



And it's interesting who finds him there—a woman, and one with several strikes against her, at least in the eyes of those in Jesus' traveling party. She's a

Gentile, an unclean non-Jew, and a Canaanite, traditional enemy of the Jews. This Canaanite woman also came with a great need—her daughter with a great need—her daugnter was under demonic influence, and it seems there is no one else in her life to help or support her. Her predicament may have prompted some qualities Jesus must have found refreshing in

this new location of ministry.

was a long way from nome and this foreign woman shouldn't have been "in the know," she sought out and identified Jesus and then rightly discerned him as the Lord and Son of David (Matthew 15:22). That was more

woman humbled herself before Jesus. Knowing she deserved nothing, she still cried out for mercy for herself and her daughter. One has to pay that \$155.00 for medical services before Medicare will kick in to make any payments.

Medical care from licensed personnel is costly enough, but personnel is costly enough, but when one goes to get the prescriptions filled, it is possible to be looking at over \$200.00 to fill just one, especially if you have a chronic ailment like asthma. There is no generic for some of the high priced drugs, therefore, even if you have drug coverage, you may still be faced with paying about one half of the retail. ing about one half of the retail price for a month's supply. If you do not have drug coverage, you will have to pay the full retail price or leave the prescription with the pharmacy. I have no idea how many seniors leave the costly drugs with the pharmacy, but Advair, the frequently advertized remedy for asthma has been left with the pharmacy ing about one half of the retail

Every person who had asthma when Advair was not available did not necessarily die from asthma, and I feel that I will not either. Nasonex is another high priced nose spray for people with allergies.
