Obama: Nobel Peace Prize is 'call to action'

(CNN) -- President Obama said Friday that he was "sur-prised and deeply humbled" by the decision of the Norwegian Nobel Committee to award him the 2009 Nobel Peace Prize.

the 2009 Nobel Peace Prize.

The committee said it honored Obama for his "extraordinary efforts to strengthen international diplomacy and coperation between peoples."

Obama said he viewed the decision less as a recognition of his own accomplishments and more as "a call to action."

The decision appeared to

as "a call to action."

The decision appeared to catch most observers by surprise. Nominations for the prize had to be postmarked by February 1, only 12 days after Obama took office. The committee sent out its solicitation for nominations last September, two months before Obama was elected president.

Obama had not been men for the prize, and the roomful of reporters gasped when Thorb-jorn Jagland, chairman of the Nobel committee, announced Nobel committee, announced that the president was the win-

"Only very rarely has a person to the same extent as Obama captured the world's attention and given its people hope for a better future," the committee

Obama said he did not feel he deserved "to be in the company" of past Peace Prize winners, but would accept the prize while pushing for a broad range of international objectives, including nuclear nonproliferation, a reversal of the global economic downtum and a resolution of the Arab-Israeli conflict. He also acknowledged the ongoing U.S. conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan, noting that he is the "commander in chief of a country that is responsible for ending a war and working in another theater to confront a ruthless adversary that directly

other theater to confront a ruth-less adversary that directly threatens the American people" and U.S. allies. "This award is not simply about my administration," he said. It "must be shared" with everyone who strives for "justice and dignity."
