

COLUMBUS, OHIO- More than \$100,000 in grants was recently awarded to non-profit organizations throughout the country during the annual meeting of the Jack and Jill of America Foundation held this year in St. Louis, Missouri. Distinguished trustees, including Foundation board representatives of Jack and Jill of America, Inc. and its seven geographic regions gathered for a weekend to make the final determination of annual awards and announce the grant recipients in five major proposal categories.

Jack and Jili of America, Inc. was a first among African-American national service organizations to create a philanthropic arm. Established in 1968, the Foundation has acted to influence the ongoing positive development of children and awarded more than three million dollars in annual grants to charitable organizations that benefit minority children. The organization is supported by funds from local chapters of the parent organization as well as corporations, other foundations, matching funds, and friends of the organization. The mission of the Foundation in the 21st Century is to furnish personal, professional and financial support to children in the areas of leadership skills, training and development. The Foundation desires to promote the excellent preparation of succeeding generations of children, in all walks of life, so that they may attain their fullest potential as individuals, enjoy rewarding and fulfilling lives, and contribute to world peace, progress, and. prosperity. The Jack and Jill of America Foundation is headquartered in Columbus, Ohio. Annual meetings of the organization are held in various areas across the country by invitation of a local chapter of Jack and Jill of America, Inc.







boneless, skinless chicken breasts, or leftover cooked chicken, cut into cubes 2 or strips, measuring 1 cup

tablespoons olive oil, divided 2

cup commeal or all-purpose flour, for rolling dough 1/4

4" ball of prepared Dough (recipe follows), or purchased frozen dough, at 1 room temperature

1/4 cup hoisin sauce (available in the Asian section of most grocery stores) scallions (green onions)^ finely sliced 4

2/3 cup cilantro leaves, stems discarded before measuring

1/2 red bell pepper, sliced info paper-thin strips

cup mozzarella cheese, grated 1

Sea salt and freshly ground pepper

Brush chicken breasts lightly with olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Grill over direct heat 10-15 minutes, turning once halfway through, until well-cooked (internal temperature will read 165° F). Remove from grill. When cool, cut into 1/2 inch strips and set aside.

Lightly sprinkle work surface with cornmeal or flour. Place dough directly in the middle of the work surface. Roll out gently into either a 12" rectangle or circle; 1/4" thick. Brush both sides with remaining 2 tablespoons olive oil and set aside until ready to grill.

Place dough in center of the cooking grate and grill directly over medium heat for 2-4 minutes, until the bottom of the crust is well marked and browned. Remove from grill and spread hoisin sauce evenly over cooked side of crust. Sprinkle chicken, scallions, cilantro and red pepper evenly over crust. Top with cheese. If using a gas grill, switch to indirect heat. Return pizza to the center of the cooking grate and cook with the lid closed until bottem is well browned, toppings are warm and cheese is bubbly, about 5-10 minutes.

Remove from grill and season to taste. Slice and serve immediately. Makes 1 12" Pizza

Shopping Safety on the Internet

Q: I like the idea of shopping online for the holidays. but I have heard so many horror stories about that never arrived or products that weren't quite as advertised.

Plus it seems like Internet businesses go out of business so often these days.

Any thoughts on how I can shop safely?

A: Online shopping is becoming an increasingly popular way of shopping for many who are pressed for time. You can take care of your entire holiday gift list with a few clicks of your mouse. However, some online companies out there are not what they seem to

help you avoid running into problems in the first place.

Always try to deal with well known retailers. Be cautious of online stores that have names that are similar to other well known companies. These names may simply be a trick to get you to reveal your personal information. Find out if the seller is based overseas. This can affect both delivery time and shipping costs. It can also make it more difficult toreturn items.

Only shop at sites that protect credit card information. If you don't know about a site' s security program, ask the company directly.

Use your credit card to make online purchases rather than a debit card. This way, if you have a problem with the company or the merchandise, you can dispute it through the credit caru company.

Or consider sending your payment by mail. Make sure you find out about the site's privacy policy. Too many sites automatically collect information about you and your online shopping habits and then share it with other companies, advertisers or marketers.

Ask about shipping and delivery fees. Remember that the closer you get to the holidays, the more it may cost for you to ship your purchases.

Children Need at Least Nine Hours of Dream Time Each Night


(NAPS)-It's that time. again! The kids need new backpacks, sharpened pencils, and nutritious school lunches. But don't forget something else they need for a successful school day-at least nine hours of restful sleep each night.

That's right! The National Center on Sleep Disorders Research at the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI) is advising parents that most children need at least nine hours of sleep each night to do their best in school, sports, family relationships and friendships, and other activities.

According to NHLBI Director Dr. Claude Lenfant, "We want parents of young children to understand that adequate nighttime sleep is important to children's healthy safety, and performance, and we would like to see children establish a-good night's sleep as a lifelong habit."

Of course, getting children to sleep at night can be a challenge. But the NHLBI has some tips for parents that should help:

1. Set a regular time for it.



3. Make after-dinner play time a relaxing time; too much exercise close to bedtime can keep children awake.

4. Avoid feeding children a big meal close to bed time.

5. Avoid giving children anything with caffeine less than six hours before bedtime.

6. Set the bedroom temperature so that it's comfortable -- not too warm and not too cool.

7. Make sure the bedroom is dark; if necessary, use a small nightlight.


8. Keep the noise level low.


