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Plains ISD works on developing crisis management plan

School students, their parents, school officials and the general public normally consider public school districts as safe havens for children pursuing an education, and the majority of times they are. Far too often, however, events happen on school grounds which sadly prove there are exceptions to this thought of safety. Recent years have seen a number of tragic acts of violence against youngsters, by youngsters.

Public schools are sometimes targeted by violent weather; Tornados can rip through a campus, lightning can strike gatherings of students. Dangerous fires are not common but can occur. Truly sick people can make bomb threats against schools.

"All of these possible scenarios are not pleasant to think about, but the possibility exists any or all of them could happen to our school district," Superintendent Jim Haynes told CCN last week. Haynes and the other administrators and teachers are currently hard at work drafting a detailed and comprehensive Crisis Management Plan, which will be a blueprint for the entire district staff to follow should any of the above events happen at Plains ISD.

Robert Canon and several of his computer design students are developing a scale schematic of the entire campus, detailing all open areas, doors, and telephones. Copies of the finished map will be available for law enforcement, EMS, and other emergency response people should a crisis develop.

When complete, the Crisis Management Plan will be a very extensive document. Some of the items to be covered include crisis communication procedures, emergency phone numbers, alternate school locations in case evacuation is necessary, chemical leaks/spills, fires, explosions, weapons on campus, natural or weather related disasters, bomb threats, weapons on campus, hostage situations, first aid.

Haynes told CCN, "It may be impossible to prevent some of these events occurring, but when our plan is operational, our people and those responding to help will know how to handle the situation."

IRS approves Sandy Land water depletion tables

Tax deductions to help many ag producers in lean year

Agricultural producers in the county using irrigation wells on their lands may get a badly needed financial break this year when tax return time rolls around. Last week, Lorinda Busby, Engineer Revenue Agent with Internal Revenue Service, visited Sandy Land Underground Water Conservation's office here, and officially approved the district's statistics charting depletion of ground water in the county over the past twelve months, and the district's estimate of current land values.

The stamp of approval will ensure those producers who can show a loss in standing water levels are entitled to an income tax deduction similar to the same tax break oil and gas producers are entitled to as their reserves are depleted.

Gary Walker, Sandy Land Consultant, said, "The formula

used in determining possible tax deductions is complicated. It is based on the relative value of agricultural land, either dryland or irrigated production land, when it was purchased and for how much, and how much, if any, the standing water level has fluctuated on the irrigated acres".

The tax benefits for producers

will greatly vary from year to year. Walker said dollar benefits from the possible tax deductions could range from several hundred dollars to many thousands of dollars. In this year of severely depressed commodity prices, insect infestations and weather related crop losses, any type of relief will be appreciated by producers.

Walker files for re-election to fourth term in House

Representative Gary L. Walkler has filed for election to a fourth term in the Texas House of Representatives, District 80.

"Representing West Texas has been a challenge at times, but a pleasure all of the time," said Walker. "I expect the next session to offer an interesting set of challenges as we set out to re-district the State of Texas. Texas will almost certainly lose some of its rural representatives during the next session, and it's important we exercise our seniority, and thus our clout, as much as possible."

Walker currently serves as chair of the Land and Resource Management Committee, and was the only third-term member to receive a chairmanship last session. Walker also serves on the House Natural Resources Committee. He was also given the privilege of presenting the nominating speech for the Speaker of the House, Pete Laney.

"I've reached every goal I have set for myself and the representation of my constituents thus far," said Walker. "I was pleased to work on a state-wide agriculture policy last session, as well as co-authoring the bill raising the multiplier for teachers." Walker also worked heavily on severance tax exemptions for the oil and gas industry, co-authored boll weevil funding legislation, and fought for extra help for school districts suffering financially from the drop in oil prices. Rural representatives were also successful in including money in the Appropriations bill for precipitation enhancement and rural health initiatives, and worked to protect rural interests during the debate on electric deregulation.

