



NEAPOLIS (AP) - Magad Johnson criticized a pair of talk show hosts Friday for secusing aim of finking AIDS but said he didn't want them to be fired. Chris Baker and Langdon Perry of KTLK in Minneapolis made the remarks during Baker's conservative radio show on Wednesday, After Johnson conleanned the statements, the station said it regretted 'some offand remarks' by the pair.

"We can't have people out here making false statements and putting out bad information, because this battle is too big when it comes to HIV and AIDS," Johnson told The Associated Press in a telephone nterview.





Does drinking alcohol skrink your brain?

People who drink alcohol -even the moderate amounts that help prevent heart disease have a smaller brain volume than those who do not, according to a study in the Archives of Neurology.

While a certain amount of beam shrinkage is normal with age, greater amounts in some parts of the brain have been linked to dementia.

*Decline in bain volume estimated at 2 percent per docarle - is a natural part of aging," says Carol Ann Paul, who conducted the study when she was at the Borton University School of Public Health. She had hoped to find that alcohol might protect against such brain shrinkage.

"However, we did not find the protective effect," says Paul, who is now an instructor in the neuroscience program at Wellesley College. "In fact, any level of alcohol consumption resulted in a decline in brain volume."

In the study, Paul and colleagues looked at 1,839 healthy people with an average age of about 61. The patients underwent magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) of the brain and reported how much they tippled. Health.com: Ten best foods for the beart

Overall, the more alcoholconsumed, the smaller the brain volume, with abstainers having a higher beain volume than former drinkers, light drinkers (one to seven driaks per week), mode, ate drinkers (eight to 14 drinks per week), and heavy driakers (14 or more drinks per week).

Men were more likely to be heavy drinkers than women. But the link between brain as Fracw lodgols bns emulov strong in men. For men, only those who were heavy drinkers had a smaller brain volume than those who consumed little or no alcohol.



Some Arlington council members unhappy with mayor's stance on beer sales at Six

ARLINGTON - Six Flues has the right to sell beer and the cay should tot interfere with the amusement park's business, said some council members who do not agree with the mayor's pubhis protest of the issue.

Council members Gene Petrick and Mel LeBlanc expressed concern Monday that Mayor Robert Cluck's opposition to beer sales at Six Flags. Over Texas and Six Flags Hurricane Harbor would be seen as a reflection of the whole council, which has not taken a public stance.

Both representatives said they have no problem with the company wanting to sell beer, saying that it would provide more sales tax revenue for the city and that other venues near the park sell alcohol, including Rangers Ballpark in Arlington.

"In my opinion, this is a busiress decision to be made by the Six Flags organization. Their desire to sell a legal product currently sold literally across the street from their venue should not be elevated to a public safety or moral debate by elected public officials" said LeBlanc, who represents north Arlington. "Mayor Cluck has every right to articulate his personal opinion, yet he does not represent the will of the City Council of Arlington.*

Cluck wrote a letter to the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission in February asking the state to deny Six Flags' request for a mixed-beverage license, citing public safety con-

Cluck also plans to testify today before an administrative judge who will listen to testimony on the permit and decide the

"This is a matter I wanted to take up personally. I think that it's a dangerous precedent for an

targeting kids ... to mere alonhol. It's not a good mixture," Cluck said Monday.

In his letter, Cluck raised concerns that underage ampleyees at Six Flags reight not be equipped to handle intexicated adults or minors attemption to drink at the park. He also said intoxicated people may vemiton others during rides or make poor decisions and choose rides they might otherwise have avoided because of medical conditions. Cluck wrote that the parks are near Texas 360 and Interstate 30 and that alcohol sales may contribute to increased traffic accidents.

Council members didn't raise concerns when Cluck wrote the letter, but LeBlanc said several members were upset last week
