

City Council Balks at Tax Boost for Arts

The Lubbock City Council Thursday delayed a decision on raising the hotel/motel room occupancy tax, awaiting City Attorney Fred Senter's ruling on how the money can be spent.

Councilwoman Carolyn Jordan said that in her interpretation of the law, raising the tax to four percent of a hotel guest's bill would require the city to double its contribution to the Convention and Tourism Bureau, an arm of both the city and the county governments.

But some council members including Mayor Pro Tem Dirk West seemed reluctant to turn over more money to the bureau, fearing the city would lose control over some of its funds.

Councilman Alan Henry had broached the issue of raising the hotel and motel tax after the state legislature authorized cities to collect a higher tax and to allocate some of the revenues to the "encouragement, promotion, improvement and application of the arts."

Henry had wanted the council to discuss a "philosophy of city involvement in the arts," after attending a conference of city officials from across the nation where, he said, he learned that the arts bring two dollars into the city for every dollar spent.

Mayor Roy Bass sided with Henry, saying "We can go farther and faster by raising this tax." Bass said that more money could be poured into the Convention and Tourism Bureau while the city built up a reserve fund for the arts and humanities.

But Jorday questioned whether that was the kind of "civic promotion" for which the city could legally collect. Bass responded that the arts are a form of civic promotion using the

example of advertising for a symphony concert to draw tourists to the city.

Tom Bucher of the local motel association said the tax hike was "reasonable" and that the increase would not deter tourism.

West seconded Jordan's motion to maintain the tax at its present rate, and Bass commented that to bypass the tax hike would be "a recessive step, a step backward from progress."

But then, the council turned around and decided to wait until Senter could render a legal opinion on how the money could be spent.


"Progress a little late is better than no progress at all," Bass said.

In other action, the council denied an appeal by Briarcroft Shopping Center manager Ted Rushing to allow him to build "mini-warehouses" adjacent to the center.

Rushing pointed out he could build stores on the property, zoned C-3, including record stores, convenience stores and —last but not least—a massage parlor.

A number of residents spoke against the request. Robert Davis, a homeowner near the Briarcroft area, believed the mini-warehouses would "attract undesirables" and cause "a bad traffic situation," along with increased burglary rates.

Right-to-Lifer Sees Himself as Guardian of the Unborn

It doesn't matter if an abortion is performed on the kitchen table of a vacant apartment, in the privacy of one's own bathroom, or in the antiseptic surroundings of a doctor's office. Neither does it matter why women have abortions: the unwanted products of rape and incest are, for some women, their cross to bear. Abortion is murder, with no exceptions, according to Gill White, president of the Lubbock Branch of the Right to Life organization.

Since the Supreme Court's 1973 decision which struck down many

abortion laws, the local Right to Life organization has grown to about 150 members. They lobby both in Austin and in Washington, and White said he believes someday legal abortions, with the exceptions of rape cases, will be stopped.

The organization's case is a strong one, but locally the group limits their campaign against abortion to distributing some rather harsh leaflets, and giving lectures at church and women's organization. White said he believes these less drastic measures have helped a good deal

of women in Lubbock more than picketing abortion clinics would.

The organization's message is a simple one. "We are against abortions because we don't know

when life begins," explained White. Legal abortions can be done as late as the sixth month of pregnancy but, White argues, who's to say the six-month-old fetus is any less of a person than the 25-year-old adult?

Because the rights of the unborn child are often neglected when the headed topic of abortion comes up, White and other members are taking on that responsibility themselves. "People are being killed and they have no one to represent them," said White.

White's fight against abortions is part ethical, partly religiously

based, but explained White, "pro-life is the only logical choice."

As a religious matter White said he believes that no one can determine when the soul enters the body. "I don't think that people have a right to decide on that matter. After all it's God's undertaking," he said.

While he claims the problem of unwanted pregnancies because of rape and incest are a different subject to address, he added, "In my opinion I think it's morally wrong to have an abortion under any conditions." He explained his attitude about such cases as rape, incest or a deformed child, this way. "Life itself is a hard thing—bad things happen to people, and yet people have to bear the bad things." But he emphasized that was his own personal opinion, the organization has not addressed the subject. "Sanctity of life is worth more than the mother's suffering," he added.

