



LISD students exceed state averages on fitness

(Lubbock) According to information released this afternoon by the Texas Education Agency (TEA), students in the Lubbock Independent School District (LISD), grades three through twelve, exceeded the state fitness averages in 17 of 20 categories by grade level and gender by as much as 13 percentage points.

Students across the state and in LISD were measured by six different tests in four basic areas: aerobic capacity, body composition, muscular strength and endurance and flexibility. The tests included activities such as a one-mile run, curl ups, push ups, trunk lift, shoulder stretches and a skin field test. The tests were ereated by the Cooper Institute of Dallas founded by Dr. Kenneth Cooper known as the 'father of nerobics."

This fall, families may request a copy of their child's fitness report from their local school.

Former Black Panther Faces Parole Hearing After 38 Years

Chip's case epitotnissis the culturanation of the dirty tricks and tacties the U.S. povernment employed at its effort to destroy the Black Parither Party, of which he was a member when he was arrested.

It is well-documented that, in the late 1960s, the FBI and other policing agencies of the government developed and certied out a concerted plum to neutralize or wipe out the Black Punther Party, after FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover issued his influences declaration that the Party was the "greatest threat" to the nation's security. As a result of the FBI's brutal campaign, many Party leaders were assessinated, falsely imprisoned, imprisoned under extraordinary sentences, slandered and demonized, as Party offices were assualted and Purty programs were undermined. On January 17, 1969, the Party's Southern California Chapter, of which Chip was a member, suffered the loss of its main leaders, Alprentice "Bunchy" Carter and John Hungins, at the hunds of FBI-sponsored assessins. Prior to that, in August of 1968, Los Angeles police gunned down Pantisers Tommy Lewis, Steve Burtholomew and Robert Lawrence in a single incident.

In September 1969, Chip himself was involved in a abootout with Los Angeles police, and sustained a gunshot wound to the hend. He survived this attack, only to be arrested later and charged with assuult on police and the murder of a security guard. He was convicted and sentenced to death, which was commuted to life. That year, 1969, ended with the Chicago police assassinations of Black Panther leaders Fred Hampion and Mark Clark and a



Black & Missing But Not Forgotten



Scorched earth is all that remained Saturday in a hidden, wooded area in southeast Houston where the bodies of two missing children were found. KPRC Local 2 reported.

"It was like diving into the depths of hell and straight up dealing with the devil," Quanell

The community activist was instrumental in getting Randy Sylvester Sr., who is the children's father and sole suspect, to revent the location of the bodies of 3-year-old Denun and 7-year-old Rundy Sylvester Jr.

After leading Passidena police to two ponds, Sylvester led Quanell X to the final site off of Allendale Road near Old Galveston Road late Friday.

"Both children were partially incinerated," Cupt. Bud Corbett said. "One (was) in what appeared to be remains of a wooden chest and the other (was) in a suitcase."

That unsettling discovery came after more than five days of searching for the missing children and after an incident where Sylvester threatened reporters, including a KPRC Local 2 crew.

Onnell X said he also noticed that Sylvester was combative at first Despite that, be said he tried to give him the benefit of the doubt but that changed when Sylvester showed him what he called his "deghouse."

The so-called "doghouse" is a separate apartment in the same complex where Sylvester spont time away from his wife, but where the children often visited.

According to Quanell X the spectment was filthy and filled with pomography.

"At that moment, along with some other questions that detectives were asking, I knew in my heart that that brother was not innocent," Quanell X said.

After repeatedly plending with the fither Quouell X said Sylvester finally opened up Friday:

instead of pointing investigafors to the gransorue scenu, Sylvester insisted that Quanell X join him and see it in person.

"I don't know how long I'll be disturbed about (that), possibly the rest of my life," Quanell X seid, visibly shaken by the memory. "When we were walking it was like he wanted me to see it."

Those who searched for Rundy Jr. and Denim, including Tim Miller with Texas Equisionch, said they know there was a chance this would end with tragedy, but the childrun's fata was hard to accept.

"I don't believe it's all sunk in yet," Miller said. "I not think we'm all in shock."

One of the First Tuskegee Airmen Dies at 87 By The Associated Press

ATLANTA - (AP) - LL Col. Charles "Chuck" Drydon, one of the first of the pioneering black World War II pilots known as the Tuskegee Airmen, has died. He was 87.

Dryden died Toesday in Atlenta of natural conses, said Roger Noal, a spokesman for the National Museum of Patriotism in Atlanta, Dryden was on the museum's board of directors.

"He was not just a part of American history; he helped to make it," museum founder Nick Snider said Thursday.

Dryden's 21-year military career included combat missions in Korea and assignments in Japan, Gernfiny and U.S. bases. He setired from the Air Force in 1962. About 1,000 pilots trained as a segregated Army Air Corps unit at the Timkegoe Army Flying School in Alabama during World War

Dryden was selected for aviation cadet training at Tuskeger in August 1941, only a month after the program began and four months before the U.S. entered World War II. He was one of three men commissioned

in April 1942 as a second lieutenant. Just five pilots had curned their wings in the program ahead of Dzyden's class of

Dryden was a member of the famed 99th Pursuit Squadron and later the 332nd Fighter Group, which served in North Africa and Italy.

His P-40 airplane was nicknamed "A-Train," and Dryden titled his autobiography "A-Train: Memoirs of a Tuskegeo Airman." It was published by the University of Alabama Press in 1997.

Last year, President Bush and Congress awarded the Tuskegee Airmen Congressional Gold Medal. Some 300 surviving nirmen including Dryden - gathered in Washington for the ceremony in March 2007.

While attending the Washington gathering, Dryden told The Associated Press that he had mixed feelings about the event, since it came so many years after the war. But he added that the medal helped convince him that the country does recognize the nirmen's contributions.

He recalled that after returning from his oversens service, he was stationed in Walterboro, S.C., where he saw German prisoners of war get privileges in theaters and enfeteries that were denied to black soldiers.

Dryden was born in 1920 in New York City to Jamaican parents. He carned a bachelor's degree in political science from Hofstra University and a master's degree in public law and government from Columbia

In 1998, Dryden was inducted into the Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame. He was also a professor of air science at Howard University.




