# Church News



From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith  
Texas Criminal and Traffic Laws In Effect - Part II

We are a nation of laws. It is important we abide by the laws that are implemented through the legislative process. We are not a sanctuary nation. We are a sovereign nation under the rule of law. This week we continue with "Texas Criminal and Traffic Laws in Effect as of September 1, 2007."

**HB 3190** prohibits persons have committed offenses such as vehicular manslaughter, driving under the influence, and leaving the scene of an accident from operating a school bus for 10 years after the offense; requires school bus operations to wear seat belts if the operator's seat is equipped with such restraints, prohibits the operation of a school bus if the number of persons inside the bus exceeds the manufacturer's design capacity for the vehicle if the bus' door is open; authorizes a school bus operation to prohibit a passenger from standing or sitting on the floor of a bus or anywhere that is not a seat; requires a school bus evacuation training program and requires a school district to train all of its students and teaching staff in the process of emergency school bus evacuation at least twice a year.

**SB 1287** requires certain establishment that sell alcohol to post specific notification regarding the offense of human trafficking in both English and Spanish along with the number to the national human trafficking

hotline. **SB 378**, known as the "Castle Doctrine," removes the requirement that persons attempt to retreat before using deadly force to defend themselves.

**SB 387** redefines "loose material" in Transportation Code Chapter 727 by adding the term "refuse," which is defined as "trash, rubbish, garbage, or any other discarded material." It also delete existing statutory language that exempts a vehicle operated at a speed less than 30 miles an hour from application of this chapter.

**HB 1766** makes a state jail felony of the theft (stealing) of wiring or cable that consists of at least 50 per cent aluminum, bronze, or copper metals and that has a value of less than \$20,000.

**SB 9** (effective June 15, 2007) requires a national criminal history background check for all certified public school employees, prevents individuals from employment with a school district if they have been convicted of a Title 5 Penal Code felony offense; or a sex offense when the victim of the crime is a child, primary school student, or secondary school student; and creates a clearinghouse at DPS for criminal history background information on public school employees so this information can be shared between school districts.

**HB 1355**, known as Lillian's Law, requires all dog owners

to properly secure their dogs on their property. The law provides that a dog owner can be held criminally responsible if the dog causes serious bodily injury or death at a location other than the owner's property in an unprovoked attack during which the owner by criminal negligence failed to secure the dog. It exempts many dog professionals (including peace officers) who deal with dogs on a regular basis from the bill.

**SB 244** authorizes a district or appellate court to seal an affidavit when there is compelling state interest for doing so, such as to prevent destruction of or tampering with evidence in a criminal investigation.

**HB 1839** requires concealed handgun license (CHL) holders to take a continuing education course to renew their CHL every 10 years instead of every five years.

**SB 502** increases the minimum coverage amounts for automobile insurance. The first increase applies to motor vehicle liability insurance policies issued or renewed after January 1, 2008. A second, larger increase in motor vehicle liability insurance coverage takes effect on January 1, 2011.

**SB 1315** requires DPS to develop an alert system for missing senior citizens similar to the current Amber Alert Program ducted children.

## Bloggers Put Jena Six Case Blast

The case of six Black youth who face lifetime jail sentences for an alleged assault on a White peer in Jena, La., is slowly drawing the public's attention.

The alleged incident was the culmination of racial tensions triggered by a group of White Jena High School students who hung three nooses from a tree when a Black student asked for permission to sit under the traditionally exclusively-White hang-out. Black students gathered under the tree in non-violent protest. The White teens were given a slap on the wrist over what school officials called a "harmless prank" and the situation spiraled from there.

The first youth to be on trial, Mychal Bell, is slated for sentencing on September 20. The blogosphere has been teeming with operations, petition and updates on this case. Here is some of what is being said:

"OK, where is the media attention on this? You know, thank God for Black websites, because if we leave ALL of the news up to the "regualr" media, we would never know about anything in OUR communities. On one side, we keep hearing that racism no longer exists. BUT, on the other side, WE ALL KNOW

"It's a story that reads like one from the Jim Crow era, when judges, lawyers and all-White juries used the justice system to keep Blacks in "their place." But it's happening today. The families of these young men are fighting back, but the story has gotten minimal press. Together, we can make sure their story is told and that the governor of Louisiana intervenes and provides justice for the Jena 6.

We need to band together and show America that we do give a damn about ourselves ... it all need to get offend- because this is offensive. First Genarlow, now this, please people, we need to start taking this personal."

"Kevin Covin on "Facing South," a blog published on the

Institute for Southern Studies website <http://s.southernstudies.org>, said:

"I really feel for the black students. The justice system is clearly defined in black and white. Dr. King said is best. "Unjust laws are no laws at all." It's a prime example how far we still have to go in order to have justice in this country. When my daughter brought this case to my attention whether Black or White to stand together against such bigotry. Here in America we see so many ills. I am glad that people are coming together to fight against this clear cut case of racism. I, myself, will be following this case and hope to spread the word about what is going on with Jena 6 as the chief of Unheard-voices an online minority magazine [www.unheard-voices.com](http://www.unheard-voices.com). The magazine tackles these sort of ugly behavior y whites. NBlacks should put their trust in the Lord because it is though God that has brought us t his far. Justice will prevail.