But society has made it even harder for a woman to keep a child than to have an abortion. "There shouldn't be a stigma about women keeping their babies," he said. Society looks down on the unwed mother rather than accepting her.

While there's a stigma that goes with being a unwed mother,

Budgetary Scissors

Ed Irons clasped his palms to his temples, shook his head and looked down at his desk as Lubbock school trustees voted for a 15 cent tax cut, cutting one and a half million dollars from his proposed budget.

The trustees met Monday and Tuesday morning at 7:15 a.m. to hear and act upon Supt. Irons' proposed budget for the 1977-78 school year.

The major effect of the tax cut,

down to \$1.58 from \$1.75 per \$100 valuation, will be to reduce the "carry-over" cash reserves. Irons wanted to have \$2.55 million in this fund, which he says he needs to prepare the 1978-79 school budget. The fund will be reduced to \$1.3 million.

Irons, both shocked and surprised at the unanimous approval of trustee Harold Harriger's tax cut motion, said there was "no way we could cut off that much."

"We try to present a

conservative budget," he said. "We could present one with a lot of fat."

The remaining cuts, a little over \$200,000 are being trimmed off the various programs—" \$2000 here, \$3000 there, \$4000..." Irons told the Times.

The superintendent is to present the revised budget to the board Aug. 16, which gives him a few days for further revision if needed before the Aug. 20 deadline.

The board ordered no specific

cuts, but Harriger and Giles Forbes wanted to eliminate the DEBT program, which works with children up to two years old who may have handicaps. The Lubbock program is serving as a model for the Texas Education Agency and other cities.

Forbes said he thought the program put children under the supervision of LISD at too young an age. "I don't think the school system should take care of students from the cradle to the



LISD's Ronny Gooch — Man of Quiet Efficiency

"unique needs" of those schools, he said.

Junior highs offer some students different courses for alternate school days, for instance taking woodshop on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and art on Tuesday and Thursday.

The computer is not sophisticated enough to handle the complexity of alternate classes, so it is not used. The other option is to tailor-make the program to suit the computer.

"We try to make the computer serve us, not the other way around," Gooch said.

One of Gooch's jobs was to study the new school finance bill and know how it's going to effect Lubbock. He went to Austin on the second day of the special session, but he says he did not lobby for anything in the bill.

"I needed to know what the bill was going to mean to us," he said.


Gooch said the bill will mean about \$4 million dollars to Lubbock over the old budget, as well as fewer school days to spend the money. The school days are cut down to 175 with 10 service

days for teachers, and next year the school days will remain the same but the service days will be cut to eight.

Since the school gets paid by pupil attendance, Gooch happily reported "relief" from the legislature on the average daily attendance mandate. The former requirement was the best 170 out of 180 days, but starting next year the requirement will be the best five out of six six-week periods. Gooch is happy with the ruling, for he says "there is always a six-week period that has a lower attendance because of poor weather or something like that."

The bill also changed the definition of handicapped. The old bill used the word "exceptional," to mean students who were physically or mentally handicapped. The legislature changed "exceptional" to "handicapped."

"Many people thought 'exceptional' meant 'gifted,' Gooch said. Gooch has a long background in Lubbock. He went to Texas Tech, received an undergraduate degree in chemistry and a masters

Ronny Gooch's office in the school administration building is not formidable or imposing, but it does look efficient. Secretary Mary Rowe is in the outer office, and she quietly answers the phone, does paperwork and tries to find Mr. Gooch for reporters showing up late for appointments.

Gooch is a big, raw-boned man with a firm handshake and an imposing title: The Coordinator of Data Processing and Student Teaching for the Lubbock Independent School District.

As such, he acts "as a liaison between student needs and the educational services center," he oversees payrolls, finance records and inventory, and he is in charge of scheduling courses for high schools.

Scheduling classes poses a few problems for the administration. High schools are no problem, but the computer cannot be used for junior highs, because of the

degree in education.

