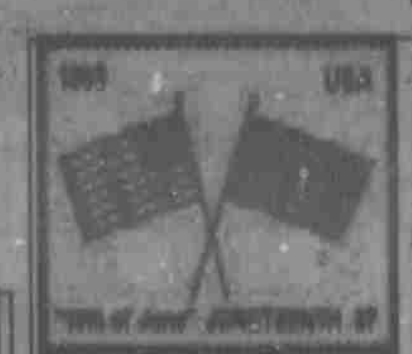

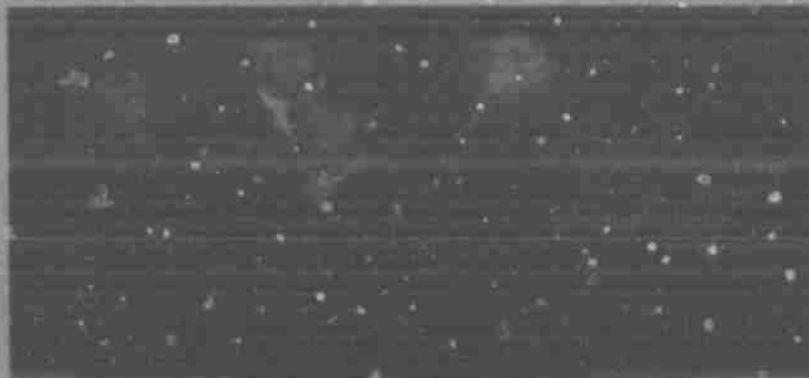

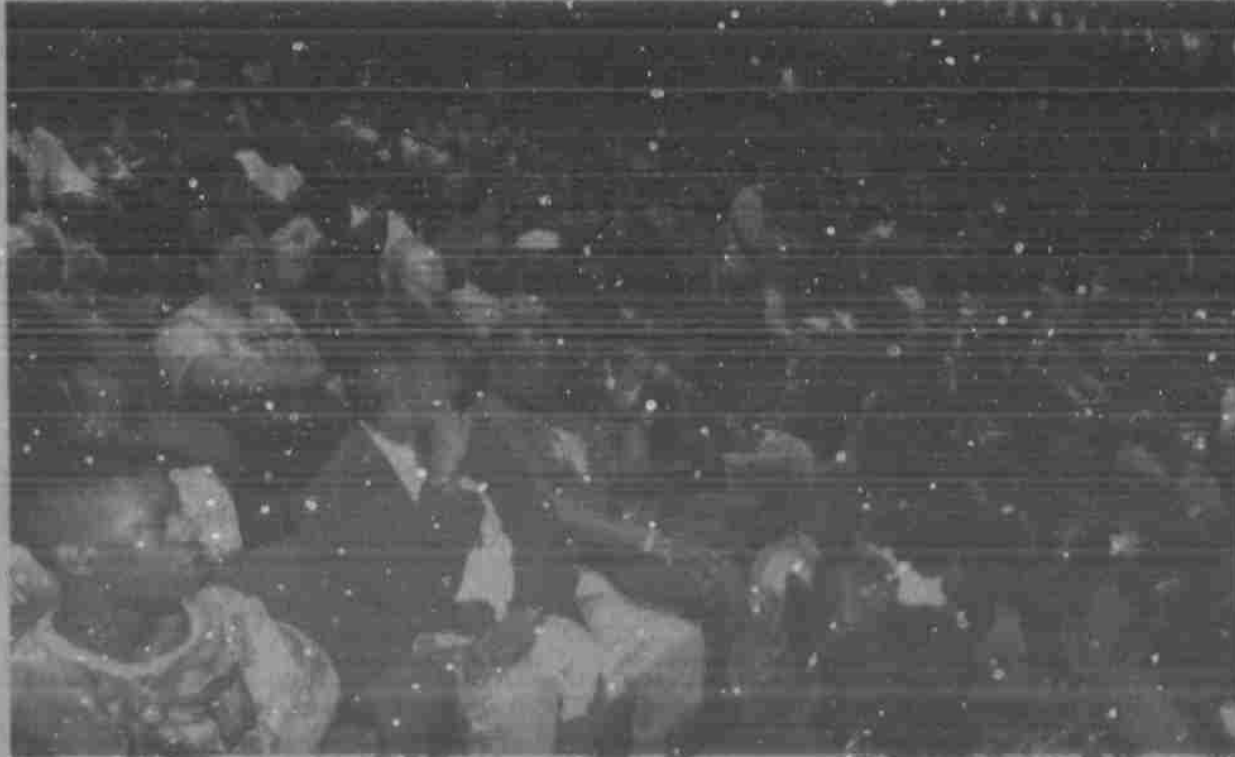

Here is information about this Sunday School lesson, **Family as Community (Ruth 1:1-9; 14b-16)**

I love a great story. Shortly after its release, our family went to see *The Blind Side*, based on the true account of a homeless teenager rescued by a loving Christian family. It is a nearly perfect story.

The book of Ruth is also a lovely—some say a perfect—story. Commentator Alexander Schroder said, "No poet in the world has written a more beautiful short story."

Ruth has many elements of a great narrative, but one is a memorable commitment quote; "Don't urge me to leave you or to turn back from you. Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God" (Ruth 1:16). These words, spoken by the widowed Ruth to her mother-in-law, demonstrate that family is deeper than shared

genetic coding. The bonds of family cannot be solely measured by blood or DNA; a higher standard exists, uncompromising love and commitment.

Such is the story of Michael Oher, told in the movie *The Blind Side*. Left homeless by parents incapable of caring for him, he was taken in by the Tuohy family and quickly became like their own child. As a member of this family, Michael learned the discipline of playing football as a left tackle on the offensive line (which ultimately opened the door to an NFL career). His responsibility is to

protect the quarterback from rushers coming from that player's "blind side." As his new mother, Leigh Anne Touhy (played by Sandra Bullock), told him, "This team is your family, Michael. You have to protect them. Tony here is your quarterback. You protect his blind side. When you look at him, you think of me."

FROM SORROW TO JOY
 Ruth's book tells a similar story. It stars, Ruth's mentor and mother-in-law, Naomi, whose story is one of great sorrow. While raising her blood family in Bethlehem, she must move