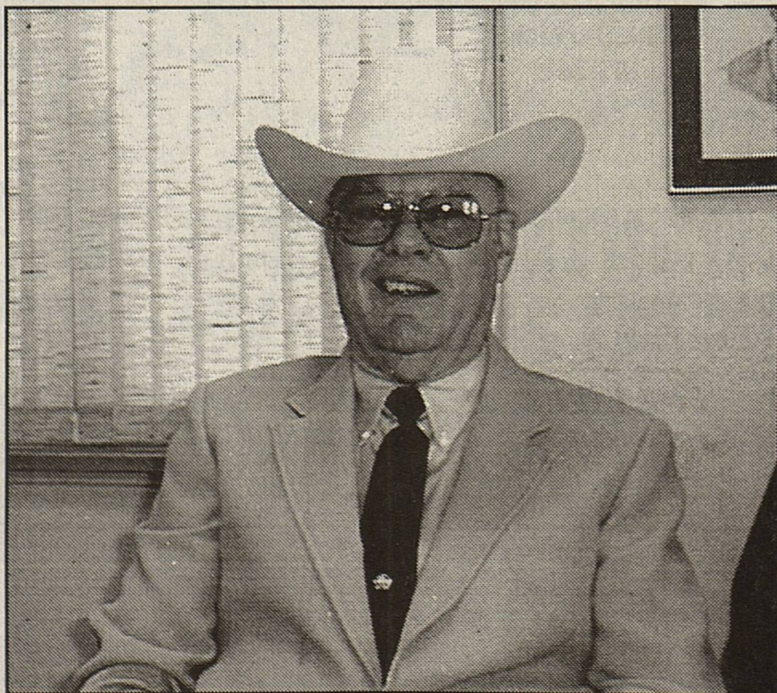
District 80 includes Andrews, Gaines, Dawson, Loving, Reeves, Hockley, Martin, Terry, Winkler and Yoakum Counties.

Rice's hat in ring for re-election as Sheriff

Interviewed last Thursday, Yoakum County Sheriff Jim Rice told CCN, "I have made the decision to ask the voters of our county to let me keep my job as Sheriff for one more term. I am seeking re-election subject to the March Democratic Primary."

Rice, 64, recently underwent surgery to remove blockage in his cardiovascular system. "My Doctors tell me I am fine, and definitely in better health than I've been in the last six years. I feel fine, and am getting stronger everyday".

The veteran peace officer has served as Sheriff of Yoakum County over 19 years, plus two years as a Deputy Sheriff here. Prior to moving to Texas, Rice worked for the Sheriff Department in neighboring Lea County, New Mexico. He served in the department there from 1969 to 1977, a total of thirty years law enforcement experience. He was Captain of the Lea County Department before moving to Denver City.



"I had planned all along to run again for office, but when I had my medical problems, I wanted to be sure I was ready to continue in the office. I am," Rice said.

He added, "I have thoroughly enjoyed my twenty one years living with and working for the folks of Yoakum County. It is a real pleasure to be in a position to serve these people, and

their support and cooperation has been outstanding".

Rice said he had a philosophy about his job; "I've always felt it was very important for me to treat people I deal professionally with in the same manner I would want them to treat me, and all our department officers are expected to operate under the same philosophy, and I feel they do".

Local Gin persuades suppliers to help in fighting weevil war

Marc Traweek, manager of Tokio Co Op Gin, told CCN last week of an innovative idea in getting cotton industry related businesses to help in the area Boll Weevil Eradication Program.

Traweek said it occurred to him there were many other entities on the Southern High Plains with an interest in ridding the area of the expensive cotton pest besides producers and cotton gins.

"I started calling some of our own suppliers and explained to them what I had in mind. Their positive response was really gratifying." Traweek's proposal was this; When we received their monthly statement, before cutting them a check, we would, if they agreed, deduct five percent of the total amount. That money would be set aside until all bills were paid.

