

Monday, March 10, 1986, was a red letter day in law enforcement in Lubbock County and all the residents who are subject to law enforcement in Lubbock County.

On that day the United States Supreme Court in effect approved the judgment of the United States District Court here in Lubbock and the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans by refusing to review the decision which held that law enforcement people cannot routinely strip search persons who are arrested and taken to jail before they have an opportunity to make bond and before they are placed in the permanent jail population unless there is a good reason to do so. Less intrusive searches such as Less intrusive searches such as pat down and metal detectors can be used to determine whether or not there is a good reason. Although law enforcement personnel may have a contrary opinion which they hold in good faith, the staff at West Texas Leal Services believes that this



RINGING THE BELL by Bob Tiquel

A Look At The Black Press: At one time in our history of stuggle and hope, it was the Black Press that voiced the dreams and aspirations, yes even the despair of a hopeless and voteless people. Yes, there were a few black ministers and churches who would dare to speak up and be heard on the American scene but not very often. For example we remeember when the Chicago Defender was the 'Bible' of Black folks in the South and many areas of the North and East.

Many years ago in the city of Memphis, we had a friend who served then as a presiding elder in a Black Methodist denomination. He was also an agent and correspondent for the Defender. He was told by a white policemen later that he could not sell the Defender in Memphis as it was "against the law." My good friend, Rev. D. Alcorn has since " cone to his eternal home and the Detender is out of business. I do not recall whether or not the minister continued to sell the Defender but 1 do know that the news story surrounding this incident made national headlines in the Black press, including a similar Black fighting newspaper in those days -- the Pitts burgh Courier. Many places in Mississippi, Georgia, Alabama and other sections of the South, the Defender was a 'no no' by the white power wielders. The Courier was accepted however in many places that the Defender was not Was it the big red headlines of the Defender that caused the difference? We will never know now of curse. When the U.S. Supreme Court ruled many years ago, that segregation in schools was unlawful, we went into the office of a leading daily paper to get copies to sell at the General Conference which was in session then, and the editor said to me, "Tieuel, your people have waited a long time for this moment in history and you deserve it." How true then and for some of us--we are still waiting! Agree?

Just thirty years ago, in Memphis, but what a difference this time has made. Black people young and old and the middle aged too, knew that if we wanted to be free, we must keep on fighting for our rightful place in the sun. We knew what it meant when the sign in the cafe read: "We do not serve Negroes" or "Negroes Eat In the Rear, etc." We slept in our cars for there was no room in the inn then.

After thirty years, most of the curtains have been removed. There are still parts of the veil that still remains. That is why the Black press still labors on and that is why the Southwest Digest has a few more races to run. We are not quite free yet. The Black Church is still fighting too, although we wonder sometimes what for. The economic shortfall has hit us hard and yet the Black Church continues to support white enterprises that have no use for us except our dollars.

Truth of the matter is when you penalize the productive and reward the unproductive. What you eventually end up with is no production.

The implementation of such a tax would have to be well thought out, but it could work. The end result would be relief for all working black Americans and abrighter financial future for our children. And, hey. That would be a big chunk of freedom restored to all Americans.

President Reagan: Pro-Family Rhetoric, Anti-Family Action

in his State of the Union message, the President envisioned our children flying to Tokyo in two hours on an Orient Express. But his new federal budget does little to help our children get the health care, education, and training they would need to compete equally if they ever got there. Once again, the President's pro-family rhetoric masks spending priorities that will hurt children and families, especially those struggling to survive the day-to-day crisis of poverty.


In 1983, more than 42 percent of the 13 million poor children in this nation lived in families with income less than half the poverty line, or \$3,969-a-year. Imagine raising a family of three on this amount of money. It means being faced every day with impossible choices between buying food, paying the rent or heating bill, getting essential medical care, or buying clothes and shoes for young children.

How does the President's new budget respond to the painful poverty. of millions of American families? With comforting rhetoric, a promise to "study" the problem, and billions more in proposed budget cuts in lifeline programs for the poor.

Under the President's new budget, poor children and families will lose \$6 billion in federal help. From 1987-1991, if the President has his way, children would lose another \$33 billion in federal support. These cuts could deal the knockout blow to millions of families that are already reeling from the accumulated impact of years of over \$10 billion in annual budget cuts since 1980 and deepening poverty.

The President speaks in his State of the Union message about children's right to life, but in his budget calls for immediate and drastic reductions in key maternal and child health programs. He wants to cut \$1.2 billion from the Medicaid program, trim back spending on community and migrant health centers, and even reduce federal spending to immunize our children against preventable diseases.

The President says that the government must "create a ladder of

And with integration, our Black schools and colleges are faced with a bleak future now and in the times to come. Who has the answer?

opportunity to full employment," while he cuts away the rungs from that ladder by slashing Job Corps funding by 45 percent, the Summer Youth Employment program by 35 percent, and student aid programs helping low-income students by more than 24 percent.

The President says that "government must provide shelter and nourishment for those who cannot provide for themselves." But under the President's budget, the government will have to deny those necessities to more Americans. The President's budget calls for massive new cuts in Food Stamps and child nutrition programs. Further, it would eliminate entirely a food and shelter program designed to help our most vulnerable population: homeless Americans.

The results of these policies are predictable: more suffering for American families and children.