with them when their land faces famine. Naomi's husband, Elimelech, leads his wife and two sons east, across the Dead Sea and into the land of Moab, to earn a living. There, away from her homeland and ancestral family, tragedy strikes when her husband dies, leaving her with her two sons. Widowed and now given the responsibility of teaching her sons about life and marriage, she watches the boys marry Moabite women. Then tragedy strikes again when Naomi's two sons die.

Having lost almost everything, Naomi begins making plans to return to her homeland with her widowed daughters in-

law. As they journey, Naomi encourages these young ladies to return to Moab. Naomi well knows the difficulty of living away from home, family, and friends. In tears she sends them on their way with a blessing. But daughter-in-law Ruth surprises Naomi by refusing to turn back. After Naomi encourages her to go, Ruth replies, "Don't urge me to leave you or to turn back from you. Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God."

May this information be of assistance for you this week. May God bless and keep each of you is our prayer.

Just when we thought that the cuts in government sponsored medical care and pensions had all been taken care of and tucked away in some nice forgotten files, we learn that Uncle Sam is not through yet. Of special concern is the fact that the federal government is about to begin to collect on defaulted loans and debts which may be over ten years old.

There was a statute of limitations on government loans which was lifted in 2008 which permits the government to collect on old delinquent loans. Hit hardest will be those persons who are retired workers receiving Social Security benefits, who did not pay for small business loans, farm loans, unpaid income taxes, veteran health care and any other government loans.