The gin contacted Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation officials, explained the scheme, and told them the funds would be sent to the eradication program, provided there was an assurance the money would be used in the local zone's weevil program. They agreed wholeheartedly.

Tokio CoOp supply firms who have agreed to help in this manner to combat the weevil include Beltwide Industries, Lubbock, Tull Supply, Wolforth, Automated Control, Lamesa, W & R Sheetmetal, Brownfiled, Greer Industries, Lubbock, Forche Inc., Levelland, and Traweek says the list of cooperating firms continues to grow.

\$17.6 million bond issue OK'd

On December 1, the South Plains Housing Finance Corporation, a SPAG subsidiary, authorized issuance of \$17.6 million in bonds to make funds available to first time homebuyers. A similar successful bond issue in 1996 provided \$16 million. Both projects were done in partnership with the Lubbock Housing Finance Corporation.

The first time home buyers program makes mortgage loans available to individuals who have not owned a home within the past three years. The loans are at below market interest rates. An attractive feature of the program makes up to 4% of the amount of the mortgage amount available to homebuyers for closing costs and a portion if the down payment, greatly reducing buyers out of pocket costs.

Funds will be available to homebuyers anywhere in the SPAG region through traditional mortgage lenders on January or February. Contact Cecil Lucky in the Economic Development Dept. at SPAG for information, 806-762-8721.

and must serve 240 hours community service. He must not communicate, or go near the victims residence, school or place of employment. He must establish a DNA record with the DPS, pay any counseling costs incurred by the victim, and register as a sex offender. He must pay for sex offenders therapy, and have no unsupervised contact with a minor. He was represented by Attorney Jimmy Hammons.

Lynn Collin Benthall pled true to the state's motion to revoke supervision from a prior Aggravated assault with deadly weapon cause. He shall remain in jail 180 days or until space is available at a substance abuse facility, where he will serve not more than one year

or less than 90 days. He was represented by Attorney Warren New.

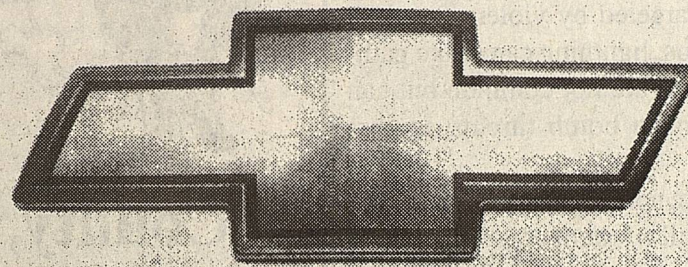

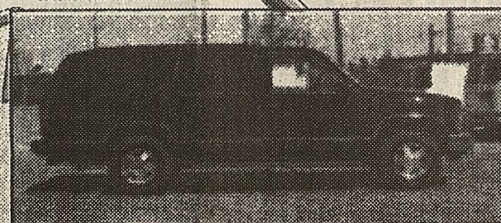
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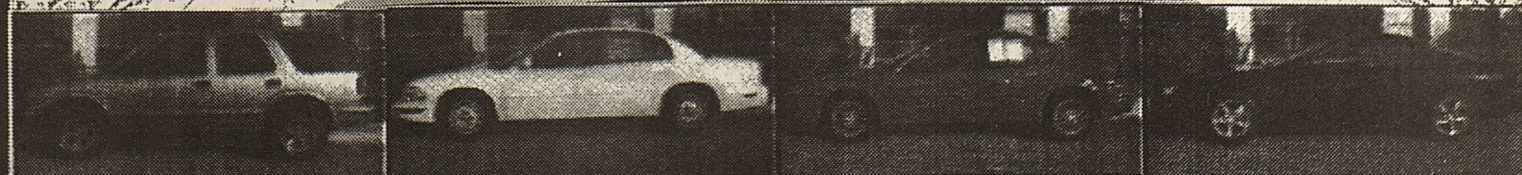
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'Battle in Seattle' assault on Texans; 614,000 jobs tied to exports

AUSTIN — They called it *The Battle in Seattle*, but the vocal and disruptive protestors who created havoc at the World Trade Organization meeting in Seattle earlier this month would have been more honest to label their efforts for what they truly were: *An Assault on American Jobs*.