The American people are ready for a new course. We know that there are no single answers to the problem of poverty. But we also know that we need leaders who are willing to offer us more than rhetoric toward the goals of helping all our children grow up healthy, educated, and with a job in their future. We must now turn to Congress to provide that leadership, as it debates the federal budget in the coming months.



Fear is one of the most prevalent of human emotions. The condition of today's world are of such that myriads of people are gripped by fear. (3) Saline Abortion. A salt solution is injected into the sac around the baby by a long needle inserted through the mother's abdomen. The process poisons and burns the infant to death with the harsh salt solution attacking the baby's lungs, even burning away the outer layer of his skin. Within 48 hours there is a premature birth. The baby is usually dead.

(4) Hysterotomy or Caesarean Section. This is a surgical operation performed by cutting through the mother's abdominal and uterine walls, but for abortions with reverse purpose. They cause the child's death, instead of giving the child life. The baby is simply cut free, dropped in a basin and left to die. No attempt is made to sustain the lives of these little ones, because they have been marked for abortion.

The Mentality of Abortion

to yourself to give careful attention to what is about to be stated.

Every 24 hours 3,600 American babies are aborted. That's 1.32 million a year (May 1980, Moody Monthly).

In the nine wars and 198 years since 1775, there have been 667,286 American battle deaths. In 1972 alone, 600,000 American babies were killed by abortion, more than a murder a minute for each of the 525,600 minutes in the year.

In 1972 alone, more babies were killed by "legal" abortion in California than were American servicemen killed in the Vietnam, Korean, Spanish, Mexican, 1812, and Revolutionary wars put together.

According to a UPI report in the Temple Times, March 14, 1982, 1.55 million legal abortions took place in the U.S.A. during 1980. Nearly one third of the abortions took place in three states. Those states were, California with 250,330, New York with 187,460, and Texas with 102,000.

And all of this is perfectly legal. The Supreme Court has established abortion as an American way of life (or death).

In 1962, when the American Law Institute proposed a model statute which would allow abortion in cases of rape, incest, threat to the life or health of the mother, and in cases of grave defect in the child, the states began to adopt it and abortion was on its way to being accepted.

On July 1, 1970, New York governor Nelson Rockefeller signed a law allowing licensed physicians to perform abortions through the 24th week of pregnancy. New York City quickly became an abortion capital.

"Roe v. Wade" case. In 1972 Janet Roe filed suit to overturn a Texas law prohibiting her right to have an abortion. The Texas Criminal Appeal Court had ruled that the state of Texas "has a compelling interest to protect fetal life." It forbade the 'termination of the life of the fetus or embryo, except for the purpose of saving the life of the mother." Since the life of Janet Roe was not in danger, the state court refused her permission to have an abortion. On January 22, 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court held 7 to 2 that the Texas statute was unconstitutional. This did two things. This overruled the right of a state to interpret its own state statutes. And, it conceled abortion laws in all 50 states.

And until September 1976, when the Hyde amendment was passed which restricted federal funding of abortions by medicaid, the government actually funded abortions through its health care plan.

The Methods of Abortion

There are basically four methods of abortion. (1) Suction Abortion. This is the most common type used in the United States during the first trimester of pregnancy. Over 75% of all abortions are performed this way. A hollow plastic tube is inserted through the vaginal opening and the developing haby is removed by a powerful suction that literally dismembers its tiny body.

(2) D & C Abortion. This procedure uses a long slender spoon-like instrument to reach the uterus, cuts up the baby, and pulls out the pieces. One of the duties of the operating room nurse is to piece together the parts of the baby so that no fragments

Baby killing is not new. At the command of Pharach the Israelite sons were to be cast into the river as a means of population control (Exodus 1:15-22). Following the birth of Jesus Christ Herod lead a slaughter of children in Bethlehem and the surrounding area of those who were two years old and under. At one time, the Jews got caught up in idolatry and sacrificed their sons and daughters to false gods (Psalm 106:34-39).

Is abortion ever justified?

What about in the case of rape? Pregnancy by rape is very rare. A ten year study in Minnesota showed no pregnancy from 3,500 forcible rape cases. A Czechoslovakian study showed out of 86,000 consecutive abortions, only 22 were done for rape (The Challenge to Be 'Pro Life,'' John Lippic).

What about if the child might possibly be deformed or retarded or handicapped? Here is a situation presented to a class of students:

"How would you advise a mother who was pregnant with her fifth child based on the following facts:

"Her husband had syphilis. She had tuberculosis. Their first child was born blind. Their second child died. Their third child was born deaf. Their fourth child had tuberculosis.

The mother is considering an abortion. Would you advise her to have one?"

In view of these facts, most of the students agreed that she should have an abortion.

The teacher then announced, "If you said, "Yes," you would have just killed the great composer Ludwig Van Betthoven!'

If you consider abortion a visite means to handle the handicapped, struggle with Exodus 4:11 for a while.

What about abortion for an unwanted pregnancy? An unwanted pregnancy does not automatically mean the child will be unwanted.

In matters of morality man must consult his Maker. God has much to say about human life, especially when you consider that He is the One who created human life. What God has to say about this issue is vitally more important than what a physician or lawyer or scientist might have to say. God says, HUMAN LIFE BEGINS AT CONCEPTION. This is the consistent message of the Bihle, God's Word. Look carefully at Psalm \$1:5, Jeremiah 1:4-5, Luke 1:15,41, Matthew 1:20, Galatians 1:15.