In 1997, the statute of limitations was lifted to collect on unpaid student loans, but the 2008 Farm Bill lifted the ten year statute to make it possible to collect on all other debts to the government. Individuals who owe the government for any reason, at this time, need to begin to dig out papers and documents to prepare for the inevitable. The Social Security Office and the Internal Revenue Office are very impersonal when it comes to your owing either one of them any money. One would need an insurmountable amount of proof to show that you do not owe and why, if they say so. Further, make sure you understand that there will be interest charges and usually



penalties. Rest assured that interest and penalties are two different things. Interest is charged on what you owe, but there is usually a penalty because you did not pay on time.

Times are hard now for everyone who is not on the super rich list. Some of us are having a hard time because of unemployment, underemployment, fixed incomes, and reduced income because of the loss of a bread winner through death or other devastating incidents. Being on a fixed income as most retirees are, will make having Social Security and Disability checks reduced, thrust a hardship on many. In those cases, if one cannot defend the non-payment of a government loan, prepare to apply for hardship and disability waivers. It may help in some cases, but do not depend on it. Individuals in nursing homes and hospices have been known to fall victim to reductions in Social Security payments because of an outstanding government loan. If you defaulted and have retired and know you owe the government, get 'in cinque' and prepare to pay up or take cuts in your Social Security checks.

With only 10 questions, the 2010 Census questionnaire takes approximately 10 minutes to complete. By law, the Census Bureau cannot share an individual's responses with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities.

The Census: A Snapshot

WHAT: The census is a count of everyone residing in the United States.

WHO: All U.S. residents must be counted - both citizens and non citizens.

WHEN: You will receive your questionnaire in March 2010 either by U.S. mail or hand delivery.

WHY: The U.S. Constitution requires a national census once every 10 years to count the population and determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives.

HOW: Households should complete and mail back their questionnaires upon receipt. Census takers will visit households that do not return questionnaires to take a count in person.

The Importance of Census Data:

Every year, the federal government allocates more than \$400 billion to states and communities based, in part, on census data.

Census data are used to determine:

- locations for retail stores
- schools
- hospitals
- new housing developments and other community facilities
- boundaries for state and local legislative and congressional districts.

2010 Census Key Dates:

FEBRUARY - MARCH 2010

Census questionnaires are mailed or delivered to households.

MAY - JULY 2010

Census takers visit households that did not return a questionnaire by mail.

Be Counted program is implemented. Census questionnaires are available at select public sites for individuals who did not receive one by mail.

DEC. 31, 2010

By law, the Census Bureau delivers population counts to the President.