And since Texas is now the number two exporting state in the entire country, the protests in Seattle were a particular affront to the working men and women of the Lone Star State. We have more to lose in Texas than any state except California, if the naysayers have their way.

While organized labor and narrow special interest groups would have you believe that we'd be better off sealing our borders and calling a halt to international commerce, the old adage about never letting the facts get in the way of a good story richly applies here. In reality, America has prospered greatly from international trade and worlds of new opportunities await us should we adopt policies that lower trade barriers.

The bottom line is that trade is bringing jobs to Texas.

To be precise, a study released last week by Global Trade Information Services, Inc. reported that 614,000 Texas jobs were tied directly or indirectly to international trade. There were more than 117,000 Texas jobs that were tied

directly to country.

Nationally, the United States is the world's largest exporter, selling over 26 percent more products abroad than its nearest competitor. The jobs of millions of American workers, the incomes of farm families, and growth prospects for thousands of American businesses are tied to global trade and the accessibility and stability of worldwide markets. This is reason enough to encourage policy makers to shape the WTO agenda.

Consider the following, which naturally the protestors in Seattle failed to mention:

- 12 million U.S. jobs depend on exports; one in ten U.S. jobs is supported by trade
- One in four American manufacturing jobs is supported by trade
- Over a third of our agricultural products are exported, supporting nearly a million workers

Jobs supported by U.S. exports, directly or indirectly, pay wages that are 13 percent higher than average domestic wages. High technology industry jobs directly supported by exports have average hourly earnings 34 percent higher than the national average.

However, isolationists would have you believe that trade benefits only a few big multinational corporations. The facts shatter that myth as well — fully 13 percent of total U.S. exports are made directly by

small and medium-sized companies.

The increased accessibility to international markets has contributed significantly to the rapid economic growth we have enjoyed over the past five years, and the continuation of the longest peacetime expansion in America's history.

The U.S. economy expanded from about \$7.2 trillion in 1992 to \$8.1 trillion in 1997—exports accounted for one-third, \$320 billion, of that growth. During this period, one out of every six new jobs created was export-related. It is clear that trade is the ticket for a healthy U.S. economy — and that means we need a fair, open trading system.

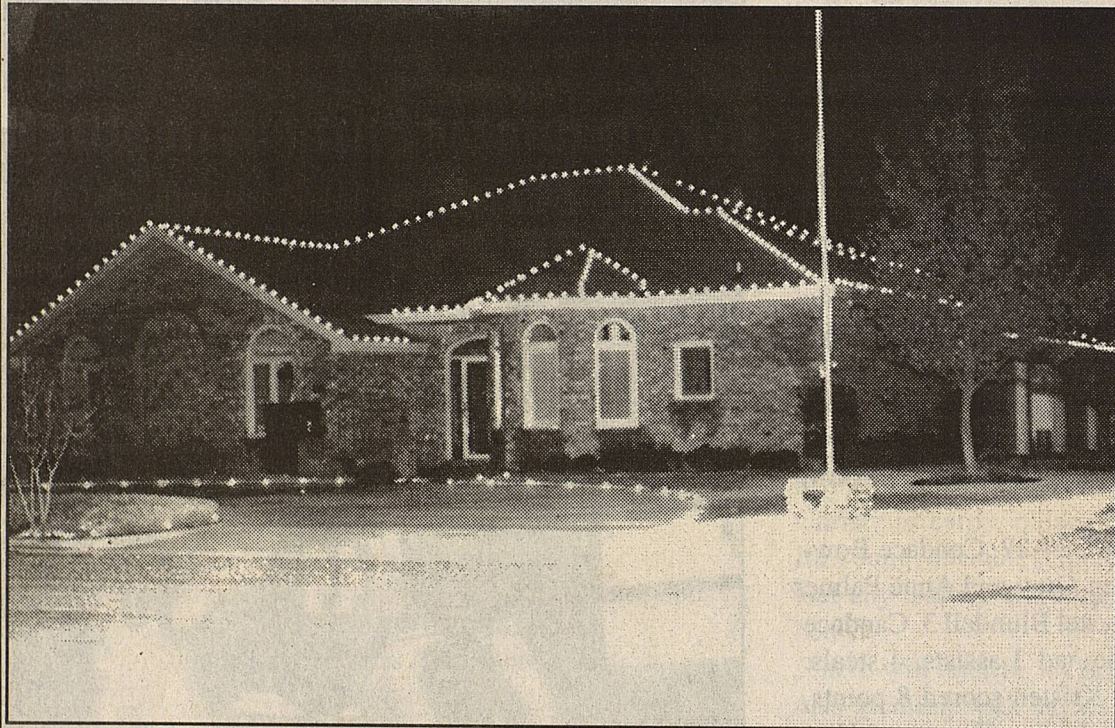
Texas is up to the challenges and opportunities presented by the new millennium. We need trade policies that lower barriers and open markets and that means participating in the only international organization dealing with the global rules of trade between nations. Support for the U.S. agenda at the WTO Ministerial translates into support for the more than 600,000 Texans whose livelihoods are tied directly to international trade.

