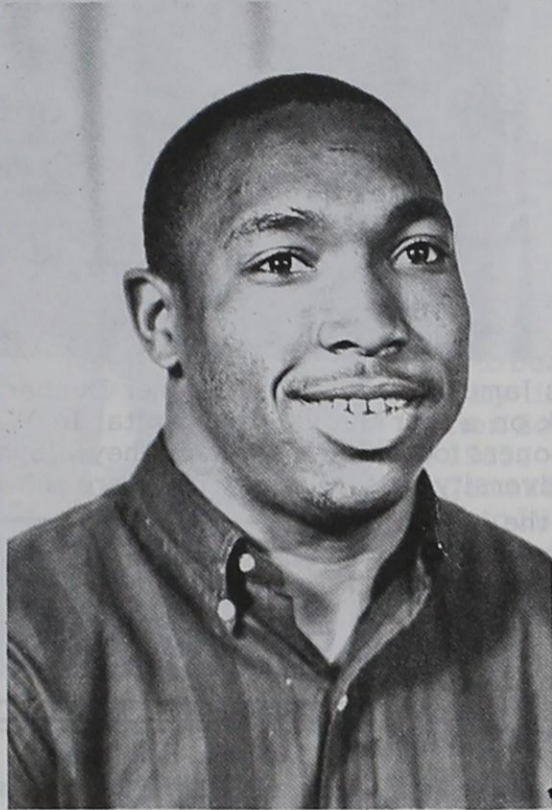
New Teen Club Formed Here

The Britt Club was organized by Officer William Britt, a patrolman on the Lubbock Police Department, in order to furnish the teenagers a place of recreation.

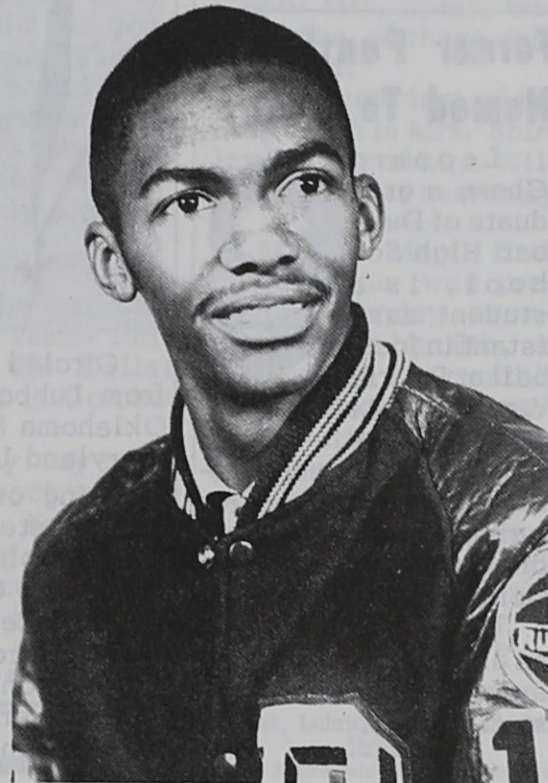
