





The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is lausching a summer safety compaign to encourage motorists to pay particular attention to motorcyclists. The primary message is to look twice for metercyclists. As part of the campaign, TxDOT is continuing un important partnership with the Texas Motorcycle Roadriders Association, an organization involved in educating riders and others about the bene-

Russian police acknowledge burnen trafficking for sexual exploitation is a major problem, saying they do what they can to fight it by ruding brothele sespected of forced prostumion and arresting gang numbers who run them. But the problem, they say, lies elsewhere.

"First of all, we have virtually open borders, and badly controlled migration flows from nearby countries," says Alexander Krasnov of Russia's Interior Ministry Police.

"Secondly, we still don't have a basic law that defines victims' rights. At the moment, it's mostly wid agencies that deal with it."

Aid agencies say they are handling a growing number of deeply traumatized victims rescued from brothela and pumps in the Moscow area. One U.N. organization, the International Organization for Migration, recently opened a treatment and rehabilitation center to cope with the large numbers of securily exploited and trafficked women who come for help.

At this center, Christine, a 27year-old Nigerian woman, tells how she acquired a prinful 4-mch scar across her right cheek. She says she was lined to Russia from Nigeria four years ago by her uncle. He promised to give her a college education, she says.

But instead, she says he sent her to a Moscow brothel. He told her "the kind of job I'm going to be doing is prostitution."

"I ask him, "Why prostitution? Why not another job to pay the money? He says, I didn't speak the language. I cannot do any Plus adds, "It made not fool way but I led that I'm not going

to do it ever my dead body."

Aid workers say Rossia has become a printe destination for trafficked women – from Affica, the Far Fast and former Soviet states. There are no exact figures, but aid agencies estimate theoremits of trafficked women are on Moscow's structs.

"Before it was just a country of origin for Europe and the U.S. and observatore in the world," says Kadyrova of the Angel Coalition, "But right now we see that Russiahas become a destination country also."

According to the group? Web site, human traffickers "prey on the dreams of improperished women seeking employment and opportunities for the future." Most women are young and single with little education, some are orphans and college students, others are married with children.

"All of them are limed by advertising images of a beautiful life beyond the borders of their homelands — making them easy prey to the thousands of traffickers advertising in new papers, on radio, television, in the metro and on the streets for wenderful work abroad with no experience necessary," the group says.

For millions, Russia's new economic prosperity has been a blessing. But for those caught up in the sex trade, it's a curse.

Christine says she managed to escape after meeting a wuman from a church who helped her. "I was crying all the time, telling her, "I don't want this kind of job," " she