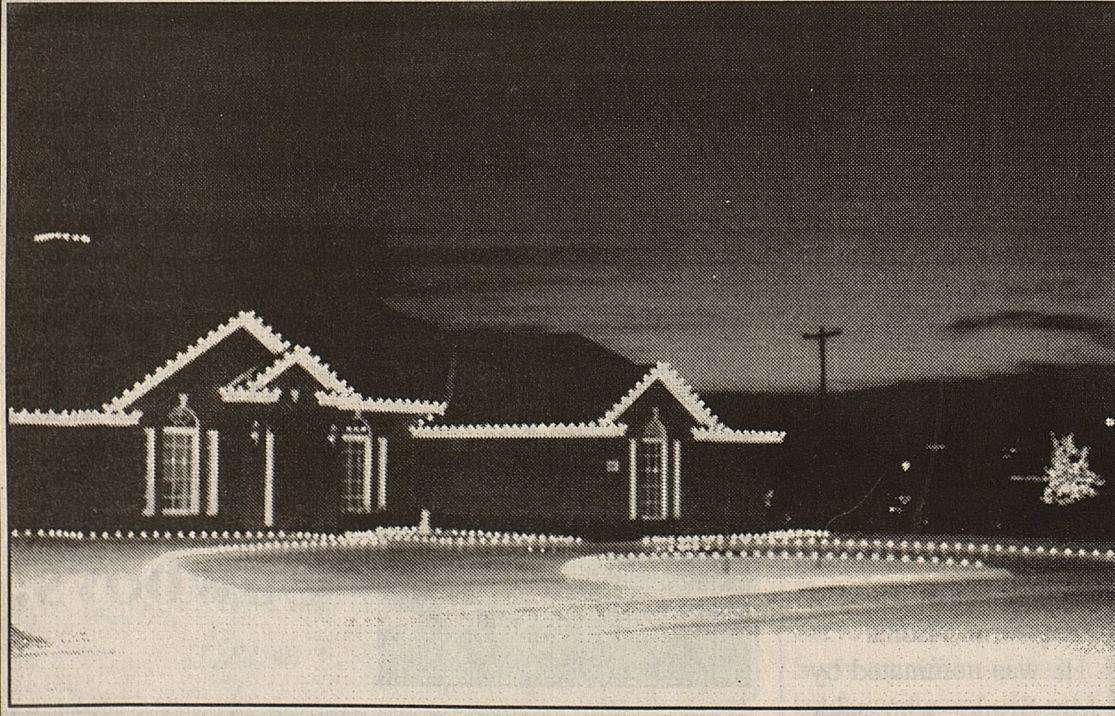

Don't Panic...Be Prepared!