Midway through his junior year he decided he wanted to go into education, and he turned down medical school.

"I haven't been sorry," he says about his decision not to become a doctor. "I have a strong feeling I should be in education, that it's my niche in life."

Gooch's career in LISD spans an impressive 18-year distance. He has served as a science

teacher, a vice-principal and principal of Coronado High as well as other positions before taking on his present job four years ago.

"I'm in a different role now, but I still perform a service to the boys and girls in the classroom. Whatever we do here has an effect on them. We try to keep that in mind. We don't want to give the impression this is run only as a business."

Area Eyed for Cultural Growth Committee Hopes to Export Expertise

Lubbock is growing rapidly, both in industries and in arts programs.

More culture is coming to Lubbock, which boasts museums, a theater group, a symphony and other examples of regional culture.

At the next city council meeting, the council members will discuss putting part of the hotel/motel taxes aside for the arts, and Councilman Alan Henry wants to try to start a "philosophy of city government in the arts." Lubbock is moving rapidly towards becoming a cultural center.

But what of outlying communities, like Snyder and Crosbyton: Where do they go if they want to start a museum or a theater group or a square dance society?

They go to the South Plains Cultural Advisory Committee.

The committee was formed about a year ago to advise and guide small communities within its 22,000 square miles on setting up local cultural programs.

And if SPCAC works, it will be used as a model for other communities. It is already being used as a model for Texas, and

there are eyes in Washington turned toward the progress made here in the South Plains, according to Herb Haslam, executive director of the Texas Association of Arts Councils.

The South Plains group met recently in Lubbock with representatives of some of the larger statewide groups with similar interests—The Assembly of Arts Councils, The Texas Commission of the Arts and Humanities and the Texas Historical Commission—as well as the South Plains Association of Governments and interested individuals, such as Henry.

The committee hopes to let smaller communities know what kind of money and organization they can count on to set up their own cultural events. But the communities need to know of each other's activities.

The main problem discussed at the meeting was no centralized communication. People in Crosbyton didn't know what was going on in Snyder.

The group adopted a suggestion by Haslam, dividing the area into three main regions: grasslands, sandylands and

ranchland areas, appoint one person to represent each area and coordinate any activity or information, and report back to the committee.

The program is in its beginning stages—for the past year it was planning its purpose and the best way to achieve it.

Haslam said because of the "incredible range of needs and interests" in the area the South Plains Cultural Affairs Committee may offer something unique to the area—something the nation may watch and copy.

Don't Blow It All on an A/C Wrong Cooler Could Keep You Hot Under Collar

If you've ever spent an afternoon in a stuffy, stagnant room, blisters of sweat swelling on everything from your forehead to your ice tea glass, you know what it's like to live without the West Texas necessity—the air conditioner.

Since an air conditioner is a major purchase for most home owners, shopping around can pay off.

First decide how much you're willing to pay and how much coolness you expect to get for your money.

Your choice will boil down to refrigerated air versus evaporative air conditioning.

Refrigerated air takes moisture out and replaces it with refrigerated air. It copes with humidity better than evaporative coolers, but at a price, noted Norman Gooch, vice-president of Fields and Company.

It's popular in Lubbock homes because refrigerated units last longer than evaporative coolers, usually about 10 to 15 years as

compared with three years for other air conditioners, said Bob Teaff, owner of Air Top Air Conditioning.

The biggest disadvantage is the price since electric bills soar during the hot summer months. Even under the best conditions you can't expect an ice cold house when the temperature registers 100 degrees.

Evaporative air conditioners are less expensive but what you save in electrical bills, you often lose in efficiency.

Evaporative air conditioners work on the principle of putting more moisture into the air and then blowing that moisture around. Unlike refrigerated air which requires all windows to be closed to work properly, evaporative coolers work best with windows open. "Because you bring air from the outside into the house you have the problem of dust, mold and a musky odor in the house," noted Gooch.

Another disadvantage to evaporated air conditioners is when the humidity is high, the efficiency drops off drastically. So

on the hottest days you're not any better off than someone who has no air conditioning.

