Hard Line Drug Warrior Appointed Drop Czar-

WASHINGTON D.C .-President Bush today appoints John Walters as Director of the Office of National Drug control Policy. Walters is a protege' of William Bennett, the first drug czar, and favors military eradication in the Andes incarceration at home and escalation of marijuana penalties. He has not shown concern about he racial : discrepancy in drug enforcement, has not been a strong advocate for treating addiction and has opposed voter initiatives on medical marijuana and other

Walters testified before the Senate Judiciary Committee in 1996 urging continued US support for the Peruvian aircraft was shotdown by the Peruvian government. Agents of the US government provided the intelligence for the shorting

Walters has also denied that the drug war, is racially enfair despite two-thirds of those incarcerated for drug offenses being Black. Walters has veriden it was appropriate for African. Americans to be incarcerated at higher rates since they commit more crimes

Walters joins what is becoming a leadership team of find lines. Anomey General John Asheroff was an appressive diagwar advocate and early in his term as Attorney General said he wanted to "escalate the war on drugs." Rep. Asa Hutchison (R-AR), a hard line drug war has been formally announced as the nominee for head of the US Drug Enforcement Administration, and former DEA Administrator Jack Lawn is supposedly being considered for FBI Director. The Bush administration on deags seems to be going in the opposite direction of the US public which has voted for over a dose reform initiatives in the last three elections.

"The leadership of drug policy in the Bush administration is one that will continue down the drug war path without examining the facts or history of this approach. We can expect an expanded war in the Andes, continued expension of the drugprison population and continuation of strategies that have resulted in increasing adolescent drug abuse as well as increasing death and disease related to drugs," claimed Kevin B. Zeene, President, Common Sense for Drug Policy. "If you've liked the drug war so fur you will like what is coming because it will be more of the some."

Green Thumb Program Still Helping People





You don't have to - have a green thumb to participate in the Green Thumb Program! Green Thumb participants perform a variety of different job duties depending on where they are assigned to work and what type of work is needed. However, for the two Green Thumb participants assigned to the City of Slaton - having an aptitude for grounds keeping certainly helps, especially in the spring and summer months when the two men work primarily in the local parks or keeping the weeds down around the city.

With the recent rains it's an ongoing process

Green Thumb, Inc. is funded by the Department of Labor and is designed to assist low-income individuals age 55 years or older with employment and training needs. To qualify for Green Thumb, federal lowincome guidelines must be met. Once enrolled in Green Thumb, if the participant is not job ready, this is a usually due to long term one employment, or outdated job skills in the field they want to pursue; participants are assigned to state, federal, local governments, city, county or a 501 C3 non-profit organization known as "Host Agencies." The participant works approximately 20 hours per week and is paid minimum wage by Green Thumb. The "Host Agency" provides day to day supervision, instruction and training, which will prepare the participant for a paid position off the program either with the "Host Agency" or with a private employer.

For job ready participants Green Thumb provides job development, referral and job search training to participants.

Green Thumb, Inc. can also assist private employers by offering an on-the-job training for Green Thumb's Job Ready. Participants who might need a short training for a special job opening. Green Thumb can reimburse 50 of a the wage to the employer for a short training period.

from the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith *"Where Does Your Seed Fall?"

One of the fundamental parts of the life of ancient Palestine was the planting, cultivating, and harvesting of crops. History tells us that since farmers often produced surplus of food, other rural people had the freedom to pursue occupations and professions not directly related to farming.

Since most of the farmers in our area use high powered, high dollar, and high tech equipment to produce crops, it may be hard for us to understand the farming of ancient time.

In order to plant their crops, farmers first would break up the hard soil by using crude wooden plows, which oxen or other animals pulled. Additional workers would follow behind carrying seeds in a jar, basket, or sack. They would grab a handful of the seeds and scatter them on the ground.

After the seeds had been planted, they would be covered up to prevent such birds as ravens and crows from consuming them.

Since many of the followers of Jesus were farmers, they could identify with parables and especially "the Parable of the Sower." They knew, the importance of carefully planting seed so as to produce a bountiful har- the Word of God but does not understand it. To this person these things are vest.

The parable of the sower in Matthew's Gospel tells the story of a crop, the different kinds of soils where he planted his crop would determine how the plants would grow.