As Commissioner of the Texas Department of Banking, I want to express to the citizens of Texas the Department's confidence in the Texas banking system's preparedness for the Year 2000. Our state banks have reviewed all of their systems, and have tested and re-tested them after making necessary upgrades. Our banks have developed detailed contingency plans to deal with possible power and communication disruptions. The Department also urges citizens to adopt or maintain good financial practices, such as reconciling account statements monthly, and keeping receipts and records of all financial transactions. These

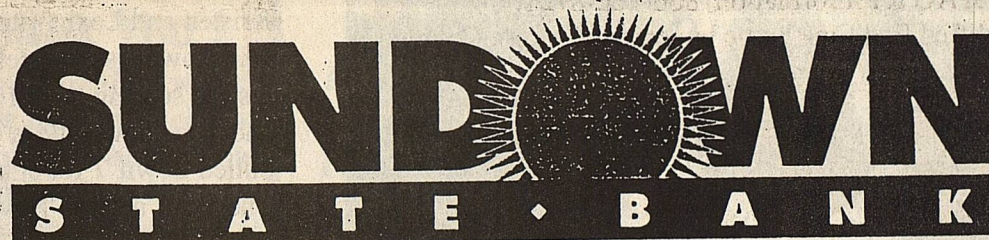
safeguards are always advisable, and ensure that you can identify discrepancies, whether or not they are related to Y2K.

And though we have the utmost confidence in the Texas banking system, you should know that we will be standing ready in full force over the date change to ensure that everything runs smoothly. We will have representatives at all federal bank regulatory agencies in the state, and at the State Office of Emergency Management to exchange information and to quickly resolve any banking related issues that may present themselves. 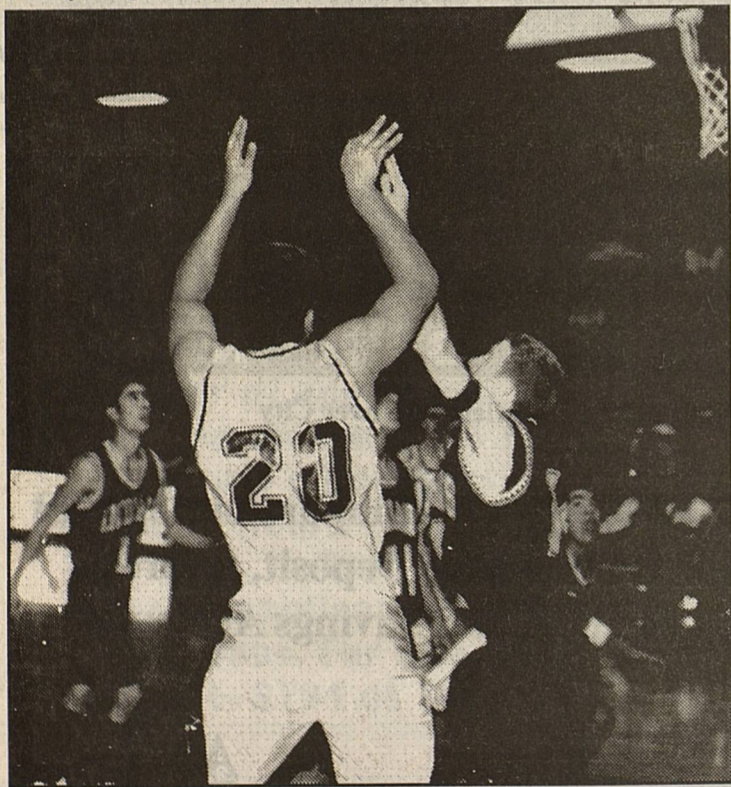

