**Police Exonerated For Shooting Man**

**BROWNSVILLE, Sept. 23 (AP)**—Four Brownsville policemen have been exonerated by Chief of Police Duncan Wright following the fatal shooting of a former Baltimore, Md., cab driver, identified as Robert Lee Howell, 34.  
Wright said the man was killed in a gun battle in the Brownsville police station Saturday. Wright said the man grabbed a .45 caliber gun from the night sergeant's desk and began shooting wildly through the room occupied by the four officers and a civilian. Police returned the fire, Wright said.  
Coroner Fred Kowalski pronounced a verdict of death from gunshot wounds at the hands of officers acting in performance of their official duties.

# State Official Among Four Dead In Wrecks

Four persons, including the chairman of the State Board of Control and a former member of the Texas legislature, died as a result of weekend traffic accidents.

Two other accidental deaths brought the weekend total to six. In Austin the State Department of Public Safety has reported that Texas traffic accidents have increased 42 per cent during the past eight months, with 1,185 persons killed in traffic accidents during that period. For a comparative period last year, 835 persons were killed.

Weaver Baker, former law partner of Gov. Coke R. Stevenson and chairman of the State Board of Control, is believed to have died instantly from injuries received when the station wagon he was driving overturned and struck a post near Austin after having failed to make a curve yesterday morning.

Gov. Stevenson returned to Austin from his Kimble county ranch upon being notified of Baker's death.

S. D. Shannon, 79, of Fort Worth, a former state representative, received fatal injuries in an automobile collision near Scotland, Archer county, yesterday.

Three servicemen, injured in the crash, are in a Wichita Falls hospital.

At Tyler, Fredman Clark, 32, died in an airplane crash yesterday from injuries received in an automobile collision Saturday night on the Henderson highway.

Mrs. Anna L. Adams, 40, was found dead on a highway near Houston Saturday night. Deputy Sheriff Vic Parker said she had been struck by an automobile.

Patsy Bagwell, 49, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Bagwell of near Bronco, Tex., drowned yesterday morning while wading in the stock tank on her parents' farm.

Alberto Lopez, 70, was killed when struck by an iron bucket filled with gravel while working at the bottom of a 25-foot well at Sabinal Saturday. A rope suspending the bucket over the well broke.

# Surplus Scout Cars On Sale For Vets

Veterans will have an opportunity to purchase 810 army scout cars located at Red River arsenal, 13 miles west of Texarkana, until Oct. 3, the War Assets Administration has announced.

These cars, which originally cost the government \$4,130 each, are standard army equipment. Inspection may be made daily between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., except Saturday and Sunday, until Sept. 27. The vehicles have been priced tagged at \$350 each. Orders will be accepted at the WAA office of inter-regional sales, T&P building, Fort Worth.

Conditions of sale specify that veterans purchasers shall use the cars in their own small business, professional or agricultural enterprise.

Following in priority order with the same sale and inspection dates are reconstruction finance corporation for resale, state and local governments and non-profit institutions.

# Lightning Causes Electrical Display

DALLAS, Sept. 23. (AP)—A bolt of lightning which struck a power plant substation during a heavy thunderstorm here last night caused an electrical display that brought many puzzled queries to Dallas police.

Lights in suburban University Park and Highland Park were cut off temporarily as the arc from the damaged transformer blanketed the two cities with a weird light bright enough to illuminate the dial of numbers on a telephone, one witness reported.

Police said many persons asked if the combination red, green and white lights were caused by an atomic bomb.

Mrs. Tom Lovelace of Eastland has been serving as president pro tem.

Tentative plans are being made for a meeting next month at Abilene.

# Texas Public Works Congress Holds Meet

FORT WORTH, Sept. 23. (AP)—A three-day convention of the American Public Works Congress was to open here today with an estimated 500 delegates from throughout the nation in attendance.

The group will conduct discussions on sanitation, airport expansion, highway development, aviation taxation and city-employee relations.

L. M. Johnson of Chicago, president of the congress, arrived here yesterday to attend a directors meeting for completion of convention arrangements.

# Norris Completes 50 Years Service

FORT WORTH, Sept. 23. (AP)—The Rev. J. Frank Norris, pastor of the First Baptist Church here and the Temple Baptist Church at Detroit, has completed a half century of service in the Baptist ministry.

In special services here yesterday, Norris said he will dedicate himself to doubling the present membership of the Fort Worth church. The services also marked his 38th year as pastor here and his 12th year as pastor of the Detroit church.

"There has been some discussion that I might leave Fort Worth," he said. "I expect to spend the balance of my life here and I am dedicating myself to doubling the membership of our church."

Combined membership of the two churches total more than 22,000.

BOSTON, Sept. 23. (AP)—Unable to obtain any other red meat, the Massachusetts General Hospital has begun serving horsemeat to its personnel and will start feeding it to patients this week.

Dr. Nathaniel W. Faxon, medical director of the hospital, said in a bulletin to personnel and patients that horsemeat would be a "satisfactory and tasty substitute" for the more conventional meats.

Other hospitals in the greater Boston area said that they have experienced no difficulty as yet and that beef stocks have been adequate, although not plentiful.
