## Bill Clinton Predicts Obama Will Win Big

NEW YORK - Barack Obams and former President Clinton tallord for two hours on Thursday, their first meeting in a White House moe that had once bitterfy divided them. Clinton predicted that Ohama will win

the presidency "pretty handily." Their conversation started with small palk about the former president's commute to his Harlem office and ended after a lunch of sandwiches, flathread pezza and salad from Cosi.

"They discussed the campaign briefly, but mostly talked about how the world has changed since September 11, 2001," their spokesmen said in a joint statement. The meeting came on the seventh anniversary of the attacks and shortly before Obama was to visit Ground Zuro with Republican presidential

rival John McCain. Reporters were allowed in ut the beginning of the meeting in Clinton's 14th floor office, but the former president kept his priswers short when he was asked about his involvement with Ohama's campaign this

Hillary Rodbam Clinton of New York: After Obems clinched the party's namination, both Clintons gave strong speeches in Obassa's Isvor during the party convention in Denver.

Obuma's visit to Clinton's Harlem office, which overlooks Central Park, sparked excite--torut in the neighborhood, with people crowding around police burricades that shut off the block. The two men briefly appeared in front of the building, where a large group bad been waiting for hours in hopes of a glimpur.

People screamed loudly and snapped cell phone pictures when the two emerged. Obums ducked back in the building with Clinton after a few waves but without shaking hunds.

Their spokesmen said the two men were complimentary of each other's work, with Obama praising the Clinton Foundation. and Cliston applicading the candidate's campaign.

"They also spoke about what the next president can do to help make the economy work for ell Americans, as it did under President Clinton, and ensure salety and prosperity far beyond the coming the election," their joint statement said.

### Secretary Rice Calls Lack of Black Diplomats "Unacceptable"

UNCFSP Initiative Prepares African American Students for Global Careers

Fairfax, (BlackNews.com) - U.S. Secretary of State Condolecza Rice recently called the pancity agency "unacceptable," saying that she would like see more African American students interested in foreign affairs careers. Speaking Washington, D.C. at a conference convened by the White House Initiative on Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), Rice commented on how she can participate in an entire day of meetings at the agency without seeing "somebody who looks like her." She later called on HBCUs and other conference attendoes to help

address this disparity. For the past fourteen years, the Institute for International Public Policy (IIPP), a program of the United Negro College Fund Special Programs Corporation (UNCFSP) has worked to increase the number of students from HBCUs particinsting in the IIFP's Fellowship Program The Fellowshipwhich also includes Hispanic Americans, Native Americans and Asim-Pacific Islanders-is one of the nation's most prestigious programs for minority students interested in pursuing careers in seternational affairs.

Dutryl Crompton, IIPP Director says, "Our goal has always been to put highly eduested, well-trained professionals into the international affairs pipeline, preparing them to eventually assume leadership roles; the IIPP surely represents Secretary Bioc's call for global workforce diversity. We're proint that seventy two percent of our Fellows are women and one hundred percent are from underrepresented groups. #### O.J. Simpson Jury Neither His Dream Nor Nightmare

LAS VEGAS (AF) - R is not the jury of O.J. Simpson's dreams, but neither done it shape: up to be his nightmate.

The all-white jury that co-Monday will begin judging him and a co-defoudant on robbery and kidnepping charges was culled from an initial pool of 500 who answered questionnaires, and the remaining dozens who were later quizzed in the poortroom.

Prosecutors removed two prospective African-American justors with their challenges.

Simpson's lawyers managed. to climinate those with the strongest opinions about his 1995 acquittal on murder charges. Prospective jurons who seid Simpson got away with murder have been thanked and told to go home.

The ones who remained when jury selection ended late Thursday night said they could put aside any residual opinions about the slaying of Simpson's Nicole Simpson, and her friend Ronald Goldman.