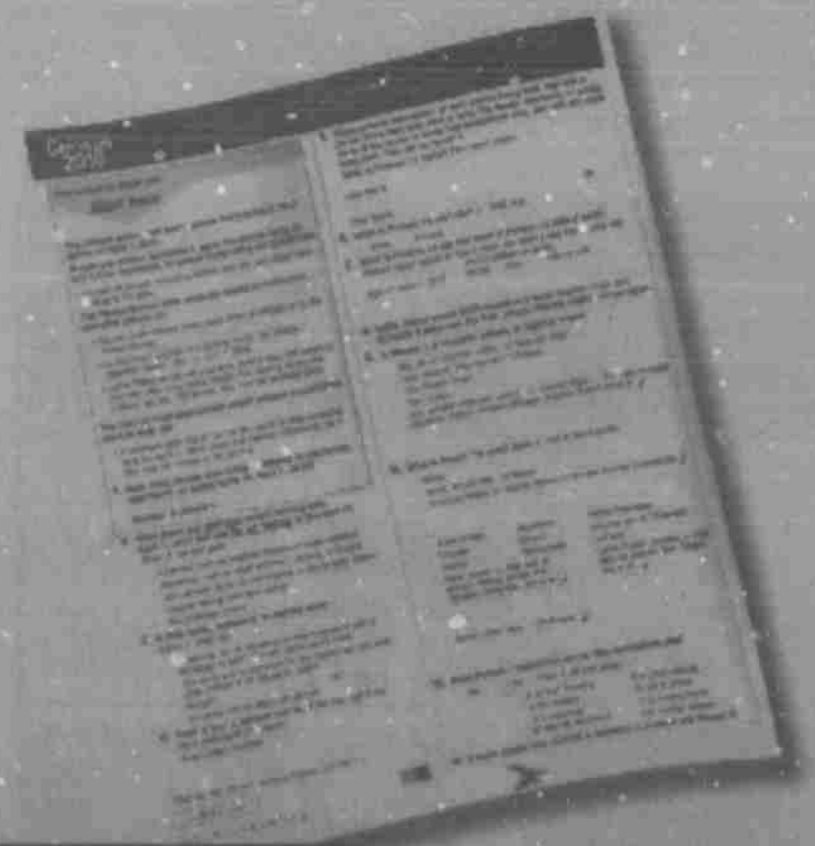

A. 2010 Census questionnaire language assistance guides are available in a variety of languages. Large-print questionnaires are available to the visually impaired upon request, and a Teletext Device for the Deaf (TDD) program will help the hearing impaired. Contact your Regional Census Center for more details about the types of assistance available and for QAC locations.

Q. HOW DOES THE CENSUS BUREAU COUNT PEOPLE WITHOUT A PERMANENT RESIDENCE?

A. Census Bureau workers undertake extensive operations to take in-person counts of people living in group quarters, such as college dormitories, military barracks, nursing homes and shelters, as well as those who have been displaced by natural disasters.

Rapper Lil Wayne Gets Year in Jail in NYC Gun Case

New York, NY — After saying goodbye on concert stages and online video streams, Lil Wayne had nothing to add as he was sentenced Monday to a year in jail for having a loaded gun on his tour bus.

The Grammy Award-winning rapper delivered only a brief bow to fans and supporters as he was led out of a courtroom in handcuffs to start serving his sentence.

With that, Lil Wayne headed off to face his punishment in a case that had shadowed him as he became one of music's most prolific and profitable figures in recent years. Arrested in July 2007, he pleaded guilty in October to attempted criminal possession of a weapon. He

admitted he had the loaded .40-caliber semiautomatic gun on his bus.

His lawyer, Stacey Richman, said the rapper was resolute as he was taken away.

"He knew what he had to do, and he's doing it," she said.

Lil Wayne arrived later Tuesday at the Rikers Island jail complex, where he was being held apart from the general population of inmates because of his fame. He has a cell to himself but the option of spending time in a TV room with 17 other inmates who also have been separated from the general population because of notoriety or other reasons, according to the city Correction Department.

It wasn't immediately clear what work assignment he might have, if any. The 27-year-old rap star could be released in about eight months with good behavior.

Lil Wayne, born Dwayne Carter, is going behind bars with his career in full throttle. His "Tha Carter III" was the best-selling album of 2008 and won a Grammy for best rap album.

sional seats to states. In addition, Congress uses census numbers to allocate more than \$400 billion a year to state and local governments for basic needs such as schools and roads.

Raugel noted "West Texas needs the most accurate population count possible because Cochran, Borden, Briscoe, Kent, Floyd, Castro, Crosby, Lynn, Motley, Dickens and Hall counties have lost population with Cochran a 20.2 percentage loss and a current population of 2,977.

State Rep. Joe Heflin, D-Crosbyton, noted his House District 85 has lost the most population of any House district in West Texas during the past decade and also has the highest poverty rate plus the largest Hispanic population in the region.

Heflin noted "It is bad enough that we have already lost a lot of population, and an undercount would make things much worse for us. We need to stress to people how important it is that they be counted...that count means more money for the education of their children, for better roads and for fair political representation, in Austin and Washington. I would encourage West Texans to forget the foolish talk of Governor Perry seceding from the United States and the foolish Teabag idiots and other fools and fill out the questionnaire.
