It is obvious that a crackdown is necessary.

It is also necessary that all citizens be informed so that adequate protection and precautions can be put into operation. Check all windows and doors. Never go to bed for the night with the doors open, no matter how hot the weather, because we are living in an urban society and all sorts of personalities are around and among us. By all means, report all incidents of any nature to the police, they will not reveal your name if you so desire.