Energy efficient models can be a wise investment in the long run noted Gooch.

Before the installation make sure you're getting an air conditioner that will get the job done. Tonnage of the air conditioner is based on variables including which direction the house faces and how well insulated it is. A rule of thumb is you should have a ton of equipment for every 500 to 600 square feet, according to Teaff. An undersized air conditioner won't get the job done while an oversized one will show up on your electrical bill.

As important as what kind of air conditioner you select is the contractor you select to install the unit.

"Contract with a reputable dealer who has been in the business for awhile," advises Gooch. Only half of the air conditioning system is manufactured in a factory, while the other half is in the equipment your contractor installs. "Both are totally dependent on each other to work properly," said Gooch.

Since there are no legal certification for air conditioning contractors in Texas, you're gambling on how good a system you get. A tip off to a reliable dealer are plaques on the wall indicating schools he attended. Also it can't hurt to get several bids before you decide on one contractor. "Unfortunately the best contractors also cost a little more so be selective," warns Gooch.

Proper maintenance can solve these problems before they get out of hand. It's a good idea to clean your filters every month, and have the air conditioner cleaned bi-yearly.

SHERIDAN'S RIDE

It was really quite a memorable weekend, you know. Out in the huge Lubbock Municipal Coliseum we had the always welcome visit from Ringling Bros. and Barnum and Bailey Circus, while at the opposite end of the city pole we had the bow of a distinguished motion picture of this summer season that has seen a wealth of outstanding films, this time at Showplace 4 when Gregory Peck brought us an incisive portrait of a man of history, "MacArthur."



These two events were enough to make any weekend a time to remember. First of all, let's talk about "MacArthur."

Those of us who went through World War II, whether stationed in the European Theatre (as I was) or based in the Pacific, or even later in the Korean conflict, knew MacArthur. Here was a man about whom controversy raged, whose incredible egomania made him the target of hatred and admiration in equal doses. This is the man of Corregidor, "I shall return," and the man who pained President Franklin D. Roosevelt, who bore with him, and President Harry S. Truman, who did not. In that memorable decisive move, it was Truman who "fired" the general who refused to acknowledge the Commander-in-Chief and his authority, who came back to the United States and seriously posed a potential race for the Presidency itself.

We all know the famed "Old Generals Never Die" speech at West Point and it is this speech that the Universal film hinges upon. In segments from that speech to the cadet student body, the film traces the MacArthur story in flashback techniques.

The picture was made by the two men who were responsible for the stunning George C. Scott movie of the life of General George Patton, which won the star his Oscar (refused). But, where General Patton was a flamboyant character, with his pearl-handled pistols, his bawdy, vulgar mouth and his brilliance as a strategist, MacArthur poses an entirely different subject. For MacArthur was appallingly self-centered and, while a brilliant strategist, imposed his ways with ruthless and negative results.

Gregory Peck is General Douglas MacArthur and it is to his eternal credit that he plays the character with ultimate sensitivity and interpretation. Peck is the show and he is superb. Come Oscar time again I have no doubt that the Peck name will be high in the running.

If you'll remember the television version of the one-man show, "Give 'Em Hell, Harry" then you will remember that it was Ed Flanders who portrayed the fiery Missourian. In "MacArthur" he is the Truman again and he is quite outstanding, as was to be expected. As FDR, Dan O'Herlihy is solid and convincing, though the Roosevelt role is, of course, overshadowed by the Truman portrait.

The rest of the cast are only supports for the three major principals, which was to be expected.

Overall the two-hour and eight minute film, rated PG, is a notable entry and deserves your respect and your attendance. It is a slice of an era now dead but it had its vital and commanding message.

What does one say about Ringling Bros. and Barnum and Bailey Circus? Nothing can be added to the fact that, once again, it simply proved that it is truly "The Greatest Show On Earth." This edition, the 106th, was the Bicentennial Show and red, white and blue and flag-waving was very much in order.

It never fails to fascinate me how the staging and the costuming, the pageantry and the whole area of entertainment values are served by this incredible enterprise and the show this year was, if anything, better than its other 105 editions. It was grand and the audience loved everything from the opening whistle to the gaudy and stirring finale.

