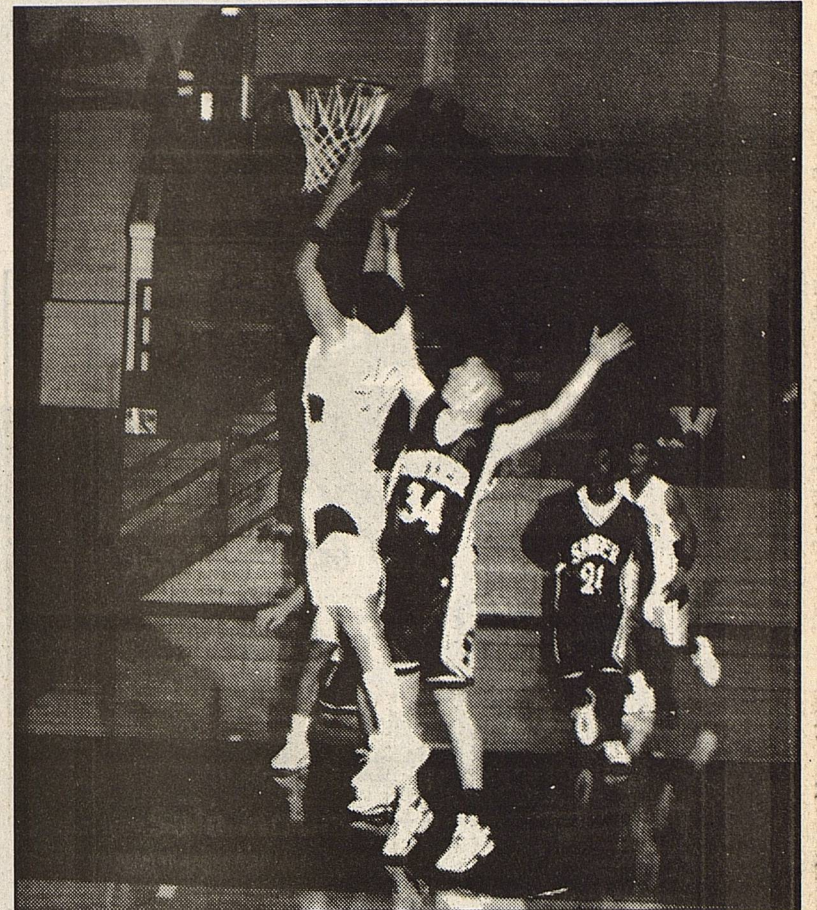

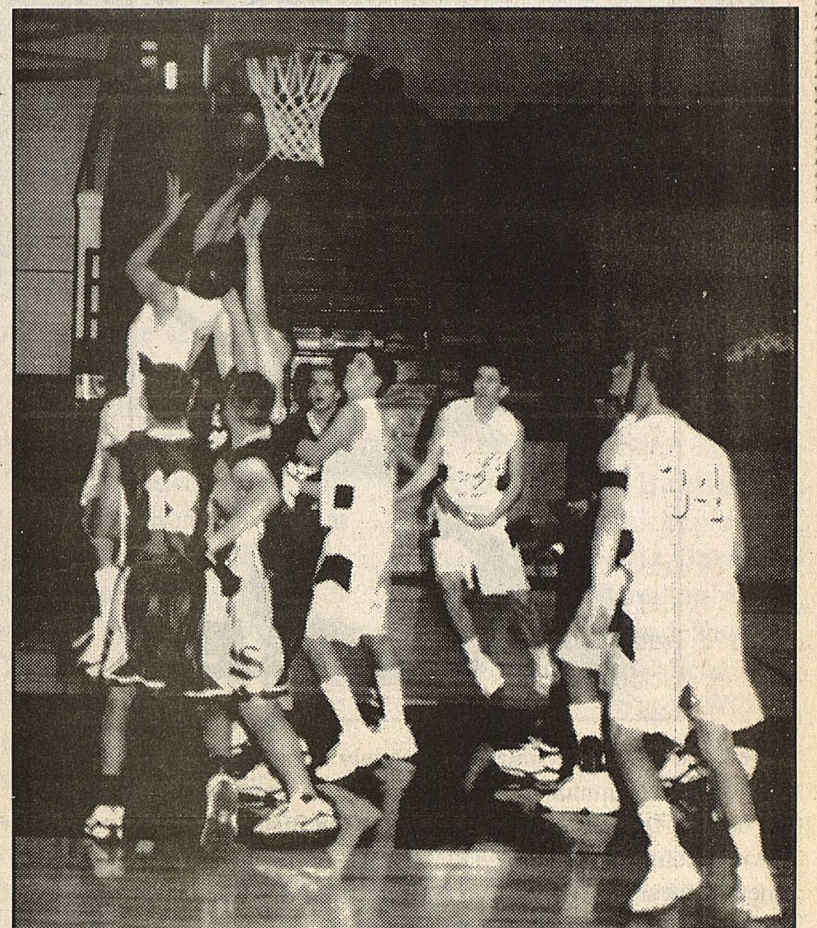

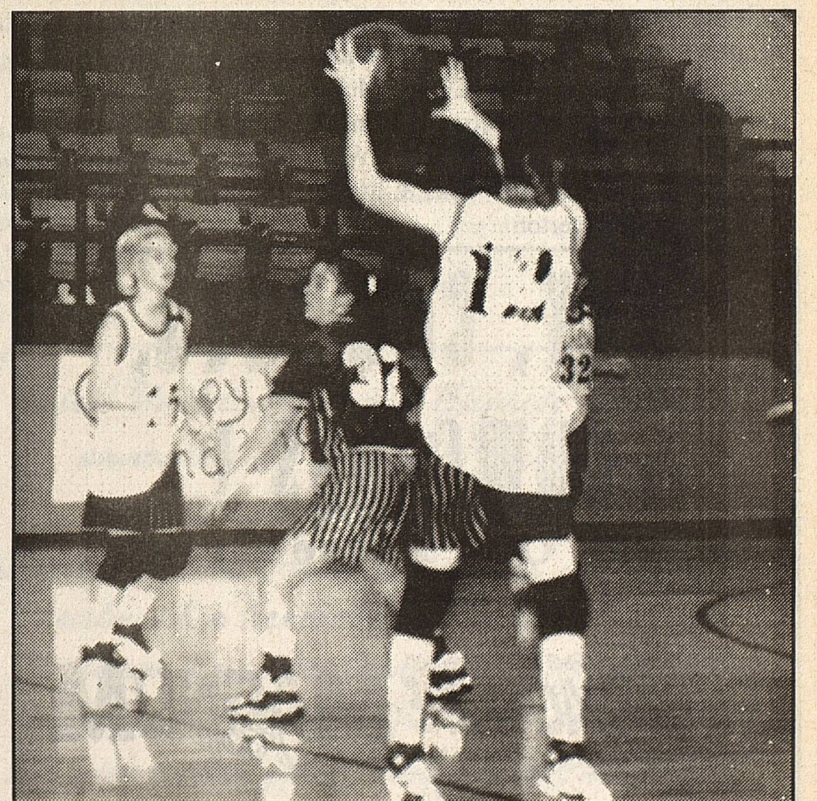

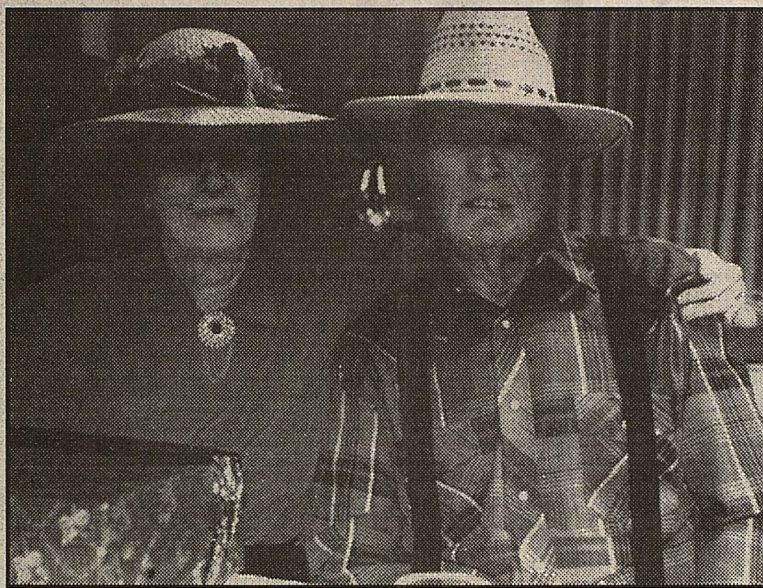
Several restaurants offer a range of choices for New Year's Eve dinners, and a first food after midnight buffet will be featured.

