


Please join us in saluting the Plains High School Senior Class which will graduate Friday, May 31 at 8 P.M.

2002 Farm Bill Update

Investment Act 2002 has passed in both the House and Senate and was signed by President Bush on May 13th. The bill is a 16 year bill beginning with the 2002 crop and ending in 2007. Completion of the Rules and Regulations may take an additional 2-3 months, but following is a brief overview of the legislation.

-will initiate counter-cyclical payments, with a target price. -will continue direct 'AMTA' payments and marketing loan gains/LDP's.

-will maintain full planting flexibility, with the exception of fruits and vegetables.

-will allow option to update acreage bases and program yields.

-Bases and yields are calculated over 4 year period of 1998-2001.

-contains major changes for peanuts and soybeans.

-will require country of origin

The Farm Security and Rural labeling for meat, fish, produce & peanuts by 2004.

> -will include a new conservation security program, with incentives for conservation prac-

> -will increase EQIP funding 6-

-Peanut Program under same provisions as other program crops; provides for a fixed payment, target price and a loan price per ton. Quota owners will receive a buyout based on 2001 quota pounds.

Truck's sharp turn brings down power pole

Many recent media reports have publicized the state's shortage of whole blood for medical facilities, and the short supply is acute in West Texas.




No, these are NOT giant prairie dog holes



A tour of Cowboy Way will reveal many of these large piles of soil, marking the excavation sites where concrete ramps are being installed to accomodate users of wheel chairs. The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is in charge of constructing fourteen of the ramps, a provision mandated by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Federal funds were allocated to TxDot for the project. TxDOT is also installing new traffic signs along the highway featuring breakaway bases as a safety feature. The City of Plains will soon start a similar project on all city signs along the route.
