



Daylight Savings Time Begins Sunday!

At 2 a.m. on November 4. 2007, groggy Americans will turn their clocks back one hour, marking the end of Daylight Saving Time (DST).

The feneral law that established "daylight time" in the United States does not require any area to observe daylight saving time. But If a state chooses to observe DST, it must follow the starting and ending dates set by the law. From 1986 to 2006 this was the first Sunday in April to the last Sunday in October, but starting in 2007, it is observed from the second Sunday in March to the first Sunday in November, adding about a month to daylight saving time. No More Sunlight in Arizona and Hawaii

Arizona (with the exception of the Navajo Nation) and Hawaii and the territories of Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, Guam, and American Summa are the only places in the U.S. that do not observe DST but instead stay on "standard time" all year long. And If you've spent any time in the sweltering summer sun in those regions you can understand why residents don't need another hour of sunlight

A few months after the Senate immigration bill failed, those who were in favor of illegal aliens cortinuing coming and finding refuge in our country resume their efforts despite the majority wishes of Americans who oppose illegal immigration, Richard Durbin, a Democratic Senator from Illinois introduce on the Senate Floor his intention to offer Development, Relief, Education for Alien Minors (DREAM) Act as an amendment. to the defense authorization bill.

The bill was defeated Wednesday, October 24, 2007 in the Senate. Writers have stated the DREAM Act (s.774) was a nightmare. They concluded it was a Moreover, with few exceptions, massive amnesty that extended to the millions of illegal aliens who entered the United States before the age of 16. The illegal aliens who would have applied for this amnesty would be immediately rewarded with "conditional" lawful permanent resident (green card) status, which could have been converted to a non-conditional green card. The illegal alien would have been able to use his newly acquired status to seek green cards for the parents who the illegal aliens eligible for feder-

Thus, an alien's admission that he has violated federal immigration law cannot be used against him-even if he never had any chance of qualifying for the DREAM Act amnesty in the first place.



But the state Supreme Court later reducing the severity of the crime upheld a lower court's ruling which said that the 2006 law could not be applied retroactively.

Chief Justice Leah Ward Sears wrote in the majority opinion that the changes in the law "represent. a seismie shift in the legislature's view of the gravity of oral sex between two willing teenage participants."

The state Supreme Court had turned down Wilson's appeal of the justices agreed to hear the state's appeal of a Monroe County Wilson, 21, was convicted of judge's decision to reduce Wilson's sentence to 12 months and free him. That judge had called the 10-year sentence a "grave miscarriage of justice."

Dissenting justices wrote that the state Legislature expressly Wilson was acquitted of raping stated that the 2006 change in the another 17-year-old girl at the law was not intended to affect any crime prior to that date.

They said Wilson's sentence could not be cruel and unusual because the state Legislature decided that Wilson could not benefit from subsequent laws from a felony to a misdemennor.

They called the decision an "unprecedented disregard for the General Assembly's constitutional

A spokeswoman for Wilson's lawyer said his legal team received no advance notice of the decision.

Texas Tech University Early Head Start Program today amounced its policy for free and reduced-price meals served under the Child and Adult Care Food Program for 2005-2006. The Texas Tech University Early Head Start has a copy of the policy, which unyone may review. The following household size and income criteria will be used to determine eligibility":

For family units with more than 8 members, add \$3,480 for each dditional member.

Children from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Application forms and a letter to parents or guardians are being sent to all homes. To apply for free or reduced-price meals, households should fill out the application and return it to the contractor. Additional copies are available at the contractor's office. The information provided on the applications will be used to determine eligibility; it may be verified any time during the contract year by the contractor or other program officials. Households must provide the following information on the applications: all household members' names; the Social Security number of the head of the household (or other responsible adult); and all household members' incomes by source; OR the household's food stamp or AFDC case number, if appropriate and the signature of an adult household member certifying that the information is correct. Applications may be submitted any time during the year. According o the free and reduced-price policy, Head Start staff will review appliations and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may discuss the decision with the Texas Tech Health Specialist. Parents may request a formal appeal either orally or in writing by contacting:





(AUSTIN) - Comptroller Susan Combs and Texas Congressman Kevin Brady want to preserve a tax deduction that saves Texans more than \$1 billion per year on their federal income tax. A law allowing Texans who file itemized federal income tax returns to deduct state and local sales taxes will expire at the end of this year if Congress does not vote to extend it.

"In Texas, this law has had a significant positive impact on the state's economy, accounting for additional money in taxpayers' pockets, as well as increased job creation, investment and economic productivity." Combs said.

Combs estimates extending the deduction would save Texans a projected \$1.2 billion a year, or an average of \$520 per filer claiming the main the seven times. Eight or deduction. 