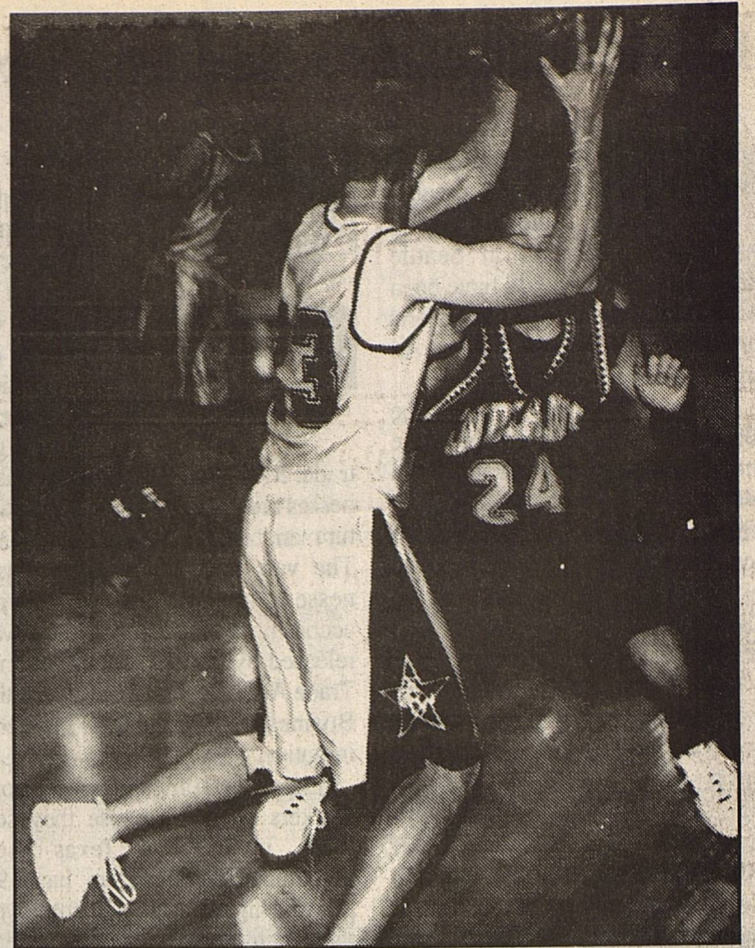
In the Championship game, they faced a good Seminole team and prevailed, 52-49. Jarod poured in 23 points, Aaron had 10, Moises 10.

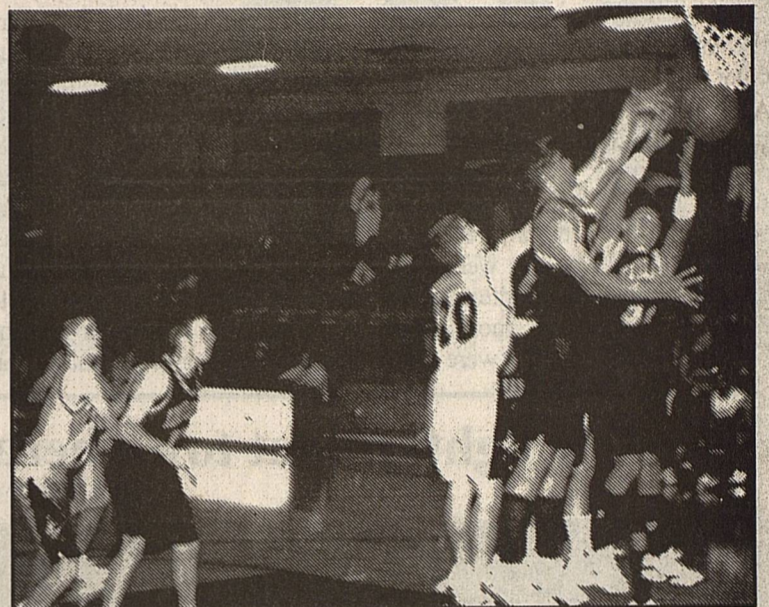