Certainly, the polar bear act, fronted by trainer Ursula Elvin Bale, the acrobatic ace, Charley Baumann and his Royal Bengal Tigers are always winners year after year and the Orbiting Olympians, with their trained bear, gave us an unusual high wire act.

The King Charles Troupe whipped off an electric basketball routine on unicycles and the highlight of the show fell to the Flying Goonies who were breathtakingly good on the trapeze.

Everybody had a marvelous time and the only sad note is that we'll just have to sit back and wait out another year until that big silver train makes it across country to our freight yards and the Coliseum base once again.

Have nice days, Barnum and Bailey, and Ringling Bros., too, and 'y'all come back, hear?

grave." "Why don't we have nutrition programs for women when they're pregnant?" Harriger said smiling.

Board vice-president Bob McKelvey said money was saved by the program in the long run by helping prepare students to enter public school.

Forbes then made a motion to

abolish the program, which Harriger seconded.

McKelvey said they needed to "be very careful" when cutting programs with so little discussion.

"I think you want to delete it to save money—we need a thorough study, not an arbitrary cut," Waters said.

"Special education is important, too," he added.

"There are no questions in my mind that it's a good program,"

Forbes emphasized, "the problem is when to assume responsibility."

The board then voted down the proposal 3-2, with Monte Hasie voting along with Waters and McKelvey to quash the motion.

Harriger then accused Waters of being "inconsistent" with his belief that the DEBT program was an educational one.

Harriger cited the board's refusal to implement the school breakfast program two months ago, ignoring nutritionalists

urging that children learned better with a good breakfast.

"I reserve the right to be inconsistent," Waters said.

"You should," Harriger bantered. "Every lawyer should." Harriger is also an attorney as well as Waters.

Irons, reflecting on the cuts to his budget, was visibly shaken, especially about the "carry-over funds."

"Don't worry Mr. Irons, it'll be tight but we'll make it," Waters

said.

"We'll have to watch every item..." Irons said, shaking his head.

"Why, Mr. Irons," Waters said a few minutes later, "you said you'd have to watch every item..."

there are equally as many scars left after a woman has an abortion. "Both socially and psychologically women feel guilty because people are condescending," said White. "Unintentionally our organization has fostered guilt feelings, but the inner guilt women feel is as much an outgrowth of her own feelings of doubt."

In addition to the mental scars abortion leaves, there can be

physical ones as well, explained White. The incidence of miscarriages increases with each subsequent abortion a woman has, noted White.

For White there are few choices in the case of an unwanted pregnancy—either you keep the baby or give it up for adoption. The best way to avoid the problem is to use birth control, he said. However he considers IUD's an abortive device since it works by preventing the implantation of

the impregnated ovum to the walls of the uterus.

As soon as the egg is impregnated life begins, according to White. It doesn't matter if the fetus is a few hours old, it's just a stage in a person's lifetime. Which means while the woman faced with an unwanted pregnancy has the legal right to an abortion, White contends the unborn child should have rights too—rights that he intends to protect.

Topics contained in the work include the history of the county; geographical place names; index to wills, 1845-1879; index to the 1830 census; marriage index, 1830-1848; divorcees, 1818-1821; and numerous family histories (often including the names and addresses of persons still researching these lines). Some of the families discussed at length are DARBY, MANNING, MCCULLOUGH, MOORE, SESSIONS, and WILLIAMS. This work is a valuable addition to Alabama reserach material.

The following material was taken from Stewart's Kentucky Herald, Lexington, Ky., Tuesday, July 14, 1975: (From the Knoxville Gazette, May 8, 1975)—On the night of the 21st of March, a party of Indians attempted to take the horses of Jason THOMPSON, within 5 miles of Nashville; but were prevented by the horses taking fright. The Indians then went to Thomas M'RORY's (a mile distant) and took his horses from his stable and several others from his field. On the 16th of April, John WIROW, a soldier on duty at the Ford of Cumberland, was killed by Indians, about 2 miles from the blockhouse.