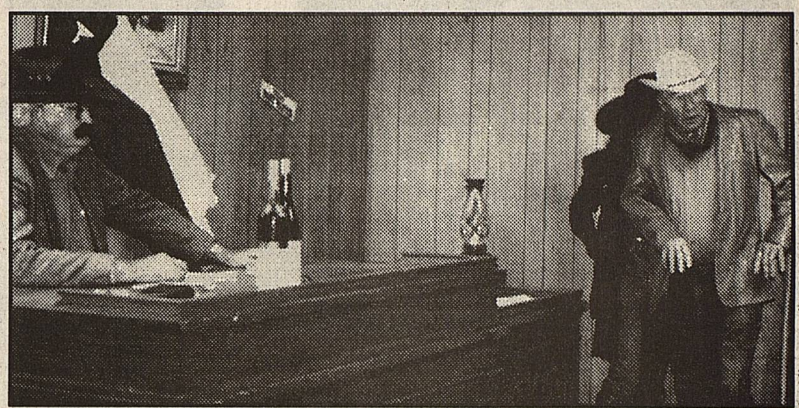

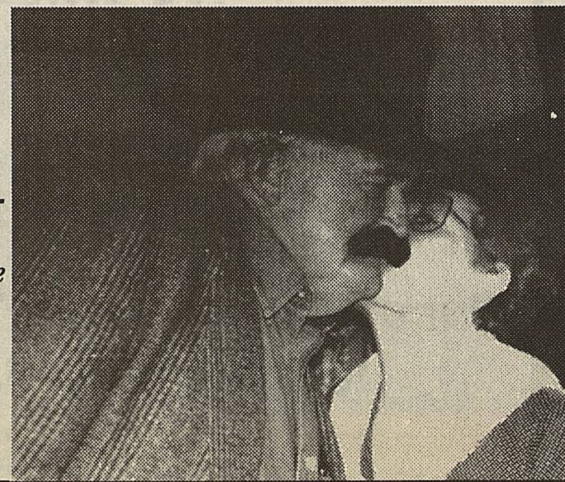

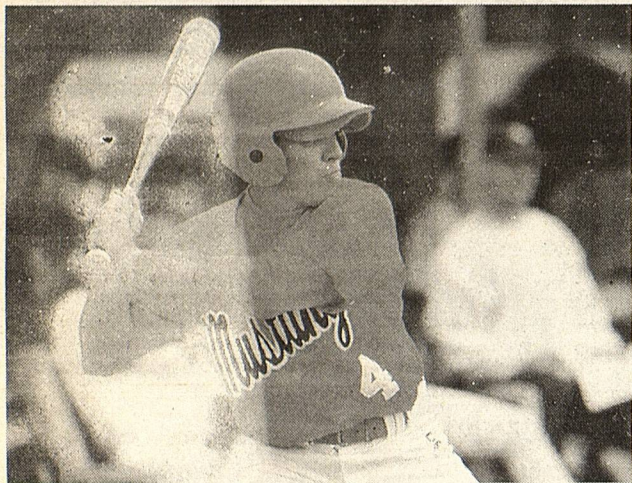

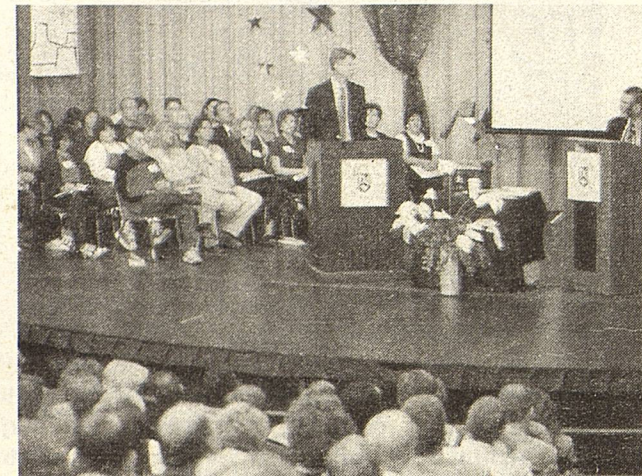
