Beam and the Knights of the Ku. Klux Klan from maintaining or associating as a military organization; from engaging in any millitary or
paramilitary training: from parading with firearms paramilikary training; from parading with firearms
in pubtic on either land or waler; and from engaging in other activitias calculated to violate the civil rights of the plaintiff class. I am extremaiy pleased and gratitied by the
courts decision to prohibit- activities by an courr's decision to prohibit- activities by an
organization such as the Ku Klux Klan, which has its foundation in hatred and prejudice and encourages divisiven
As I promised to do when intervened in il suit, I have successtully joined with the plaintift: oo prevent illegal ectivities which would violate the individual rights and threaten the safety of our
law-abiding crizens. Violence and intimidation must not be permitted to exist in violation of state law, which in this case was designed to prohibit terrorism and vigilante actritites in Texas. This issue reaches direclly to the heart of what this
country is all about and to the foundation of the State of Texas. I know you also will be happy to hear that the
court has sustained our position in this case.