Most of you who read this are Bible scholars and you are familiar with the four outcomes of the parable three in which people don't remain committed and one in which a person does. However, let me refresh your

First some seeds fell by the wayside. Jewish farmers planted their crops in long, narrowed rows. The ground between these rows was often used as walloways by persons walking through the field. Over time, these paths would be walked down and would become hard. Seeds that fell on this

ground were quickly eaten by birds.

Second, some seeds fell on stony ground. This was more or less a mixture of soil and rocks with a hard layer of stone a few inches beneath the topsoil. When seeds fell on this surface, they began to grow. Yet when the roots of these plants penetrated the earth for nourishment, they can into the hard rock. As such, they could not receive the nutrients they needed to sustain themselves. As a result, they withered in the scorching heat of the sun.

Third, some seeds fell among thorns. Much like those that fell on rocky ground, they took roots and began to grow. When weeds with thorns grew alongside the young sprouts, however, they were crowded out. New plants with tender roots were unable too grow amidst the robust plot of

Fourth, some seeds fell on good soil, which as fertile and free from rocks and thorns. This was the ideal setting for crops to grow. Seed planted here germinated and yielded phenomenal harvests of up to one hundred times what had been sown.

How does this parable apply to us in the 21St Century? First, the wayside where some seeds fell is like a person who hears

foolishness. Second, there are those who joyfully receive God's Word when



Badge Fraud by John Cornyn, Attorney General of Texas

Q: I: recently. received a. phime call asktion to benefit widows of stain

police officers. How can I make sure that such request are legitimate and families of officers?

A: Many charitable organizations are sponsored by law enforcement agencies and work to help public safety personnel and their families. For support for the men and women who protect and serve their communities

Protection Division receives inquiries and complaints about organizations that aren't what they seem to be. There are scam artists who prey on people's willingness to help our men and women in uniform by soliciting donations to false charities or subscriptions to non-existent law enforcement publications. These types of scams are called a badge fraud."

Texas Secretary of State. You can find out if a group is registered by calling the Secretary of State at (512) 463-0775. However, registration with the Secretary of State does not mean that the organization has the approval or endorsement of the State of Texas.

If you get a call soliciting donations for a public safety organization, ask for the caller's complete identification, including the name of the organigation he or she represents. Just because an organization h as "police," "firefighter," or "sheriff" in its name, doesn't mean it is actually affiliated that my donation will actually help the with a public safety group, or that public safety officers and their families

Q: What are you doing to protect consumers from these phony charities?

A: Together with the Harris County attorney we recently took action against several fraudulent telemarketing operations that were posing as law enforcement magazines. In one case, we won a temporary restraining order against one man that forbids him to operate a telemarketing operation until he is in compliance with Texas-

In another case, we won a permanent injunction against three men for selling advertisements in nonexistent publications. The men were barred from conducting any type of telemarketing operation, and they were assessed \$20,000 in fines and penalties and \$60,000 in attorneys' fees. They were also undered to pay \$220,000 in





KNOW YOUR CITY GOVERNMENT by Eddie P. Richardson

(This is a series of stories which will give the citizens a close look at their city government, namely; its origin, function, every department, and other important matters. This information was supplied by the Texas Municipal League (TML) Tony Privitt, Lubbock Public Information officer.)

Lubbock City-County Library

BRIEF HISTORY The roots of public library service in Lubbock reach beyond Lubbock's incorporation as a City. It started with the Bullion sisters who brought a wagonload of books from Colorado City in 1892. Modern library service began in 1954 with the opening of the Main Library on 19th Street, Lubbock's steady growth, however, called for a new main. library, named after U.S. Congressman George Mahon and his wife, Helen. The current main library, "Mahon", opened in 1974. Thereafter, as Lubbock continued to prosper, branch libraries were built in 1980 (Godeke), 1995 (Patterson) and 1996 (Groves) - to take library service to Lubbock neighborhoods.

Lubbock citizens have always expected much from their public library. Service demands to be met by local fundir have always been a challenge. Now the Library seeks to meet the need not just for "more books", but also the newer formats computer technology, Books on CD, Books on tape, music and video.

The journey of 1892 was through a time of few people and fewer "books". Today's library must serve a community of more than 200,000 people, giving them powerful information resources for the 21st Century.
