Revised Formula Puts 1 in 6 Americans in Poverty

WASHINGTON (AP) --

WASHINGTON (AP) -The level of poverty in America
is even worse than first believed.
A revised formula for calculating medical costs and geographic variations show that
approximately 47.4 million
Americans last year lived in
poverty, 7 million more than the
government's official figure.
The disparity occurs because

The disparity occurs because of differing formulas the Census Bureau and the National Academy of Science use for calculating the poverty rate. The NAS formula shows the poverty rate to be at 15.8 percent, or nearly 1 in 6 Americans, according to calculations released this week. That's higher than the 13.2 per-cent, or 39.8 million, figure made available recently under original government for

That measure, created in 1955, does not factor in rising medical care, transportation, child care or geographical vari ations in living costs. Nor does it consider non-cash government aid when calculating income. As a result, official figures released last month by Census may have overlooked millions of poor peo-ple, many of them 65 and older. According to the revised NAS

formula:
-About 18.7 percent of Americans 65 and older, or nearly 7.1 million, are in poverty compared to 9.7 percent, or 3.7 million, under the traditional measure. That's due to out-of-pocket ex-penses from rising Medicare premiums, deductibles and a coverage gap in the prescription

-About 14.3 percent of people 18 to 64, or 27 million, are in poverty, compared to 11.7 per-cent under the traditional meas-ure. Many of the additional poor are low-income, working people with transportation and child-

-Child poverty is lower, at about 17.9 percent, or roughly 13.3 million, compared to 19 percent under the traditional measure. That's because single mothers and their children disproportionately receive non-cash

aid such as food stamps.

-Poverty rates were higher for non-Hispanic whites (11 percent), Asians (17 percent) and Hispanics (29 percent) when compared to the traditional measure. For blacks, poverty remained flat at 24.7 percent, due to the cushioning effect of non-

The Northeast and West sa bigger jumps in poverty, due largely to cities with higher costs of living such as New Y Boston, Los Angeles and

The Census Bureau said it ex pedited release of the alternative numbers for this month because of the interest expressed by law-makers and the Obama adminisration in seeing a fuller range of numbers. Legislation pending in Congress would mandate a switch to the revised formula, al-though the White House could

choose to act on its own.

Arloc Sherman, a senior researcher at the nonprofit Center
on Budget and Policy Priorities,

"Food stamp participation rose during the first year of re-cession and appears to have soft-ened what could have been an even greater increase in financial hardship," he said.

Sherman said the revised for mula could take on greater importance in measuring poverty for 2009 as more Americans take advantage of tax credits and food stamps under the federal stimulus program. Food stamp assistance currently is at an all-time high of about 36 million.

Prompt Passage of Economic Recovery Act Payment for 2010 Needed Law Does Not Provide for a Social Security Cost-of-Living Adjustment for 2010

With consumer prices down over the past year, monthly Social Security and Supplemental Security Income benefits for more than 57 million Americans will not automatically increase in 2010. This will be the first year without an automatic Cost of-Living Adjustment (COLA) since they went into effect in

Social Security is doing its job helping Americans maintain their standard of living," Michael J. Astrue, Commis-sioner of Social Security said. "Last year when consumer prices spiked, largely as a result of higher gas prices, beneficiar-ies received a 5.8 percent COLA, the largest increase since 1982. This year, in light of the

The Social Security Act pr The Social Security Act provides that Social Security and Supplemental Security Income benefits increase automatically each year if there is an increase in the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) from the third quarter of the last year to the third quarter of the current year. This year there was no increase in the CPI-W from the third quarter of 2008 to the third quarter of 2009. In addition, because there was no increase in the CPI-W this year, under the law the starting point for determinations regarding a possible 2011 COLA will remain the third quarter of 2008.

Some other changes that would normally take effect in January 2010 based on the increase in average wages also will not take effect, even though average wages did increase. Since there is no COLA, the statute prohibits an increase in the maximum amount of earnings subject to the Social Secu-rity tax as well as the retirement earnings test exempt amounts. These amounts will remain un-changed in 2010. The attached fact sheet provides more infor-mation on 2010 Social Security

Information about Medicare changes for 2010, when available, will be found at www.Medicare.gov. The Department of Health and Human Services has not yet announced if there will be any Medicare premium changes for 2010. Should there be an increase in the Medicare Part B premium, the law contains a "hold harmless" provision that protects





From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith On Justice Clarence Thomas!!

One of my Anglo -American ttorney friends is very fond of Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas. She reminded me in a conversation that African-Americans should not be negative about Justice Thomas because he stands out as a great American and for justice for all Americans. My response was "we as humans have our own opinion and as African Americans we may perceive life differently as justice relates to African-Amer-

However, to my chagrin (relating to the non-action of Justice Thomas) I was totally surprise at a news story caption: "Clarence Thomas To Other Supreme

Court Justices: Be Quiet". Jay Reeve wrote: Clarence Thomas, the justice long known as the silent member of the Supreme Court, criticized his colleagues Friday (October 23, 2009) for badgering attorneys rather than letting them speak during oral arguments. Thomas

– who hasn't asked a lawyer a question during arguments in nearly four years—said he and the other eight justices virtually always know where they stand on a case by reading legal briefs

before oral arguments.

"So why do you beat up on people if you already know? I don't know, because I don't beat up on 'em. I refuse to partici-pate. I don't like it, so I don't do it," Thomas said during an ap-pearance before law students at

the University of Alabama.
Thomas didn't name names, but fellow conservative Justice Antonin Scalia is generally considered the court's most aggressive questioner during oral argu-ments. President Barack Obama's lone nominee so far, Justice Sonia Sotomayor, isn't afraid to ask questions either. Thomas scoffed at the idea that the justices try to use questions the justices try to use questions to influence the opinions of fellow member of the court. "All nine of us are in the same building," he said. "If we want to sway each other we know where we are. We don't need oral argu-



Those not protected include higher income beneficiaries subject to an income-adjusted Part B premium and beneficiaries newly entitled to Part B in 2010. On September 24th, the House passed legislation by 406-18 that would, on a fully paid-for basis, prevent abnormally large premium increases. The President is calling on the Senate to enact this legislation before it becomes too late for the Social Security Administration to update its computer systems to implement this needed change.






